I. Terminal Report on Oil Spill Incident due to Barge Explosion in Bo. Obrero, Ilollo City (Region VI)

A. Situation Overview

- 03 July 2020
 - At 2:45 PM, an explosion incident transpired at Zone 3, Bo. Obrero, Lapuz, Ilo-Ilo, City involving the power barge 102 Starboars Side owned by AC Energy Corp. The tank contains 200,000 liters bunker oil during the incident. The cause of the explosion is due to the welding works on the bull
 - o Immediately, BFP deployed fire trucks, personnel ambulance to the scene to address the fire. However, the explosion caused the barge to leak and the spillage was contained by the personnel of the power barge but a small amount of oil leaked from the cordon. The same were attended by the BFP in coordination with the PCG.
- 04 July 2020
 - Activated the Regional Incident Management Team for the Oil Spill Incident and setup the Incident Command Post at CGDWV Headquarters, Bo Obrero, Lapuz, Ilo-Ilo City.
 - Continuously conducted recovery of oil spoiled by means of oil skimmers and manual scooping at the site.
- 07 July 2020
 - Transferred the ICP for Oil Spill Incident Management to PCG Ilo-Ilo Station, Fort San Pedro, Ilo-Ilo City due to lockdown of PCG Western Visayas Headquarters in Bo Obrero, Ilo-Ilo City following the detection of COVID-19 cases among PCG personnel from Manila.
- 11 July 2020
 - Conducted an ocular assessment on Oil Spill affected areas.

- 15 July 2020
 - o Conducted coastal clean-up at the identified areas.
- 20 July 2020
 - Conducted an ocular assessment together with a shipping service provider contracted by the company and the respective barangay officials of the affected areas.
- 24 July 2020
 - Terminated the oil recovery phase after days of observation at the incident site.
 - Ensured that PCG-IMT in coordination with the spiller, concerned agencies and LGUs conducts coastal clean-up and rehabilitation.
- Recorded the following information:
 - a. Approximate Volume of Oil Spilt: 268,948.61 liters (as of 08 July 2020)
 - b. Total Volume of Bunker Collected: 261,687.464 liters (bunker oil mixed with water)
 - c. Contaminated Debris Collected: 1,969 kgs + 46 drums + 16,915.5 sacks + Absorbent boom 89 segments
 - d. Total Mangrove Area Affected: 88.8 ha (Barangays Tacay, Taminla, Umilig, Tanag, and Getulio of Buenavista, Guimaras and Zone III, Brgy. Bo. Obrero, Lapaz, Iloilo City) subject for rehabilitation.
- Recorded the total volume of bunker oil-water mixture recovered by means of skimmers and manual scooping at the site amounting to 261,687 liters (approx. 10-15% water).

B. Effects

AFFECTED POPULATION

 A total of 308 families / 1,091 individuals were evacuated in District 21 Hotel, Diversion 21 Hotel, and Marriot Hotel due to the strong odor from the oil spill. As of 18 July 2020, 12:00 PM, all evacuated families have already returned home.

- CGS Iloilo and Guimaras conducted coastal survey on the extent of oil spill.
- Continued conduct of skimming and scooping of oil spill.
- Recorded the following MARPOL Assets:
 - Additional 1 segment oil spill boon from Global Energy Power Corp and 10 segment oil spills from Petron Corporation were being laid out at vicinity waters of Loboc.
 - o Additional 4 skimmers, 1 came from Petron Corporation.
- CGS Iloilo and CGS Guimaras conducted seaborne patrol to assess the extent of oil spill.
- Reminded AC Power Phil. Inc. to provide PPE's for personnel who are helping in the operations.
- Deployed District Deployable Response Team (DRT), DF-347, Rubber Boats of MCS-3004 & 3006, Aluminum Boats 065 & 063 assited MEPU WV in laying 25 segments spill boom, spreading of absorbent pads and started collecting oil by means of scooping.
- Deployed personnel and assets in responding to the incident.

- Provided hygiene kits, masks, and medicines to the affected families.

- Conducted assessment in the evacuation center re minimum health standard
- Visited site in the affected area.

- Provided IEC materials like proper hand washing, respiratory etiquette, and proper way of putting on mask in the evacuation center.
- Provided a total of ₱ 72,153.80 worth of assorted medicines and supplies in the evacuation center.

- Distributed the following additional assistance: 128 food packs, 128 hygiene kits, and 128 comforters.
- Provided technical assistance on Camp Coordination and Camp Management in Bo. Obrero Elem. School which served as evacuation center for the affected individuals.
- Provided sleeping kits and hot meals to affected individuals in the evacuation center.

BFP VI

- Deployed personnel and fire trucks and other equipment to suppress the fire and to contain the spill.
- Conducted mapping of the affected area and maintained infection control protocols.
- Provided potable water at the evacuation center

DENR-EMB VI

- Conducted sampling activity in the oil spill site and site assessment in the affected areas, including the areas of Dumangas and Leganes, Iloilo.
- CENRO of Miagao, Iloilo conducted ocular inspection to affected mangrove area, around 1 hectare, and discussed rehabilitation plan.

