### THE LOW PRESSURE AREA EAST OF NORTHERN AURORA HAS DEVELOPED INTO TROPICAL DEPRESSION "JULIAN"

#### Track and intensity outlook:

- "JULIAN" is forecast to move westward to west-northwestward today through tomorrow (29 August) morning, then turn northward tomorrow evening. On the forecast track, "JULIAN" will remain over the Philippine Sea throughout the forecast period, far from the landmass. It is likely to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Monday (31 August) evening.
- The Low Pressure Area developed into Tropical Depression "JULIAN" at 8:00 AM today. Continuous intensification is likely throughout the forecast period. "JULIAN" is expected to reach tropical storm category within 12 hours and severe tropical storm category within 24 to 36 hours. It is forecast to reach typhoon category by Sunday morning (30 August).

#### Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

- The raising of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is unlikely throughout the forecast period.
- "JULIAN" is less likely to directly cause high impact weather over the country.
- The Southwest Monsoon is forecast to bring rough seas (2.5 to 3.5 m) over the seaboard of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte. Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out to sea.

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "JULIAN" was estimated based on all available data at 940 km East of Casiguran, Aurora or 975 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.1 °N, 130.9 °E)
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.
<b>Movement:</b>	Moving Westward at 15 km/h.

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next update to be incorporated in the 4:00 PM Public Weather Forecast and in the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at 11:00 PM today.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
