Final Report on the Effects of Heavy Rainfall due to LPA in Pontevedra, Negros Occidental (Region VI)

A. Situation Overview

- On 31 July 2020, at around 5:30 PM, some areas in the Municipality of Pontevedra were reported flooded due to the sudden rise of water level caused by continuous heavy rainfall.
- The low-lying areas in the Municipality of Binalbagan such as Binalbagan Public Market, Bliss, portion of Brgy. San Teodoro, portion of Brgy. Progreso and Sitio Alimango, Brgy. San Vicente were also affected by moderate to heavy rainfall which started at around 2:00 PM which persisted for approximately six (6) hours.

B. EFFECTS

AFFECTED POPULATION

- A total of **139 families / 529 individuals** from seven (7) barangays were affected due to the flooding. **As of 4 August 2020, all evacuees have returned to their respective houses.**

C. ACTIONS TAKEN:

RDRRMC VI

- Coordinated with DMPD Negros Occidental, MDRRMO Pontevedra, MDRRMO Binalbagan regarding details on the incident.
- Ensured continuous monitoring of the AOR.

PDRRMC Negros Occidental

Disaster Management Program Division Negros Occidental (DMPD)

- Ensured close monitoring of weather updates.
- Disseminated information thru Email, SMS and Internet.
- Monitored Bantay Panahon for Negros Occidental.
- DMPD OPCEN disseminated the damage report to concerned agencies.
- Placed on standby and coordination with concerned LGUs and agencies.

MDRRMO Pontevedra

- Deployed Assessment and Response team to conduct evacuation and clearing operations
- Conducted Information dissemination to 20 Barangays.
- Activated EOC to continuously monitor the AOR.

MDRRMO Binalbagan

- Activated the LDRRMO functions and placed all teams according to Operation LISTO on standby for the possible severe effects of Southwest Monsoon.
- Ensured the provision of assistance in the evacuation areas by the night duty response team.
- Advised BDRRMOs that no fisherfolks should go fishing to avoid possible damages and casualties.

BDRRMO San Vicente

Provided assistance during evacuation.