BFAR VI

- Conducted evaluation of fish, seaweeds, shellfish and crabs from different areas affected by oil incident on 9 July 2020 wherein it found out negative from bunker oil.
- Issued the advisory informing the public that the fish caught from open waters and fishponds are safe for human consumption. however, shellfish, due to their nature as filter feeders, as well as seaweeds and crabs, from the affected areas, need further laboratory analysis to determine the level of contamination of bunker oil.
- Continuously conducted validation of oil spill incidents in reported areas that includes assessment of the critical habitat present (mangrooves, coral reefs and seagrass) and re-validation of the number of fisherfolk affected as well as the cost of damages.

PRC-Iloilo Chapter

- Installed a 5-ton water bladder at the TIIC to provide additional water supply to the evacuees.
- Provided 420 pcs katsa to the ICP donated by Angelina Bakeshop through PRC.
- Provided hot meals to the evacuees in Bo. Obrero Elem. School.

National Resilience Council

Coordinated with LGU Iloilo to possibly engage UP Marine Science and UP NIGS in managing the oil spill if needed.

CDRRMC ILOILO

- Distributed food packs for the affected residents of Brgy. Loboc and Barrio Obrero
- Deployed medical personnel composed of 2 nurses and 1 doctor at the Marriott Hotel through CHO.
- Conducted debriefing.
- Simultaneously distributed relief goods on Saturday for the affected families.
- Continuously monitored the health and other medical concerns of evacuees.
- Conducted mass testing to 67 families staying at Diversion 21 Hotel.
- Facilitated transportation of 70 families back to their respective residences in Brgy.
 - Mansaya, Lapuz
- Conducted psychosocial activities conducted for the children staying at District 21 Hotel
- Conducted Operations briefing re Oil Spill tackling the update on current situation, deployed resources, and daily operations per cluster.
- Conducted storytelling and art activities for children ages 3-7, and prayer sessions at Marriott Hotel and District 21.
- Facilitated the turnover of donations of AC Energy to Iloilo City Government.
- Transferred evacuees from nearly evacuation centers to District 21, Diversion 21, and Marriot Hotels.

- Reported that as of 10 July 2020, 9:30 PM, Bo. Obrero ES was cleared of evacuees.
- Facilitated the transfer of 18 families from Technical Institute of Iloilo City to Diversion 21 Hotel and 25 families from Technical Institute of Iloilo City to Marriot Hotel.
- Established deployed Medical Teams to hotels catering to evacuees.
- Established deployed police assistance desks in the hotels catering to evacuees.
- City Mayor together with AC Energy and concerned government offices conducted a meeting with Mansaya Incident Management Team, AC Energy, CHO, CSWO and CENRO to discuss possible support to the affected families due to the loss of livelihood and health impacts
- Brgy. Calumpang distributed food packs to the 56 fisher folks headed by the President of Fisher Association.
- Facilitated the shared drone shots taken.
- Facilitated the delivery of 5 truckloads of rice hulls from the Municipality of Oton and a truckload of coco husks from the composting plant of the City Government.
- The Local Government Unit of Iloilo City provided a total of ₱719,792.20 worth of Food and Non- Food assistance.
- Convened the Barangay Councils of Bo. Obrero, Mansaya and Loboc with AC Power Barge, the CDRRMO, UPV via zoom meeting re the local initiatives related to the conduct of coastal clean-up following the oil spill and the fabrication of the improvised spill booms to be installed in coastal communities among others.
- Conducted a quick orientation on the latest situation on the oil spill with the Barangay Councils of Bo. Obrero, Mansaya and Loboc with AC Power Barge

- including the Harbor Star (third party) and its effect in the coastal areas using the drone shots.
- The City Mayor led the crowdsourcing for the environment friendly materials needed for the fabrication of the improvised spill booms.
- Harbor Star deployed 45 people (cash for work basis) to lead the coastal clean-up in the Zone 3 area of Bo. Obrero and Mansaya.
- CSWDO, Cluster Lead for the Food and Non-food items and Camp Management and Camp Coordination Cluster met with the Punong Barangays of Loboc, Mansaya and Bo. Obrero re the needs for additional evacuation centers given the increasing number of families that expressed interest to evacuate.
- GSO and CEO facilitated the installation of water tank at the evacuation center.
- CDRRMO, ICPO CHO, and BFP conducted an ocular inspection to assess the extent of oil spill.
- CSWDO provided 139 sets of NFIs, consisting of 2 blankets, 2 mats, 1 mosquito net, and 1 water jug.
- CDRRMO coordinated with the neighboring LGUs such as Leganes, Oton and the Province of Guimaras re the presence of oil spill along respective coastal areas
- CDRRMO coordinated with partners re activities addressing oil sludge and improvised spill booms among others.
- Convened CENRO, BFP, PCG, BDRRMC Barrio Obrero, Petron and Shell to assess the current situation.
- Iloilo City Health Office provided medical needs of 43 patients who complained of difficulty of breathing, sore throat and nasal congestion.
- PSTMO facilitated the hauling and installation of tents at the evacuation center.

