"JULIAN" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE MOVING NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

Track and intensity outlook:

- "JULIAN" is forecast to gradually accelerate generally northward **tonight until** tomorrow (30 August) before turning northwestward on Monday (31 August). On the forecast track, the tropical cyclone will remain over the Philippine Sea throughout the forecast period, far from the landmass. It is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Monday evening.
- It is forecast to reach typhoon category **tomorrow morning** and may reach peak intensity by Monday.

Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

- The raising of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is unlikely throughout the forecast period. Furthermore, "JULIAN" is less likely to directly cause high impact weather over the country.
- The Southwest Monsoon is forecast to bring moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.4 m) over the seaboard of Northern Luzon, the eastern seaboard of Central **and Southern Luzon, and the seaboard of Northern and Eastern Samar**. Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today , the center of Severe Tropical Storm "JULIAN" was estimated based on all available data at 740 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (17.0 °N, 129.0 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 110 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 135 km/h .
Movement:	Moving Northwestward at 10 km/h
