"ENTENG" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE MOVING NORTHWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

Track and intensity outlook:

- On the forecast track, ENTENG will track generally northward throughout the forecast period and will remain far from the Philippine landmass. It is forecast to move near or over the southern islands of the Ryukyu archipelago and exit the PAR tomorrow afternoon.
- Additional intensification remains likely over the next two days. ENTENG is forecast to reach tropical storm category by tomorrow morning.

Hazards affecting land:

- No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect.
- Today, TD ENTENG will bring scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Bicol Region. The Southwest Monsoon will bring monsoon rains over Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, Romblon, and Northern Palawan (including Calamian, Cuyo, and Kalayaan Islands) and occasional rains over Pangasinan, Metro Manila, Western Visayas, and the rest of Central Luzon, MIMAROPA, and CALABARZON.
- Tomorrow, the Southwests Monsoon may bring monsoon rains over Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, Bulacan, Metro Manila, Cavite, Mindoro Provinces, Calamian Islands, and Kalayaan Islands, and occasional rains over Western Visayas and the rest of Luzon.
- Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the seaboard of Luzon and Visayas due to moderate to rough seas.

Other weather disturbance being monitored:

- At 10:00 AM Today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 280 km West of Subic, Zambales (14.6°N, 117.7°E). This LPA is less likely to develop into a Tropical Depression in the next 48 hrs.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today , the center of Tropical Depression “ENTENG” was estimated based on all available data at 420 km East Northeast of Casiguran, Aurora or 445 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.4°N, 125.9°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.
Movement:	Moving Northward at 25 km/h

ACTIONS TAKEN:

NDRRM Operations Center cascaded **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 2** for **Tropical Depression “ENTENG”** to all OCD Regional Offices concerned through SMS and email and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let’s untiringly aim for zero casualty.
