TYPHOON "JULIAN" CONTINUES TO INTENSIFY WHILE REMAINING ALMOST STATIONARY OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

Track and intensity outlook:

- **"JULIAN" is forecast to gradually accelerate generally northward today and turn north-northwestward or northwestward tomorrow (31 August). On the forecast track, the tropical cyclone will remain far from the landmass.** It is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Monday evening or Tuesday early morning.
- **"JULIAN" is forecast to continuously intensify within the next 24 to 48 hours and may reach peak intensity on Monday or Tuesday.**

Hazards affecting land:

- The raising of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is unlikely throughout the forecast period.
- **Today, light to moderate with at times heavy rains associated with the Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Pangasinan, Zambales, and Bataan. The outer rainbands of "JULIAN" may bring light to moderate rains over Bicol Region, with at times heavy rains over Catanduanes.**

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- **Moderate to rough seas (2.1 to 3.4 m) will be experienced over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the eastern seaboards of Central Luzon, Southern Luzon, and Visayas due to the Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "JULIAN".** Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "JULIAN" was located based on all available data at 760 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.3 °N, 128.9 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 170 km/h.
Movement:	Almost Stationary

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
