<b>DATE AND TIME OF ISSUANCE</b>	<b>01 August 2020, 3:00 PM</b>	
<b>VALIDITY PERIOD</b>	The next 24-hours unless there is an intervening advisory or an Initial Flood Bulletin to be issued.	
<b>FACTORS OF RAINFALL</b>	Southwest Monsoon.	
<b>CURRENT SITUATION OF RIVER WATER LEVEL</b>	As of 2:00 PM today, the Davao River along Waan Bridge and Davao Bridge (diversion) remains below 5.69 m alert level (yellow) and 4.27 m alert level (yellow) respectively	
<b>AVERAGE BASIN RAINFALL</b>	<b>DATE &amp; TIME</b>	1 August 2020, 2:00 PM
	<b>PAST 24-HR</b>	35.93 mm
	<b>FORECAST 24- HR</b>	Scattered light to moderate to at times heavy rains
<b>AREAS OF CONCERN (WATERWAYS LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED)</b>	Davao River and its tributaries particularly Suawan, Tamugan, and Panigan Rivers.	
<b>AWARENESS INFORMATION/ ADVISORY</b>	Generally, the stretch of Davao River coming from the Municipality of San Fernando in Bukidnon to its mouth in Davao City (Davao Gulf) remains below alert level; however, scattered light to moderate to at times heavy rains are likely to affect the Davao River Basin starting this afternoon.	
	Residents and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction And Management Councils (LDRRMCs) adjacent to and/or along the above-mentioned areas of concern are advised to take precautionary measures to mitigate sudden impacts of possible landslides and river floods within Davao River Basin, and to continue monitor the updates particularly Thunderstorm Advisory and Heavy Rainfall Warnings issued by Mindanao PAGASA Regional Services Division.	

You are directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio

stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
