SUBJECT : Weather Advisory No. **02** for the Low Pressure Area (LPA) and **Southwest Monsoon**

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

At 10:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro (12.3 °N, 121.2 °E). It is moving generally westward towards Mindoro Strait and may pass near or over the Calamian Islands in the next 12 hours.

This weather disturbance is forecast to develop into Tropical Depression "LEON" in the next 24 hours. Due to its proximity to land, Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal #1 may still be raised over portions of MIMAROPA due to strong to near-gale force winds once this weather disturbance becomes a tropical depression.

Rainfall Forecast:

Today through tomorrow morning

Light to moderate with at times heavy rains due to this weather disturbance and the Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA (including Kalayaan Islands), Western Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Basilan, Sulu, and Tawi-Tawi.

Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. PAGASA Regional Services Divisions will issue local thunderstorm/rainfall advisories and heavy rainfall warnings as appropriate.

Coastal Waters Forecast:

Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m) will prevail over the northern, eastern, and southern seaboard of Luzon, the western seaboard of Occidental Mindoro and Palawan, and the seaboard of Visayas and Mindanao.

Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised to take precaution when venturing out to sea over these areas.

The public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take appropriate measures and watch for the next update to be incorporated in the Public Weather Forecast at 4:00 PM today and 4:00 AM tomorrow.

The next advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
