TYPHOON "KRISTINE" SLIGHTLY WEAKENS AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE NORTHWESTWARD.

Track and intensity outlook:

- "KRISTINE" is forecast to continue moving northwestward until it exits the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tonight. It is then expected to turn north-northwestward beginning tonight and pass close to Northern Amami Islands and Tokara Islands in the Ryukyu Archipelago (Japan) between tomorrow noon and evening. Afterwards, the typhoon will head towards the sea off the west coast of Kyushu (Japan) and the Korean Peninsula.

Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

- "KRISTINE" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country throughout the forecast period.
- **Gale Warning is in effect for the seaboard of Batanes and Cagayan (including Babuyan Islands) due to rough to very rough seas (2.8 to 4.5 m). Sea travel is risky over these areas.**
- **Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m) will be experienced over the eastern seaboard of Luzon (except for areas under Gale Warning) and Visayas. Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precaution while venturing out to sea.**

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 AM today , the eye of Typhoon "KRISTINE" was located based on all available data at 1,080 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (24.1°N, 131.7°E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 230 km/h .
Movement	Moving Northwestward at 15 km/h .