- Conducted a meeting and status update with the Barangay Incident Management Team.
- Engaged the representatives of AC Energy Corporation Power Barge 102
 relative to the facilitation of the operations on oil spill and in tapping the
 services of the affected individuals in making improvised spill booms.

- Conducted ocular site inspection in the Municipality of Joran and Buenavista
- Conducted training for workers for the affected barangays of Jordan and Buenavista on how to proper Clean-up Operation.
- Issued EO No. 57 s. 2020 re an order Organizing the Guimaras Incident Command System (GICS) Team for 03 July 2020 Ayala Corporation Oil Spill Tragedy.
- Conducted 1st Task Force Meeting for the Response Management of Oil Spill Tragedy.
- Conducted training for workers for the affected barangays of Jordan and Buenavista on how to do the Proper Clean-up Operation.
- Conducted Emergency Meeting for Plan of Action.

- On 05 July 2020, the team of PDRRMO and Coast Guard Station Guimaras assessed the identified coastal barangays (Sawang, Zaldivar, Magsaysay, Sto. Rosario, Rizal and Montpiller in Buenavista) and Rizal (Hoskyn and Morobuan in Jordan) relative to the extent of the oil spill, and likewise, conducted RDANA to the same barangays.
- PCG Guimaras personnel conducted lecture to the affected on how to use the spill boom to ensure that the oil spill will not spread further.
- Assessed the extent of damage along the coastal areas of Buenavista using a drone, of which, other barangays affected are – Dagsaan, Getulio, San Miguel, Navalas, Umilig and Morobuan in Jordan.
- Assisted the people in the affected barangays to make fabricated spill boom by using used clothing.
- Constant monitoring of the affected areas and directed the BDRRMOs to coordinate and update PDRRMO and Coast Guard Sub-Stations.

MDRRMC Leganes

- Installed improvised spill boom and bamboos to serve as floater with used clothes to 6 coastal barangays.
- Deployed 50 volunteers for immediate installation of improvised oil spill boom to 6-kilometer shoreline from 10 July 2020 SitRep.

MDRRMC Dumangas

Conducted ocular inspection at the Municipal waters and coastal areas to check the extent of oil spill.

BDRRMC Barrio Obrero, Lapuz, Iloilo City

Deployed local assets to assist in containing the oil spill.

AC POWER CORP. (Owner of the power barge)

- Provided accommodation (District 21, Diversion 21 and Marriott Hotel) as evacuation centers and other needs of the affected families and individuals.
- Conducted pre-planing workshop regarding the reintegration plan for the evacuees.
- Deployed staff at evacuation centers to address concern of the evacuees.
- Hired 35 civilians to augment PCG for the clean-up and 8 motorbancas for manual scooping.
- Provided psychological needs of the affected families inside evacuation centers.
- Locally hired workers by AC Energy Power Corp started the fabrication of the improvised spill booms using rice husks
- Hired a third-party contractor to facilitate the skimming and scooping operations to contain the oil spill.

POWER BARGE 102

- Recorded the following Assets:
 - o 5 skimmers deployed in the affected areas.
 - 1 additional skimmer from Phoenix to arrive soon;
 - 4 bales of absorbent pads, consisting of 100 pieces per bale, measuring to 6x20 per piece, and absorbent booms (1 pc. 20 meters; 1 pc. 10 meters; and 15 pcs. 2 meters) which were provided to PCG; and
 - 100 pieces of drums donated by Petron Corporation

 Deployed motorboats for the ongoing conduct of cleanup operations and manual scooping.

II. Terminal Report on Flooding and Landslide Incident in Koronadal City, South Cotabato Province (Region XII)

A. Situation Overview

• On 28 July 2020, at 3:00 PM, seven (7) barangays in Koronadal City were affected by flooding and landslide due to heavy rainfall.

B. Effects

AFFECTED POPULATION

- A total of 196 families from Barangays San Isidro, Zone III and Assumption were evacuated while 33 families from Brgy. GPS were affected by floodwaters.
- A total of 17 houses (14 totally and 3 partially) were damaged due to flooding and landslide.

III.Incident Report on the Effects of Heavy Rainfall due to LPA in Pontevedra, Negros Occidental (Region VI)

A. Situation Overview

- On 31 July 2020, at around 5:30 PM, the Municipality of Pontevedra were reported flooded due to the sudden rise of water caused by continuous heavy rainfall.
- The low-lying areas in the Municipality of Binalbagan such as Binalbagan Public Market, Bliss, portion of Brgy. San Teodoro, portion of Brgy. Progreso and Sitio Alimango, Brgy. San Vicente were also affected by heavy rainfall which started at around 2:00 PM and persisted for approximately six (6) hours.

B. EFFECTS

• A total of **139 families / 341 individuals** from nine (9) barangays of Pontevedra and Binalbagan were affected due to the flooding.
