### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

**AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL DEPRESSION "ENTENG" (I.N. JANGMI) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 520 KM EAST NORTHEAST OF CALAYAN, CAGAYAN (21.0 °N, 126.1 °E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 65 KM/HR NEAR CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 80 KM/H. IT IS MOVING NORTH AT 30 KM/H. MEANWHILE, THE LOW PRESSURE AREA WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATE AT 235 KM WEST OF SUBIC IBA, ZAMBALES (14.8 °N, 118.1 °E). SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN LUZON, VISAYAS, AND MINDANAO.**

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.
