- No tsunami threat exists based on available data.
- On 19 August 2020, 5:50 AM, a strong aftershock with a magnitude of Ms 5.2 was recorded at 11.92°N, 124.04°E - 012 km S 27° E of Cataingan, Masbate.

#### II. EFFECTS

#### A. AFFECTED POPULATION

A total of **416 families / 1,957 persons** were affected by this earthquake in the Province of Masbate. Of which, **70 families / 310 persons** are currently staying in the evacuation center.

#### D. STATUS OF LIFELINES

### **Roads and Bridges**

A total of six (6) road sections and seven (7) bridges in the Provinces of Masbate and Camarines Sur were reported damaged due to the incident. Warning signs were installed to inform motorists. As of 18 August 2020, all roads and bridges were declared passable.

#### III. DISASTER RESPONSE

#### A. NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

## National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Immediately disseminated Earthquake Information Nos. 1 and 2 to concerned OCD Regional Offices and other stakeholders through facsimile, Short Messaging System (SMS), website, and twitter account for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs. Moreover, advised the Regions to undertake precautionary measures and to monitor the situation for possible effects of the earthquake particularly in areas with reported intensities.
- b. Prepared the Emergency Alert and Warning Message (EAWM) for dissemination of Telecommunications Companies (TELCOs) to the affected areas.
- c. Disseminated Tsunami Information to concerned stakeholders through SMS.
- d. Continuous coordination with PHIVOLCS regarding the earthquake.

## 2. DOST-Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS)

- Disseminated Earthquake Information No. 1 and 2 and Tsunami Information No. 1.
- b. Continuous monitoring of significant earthquake activity/development.

### 3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- a. The DSWD Central Office, Field Offices, and National Resource Operations Center have prepositioned stockpiles and standby funds amounting to \$\mathbb{P}\$1,503,322,272.24 with breakdown as follows:
  - <u>Standby Funds</u>: A total of ₱663,107,684.85 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱619,916,550.34 is the available Quick Response Fund (QRF) in the CO.
  - Stockpiles: A total of 292,941 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱144,009,440.44, other food items amounting to ₱219,165,266.40, and non-food items (NFIs) amounting to ₱447,209,118.30 are made available.
- b. The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) raised its alert status to BLUE.
- c. DSWD-DRMB Disaster Operations and Support Division (DOSD) continuously facilitates the downloading of funds to DSWD-Field Offices.
- d. DSWD-DRMB Preparedness and Response Division (PRD) in coordination with other DRMB divisions and concerned offices, is continuously monitoring and updating the status of the standby funds.

- e. DSWD-DRMB DOSD in coordination with other DRMB division and concerned offices, is continuously facilitating the replenishment of the standby funds.
- f. DSWD-DRMB is continuously coordinating with DSWD-FO V for significant disaster response updates.
- g. Placed all QRT members and emergency equipment on standby and ready for deployment.

## 4. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)

- a. Continuous monitoring of national roads and bridges.
- b. Provided warning signages and ongoing post-earthquake assessment on national roads and bridges.

#### 5. Southern Luzon Command, AFP

- a. Humanitarian Assistance Disaster Relief (HADR) and medical teams proceeded to Masbate City for possible Search and Rescue operations in the Municipalities of Cataingan and Palanas, Masbate.
- b. Provided one (1) aircraft at Masbate Airport for the conduct of Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDANA).

## 6. Department of Education (DepEd)

- a. Furnished the Preparedness Measures for Earthquake to the regions and divisions through the social media platform.
- b. Coordinated with DRRM focal persons of affected regions and division for field situations and reports on infrastructure and non-infrastructure damages through submission of Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADaR).
- c. Continuously sent advisories and situation reports to the affected regions and divisions, and DepEd ExeCom.

## B. Regional / Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)

RDRRMCs CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and X are continuously monitoring their respective Areas of Responsibility (AOR). Further, said RDRRMCs are in continuous coordination with their member agencies to ensure appropriate response actions, and widest dissemination of Earthquake Information through all means of communication.

#### 1. RDRRMC CALABARZON

#### a. OCD CALABARZON

Continuously coordinated with PDRRMO Quezon and MDRRMOs to monitor their respective AOR and for any updates relative to the incident.

#### b. DPWH CALABARZON

Conducted assessment of national roads and bridges.

#### c. PDRRMOs

- Continuous coordination with MDRRMOs to monitor their respective AOR.
- Continuous conduct monitoring and assessment within AOR.

## MDRRMOs Gumaca, Lopez, and Mulanay, Quezon

- Conducted assessment and validation on the possible effects of the earthquake.
- Continuously monitoring of AOR.

#### 2. RDRRMC V

#### a. OCD V

- Coordinated with PHIVOLCS and Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (PDRRMOs).
- Disseminated information relative to the earthquake through social media.
- Conducted aerial assessment at the 3<sup>rd</sup> District of Masbate.
- Provided 550 shelter repair kits, 400 hygiene kits from ASEAN, and 4,000 PPEs to Masbate.
- Provided media information through interviews

#### b. DSWD FO V

- Provided initial report of the incident.
- DSWD V prepositioned stockpiles and standby funds as of 19 August 2020 detailed as follows:
  - o A total of 21,155 food packs amounting to ₱8,633,534.04 and raw materials which include 82,000kgs NFA rice, 36,028 tins of Gold Cup Sardines, 36,028 tins of corned beef, and 115,741 sachet coffee amounting to ₱3,751,568.03 are available at DSWD Warehouse.
  - Non-food items containing 51 sets of tents, 5,494 boxes of sleeping kits, 1,089 boxes of family kits, 3,673 kitchen kits, 34,941 pcs of Malong, 921 rolls laminated sacks, 1,514 (10 meters) and 21,330 pcs blanket amounting to ₱24,926,132.90
  - o Standby funds amounting to ₱3,001,050.00 to augment the response operation.

