TYPHOON "JULIAN" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES AND IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).

Track and intensity outlook:

- "JULIAN" exited the PAR at 8:15 PM today. It will track generally north-northwestward towards East China Sea and will turn north-northeastward or northeastward heading towards Korean Peninsula.
- "JULIAN" may reach its peak intensity tomorrow.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- Gale Warning remains in effect for the seaboard of Batanes and Babuyan Islands. Sea travel is risky due to rough to very rough seas over these areas (2.8 to 4.5 m).
- Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.4 m) will be experienced over the seaboard of the rest of Luzon and Visayas due to the Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "JULIAN". Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea.

Other disturbance being monitored:

- At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression outside PAR was estimated based on all available data at 2,475 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (22.5°N, 145.8°E) with maximum sustained of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h. It is moving South Southwestward at 20 km/h. This disturbance is less likely to enter the PAR within the next 5 days.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "JULIAN" was located based on all available data at 750 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.4°N, 126.9°E) .
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Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 165 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 205 km/h .
Movement	Moving North Northwestward at 15 km/h
Forecast Positions	24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 970 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (28.4°N, 125.9°E)
NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNAL	

With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final warning for this weather disturbance.
