### **TROPICAL STORM "ENTENG" IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).**

#### **Track and intensity outlook:**

- **ENTENG exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility at 1:00 PM today.** It will track generally northward **towards East China Sea and will turn slightly northeastward heading towards South Korea.**
- Slight intensification remains likely but ENTENG is forecast to remain as a tropical storm throughout the forecast period.

#### **Hazards affecting land:**

- Gusty conditions associated with the Southwest Monsoon may be experienced (especially in coastal and mountainous areas) in the next 24 hours over Pangasinan, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and Western Visayas.
- Today, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by ENTENG and the Low Pressure Area (LPA) west of **Dagupan City will bring monsoon rains over Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Tarlac, Cavite, Batangas,** and MIMAROPA and occasional rains over Metro Manila, Aklan, Antique, and the rest of Luzon.
- Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

#### **Hazards affecting coastal waters:**

- Gale warning is in effect over the seaboard of Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, western coast of Batangas, western coast of Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Island, and western coast of Palawan including Calamian Islands (2.8

to **4.5** m); Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Isabela (2.8 to **4.0** m). Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas.

- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the seaboards of Visayas and the rest of Luzon due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m).

**Other weather disturbance being monitored:**

- At **4:00 PM** today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at **250 km West of Dagupan City, Pangasinan (16.3°N,118.0°E)**. This disturbance may develop into a tropical depression within the next 24 hours.

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At <b>4:00 PM</b> today, the center of Tropical Storm “ENTENG” was estimated based on all available data at <b>730 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.8 °N, 126.1 °E)</b> .
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of <b>75 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>90 km/h</b> .
<b>Movement:</b>	Moving Northward at <b>40 km/h</b> .
<b>Forecast Positions:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 24 Hour (Tomorrow <b>afternoon</b>): <b>1,710 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (34.9°N, 127.9°E)</b></li> </ul>
