"ENTENG" INTENSIFIES INTO A TROPICAL STORM.

Track and intensity outlook:

- ENTENG will track generally northward throughout the forecast period and will • remain far from the Philippine landmass. It is forecast to move near or over the southern islands of the Ryukyu archipelago and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility this afternoon.
- Slight intensification remains likely but ENTENG is forecast to remain as a tropical storm throughout the forecast period.

Hazards affecting land:

- No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect. However, gusty conditions • associated with the Southwest Monsoon may be experienced (especially in coastal and mountainous areas) in the next 24 hours over Pangasinan, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and Western Visayas.
- Today, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by ENTENG and the Low • Pressure Area (LPA) west of Zambales will bring monsoon rains over Pangasinan, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, and MIMAROPA, and Antique, and occasional rains over Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, and the rest of Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Central Luzon, and Visayas.
- Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall • especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- Gale Warning is in effect over the seaboards of Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, western coast of Batangas, western coast of Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Island, and western coast of Palawan including Calamian Islands (2.8 to 4.0 m); Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Isabela (2.8 to 3.4 m).
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while • venturing out over the seaboards of Visayas and the rest of Luzon due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m).

Other weather disturbance being monitored:

 At 4:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 215 km West Southwest of Iba, Zambales or 235 km West of Subic Bay (14.7°N,118.1°E). This disturbance remains less likely to develop into a tropical depression in the next 24 hours.

Location of eye/center:	At 4:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "ENTENG" was estimated based on all available data at 545 km East Northeast of Calayan, Cagayan or 445 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (21.5 °N, 126.1 °E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h.
Movement:	Moving Northward at 30 km/h.
Forecast Positions:	 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 1,105 km North Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR)(29.5°N, 126.5°E)

ACTIONS TAKEN:

NDRRM Operations Center cascaded **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 4A** for **Tropical Storm "ENTENG"** to all OCD Regional Offices concerned through SMS and email and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
