**TYPHOON "KRISTINE" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE MOVING NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.****Track and intensity outlook:**

- It is forecast to move **generally northwestward** while inside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). It will remain far from the Philippine landmass and may exit the PAR tomorrow (05 September) evening. After leaving the PAR, "KRISTINE" will head towards southern Japan and the Korean Peninsula.
- It is forecast to reach peak intensity of around 205-215 km/h **tomorrow**.

**Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:**

- "KRISTINE" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country throughout the forecast period.
- This tropical cyclone may bring rough to very rough seas over the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon beginning tomorrow morning. Sea travel is risky under such sea conditions.

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At <b>10:00 PM today</b> , the eye of Typhoon "KRISTINE" was located based on all available data at <b>1,205 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (22.9°N, 133.3°E)</b> .
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of <b>195 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>240 km/h</b> .
<b>Movement</b>	Moving <b>Northwestward at 15 km/h</b> .
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 1,065 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (25.0°N, 131.1°E)</b></li><li><b>48 Hour (Sunday evening): 1,285 km Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (29.8°N, 129.5°E)</b></li></ul>