- Conducted assessment to identify the needs/requirements of the affected areas for possible augmentation.
- Resource Operation Section ensured the availability of FFPs and NFIs as the need arises.
- DRMD V continuously monitor the updates and information.
- Activated PAT and MAT members in Masbate and instructed to coordinate with the P/MDRRMOs and C/MSWDOs relative to the 6.5 Magnitude Earthquake reports and updates.
- Released 953 family food packs amounting to ₱519,978.36 as augmentation support to the Municipality of Cataingan, Palanas and Pio V. Corpuz.
- Transported additional 1,000 family food packs amounting to ₱412,980.00 to Masbate in coordination with the Philippine Navy.
- Extended financial assistance through AICS to 31 families with totally damaged houses (₱5,000 / family) in the Municipalities of Cataingan, Pio V. Corpuz, and Palanas amounting to a total of ₱155,000.00.
- Transported 400 family food packs, 10 family tents, and 100 rolls laminated sacks worth ₱705,968.36\_as augmentation to the affected LGUs,
- Released 150 family food packs worth ₱70,500.00 as augmentation support to the affected families in the Municipality of Pio V. Corpuz.

#### c. DOH RO V

Coordinated with PDO and PHO Masbate relative to the incident.

- Placed Emergency Response Team on standby for possible deployment.
- Posted advisories through DOH CHD Bicol Official Social Media Page.
- Prepositioned a total of ₱50,000.00 worth of medicines to PDO and PHO Masbate, and 100 pcs of hygiene kits to PDO Masbate.
- PDO Masbate closely coordinated with M/CHO, PDRRMO Masbate, and PHO HEMS for any update regarding the incident and conducted Rapid Health Assessment in the municipality of Cataingan.
- PHO Masbate deployed medical team to the Municipality of Cataingan.
- RHU Cataingan assisted in the relocation of LSIs quarantined at CMC and Cataingan Astrodome.
- RHU Cataingan assisted and provided first aid to patients and also helped the MDRRMO in the preparation of damage report relative to the quarantine facility.
- RHU Cataingan conducted facility assessment in 36 barangays of the municipality.

#### d. DA RFO V

- · Conducted initial inspection of agricultural facility in Masbate City.
- Mobilized team for field validation of agricultural infrastructures and commodities affected by the earthquake.

#### e. DEPED V

Conducted initial assessment of damages to schools.

### f. BFP RO V, PNP RO V, and PNP RO V

- · Conducted SRR at the affected municipalities.
- Continuously monitoring any incident within the AOR.

## g. TOG5-PAF and 2IB Philippine Army

Conducted aerial assessment at the 3rd District of Masbate.

#### h. PNP PRO V

#### **Masbate PPO**

- Activated their Emergency Operation Center
- Conducted Search, Rescue and Retrieval operations particularly in the Municipality of Cataingan and other affected areas in the 3<sup>rd</sup> District of Masbate
- · Initially reported casualties on the said incident.

#### i. PDRRMC Masbate

- Conducted aerial assessment at the 3<sup>rd</sup> District of Masbate.
- Provided initial report on the effects of the earthquake.
- Local DRRM Offices attended to the medical needs of the people in the affected areas.

#### j. PDRRMC Sorsogon

- Provided report on the effects of earthquake in Sorsogon including reports from MDRRMOs of Bulan and Pilar.
- Coordinated with PHIVOLCS regarding the earthquake
- Disseminated information to all LDRRMOs about the 6.6 Magnitude Earthquake, the effects per AOR and advised to submit damage assessment reports.

#### 3. RDRRMC VI

- **a.** Issued RDRRMC Memorandum No. 167, s. 2020 regarding Assessment of Structural Integrity of Infrastructures in AOR due to the Magnitude 6.6 Earthquake in Masbate.
- **b.** Coordinated with the affected LGUs to monitor the effects of the earthquake within its respective AOR.

#### 4. RDRRMC VII

Coordinated with PHIVOLCS Region VII and Local DRRMOs in Talibon, Bohol and San Francisco, Cebu.

Coordinated with concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) and continuously monitors the incident.

## b. PDRRMCs Leyte, Biliran, Samar, Northern Samar, and MDRRMO Mapanas

- Ongoing ocular inspection within the AOR and coordinated with LGUs.
- Closely monitoring the incident within the AOR.

# c. CDRRMCs Catbalogan, Calbayog, MDRRMC Paranas, Daram, Sta. Rita, San Jorge, Marabut, and Almagro, Samar

Conducted ocular inspections in the affected areas.

#### d. MDRRMC San Jose de Buan, Samar

- Conducted ocular inspection in the affected areas.
- Ongoing assessment in far-flung areas.

#### 6. RDRRMC X

- Coordinated with LGU Gingoog City regarding the incident and verified reports with PHIVOLCS.
- b. Closely monitoring the incident within the AOR.

#### C. Cost of Assistance

A total of ₱519,978.36 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD to the affected families.
