TYPHOON "KRISTINE" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AND IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).

Track and intensity outlook:

- **"KRISTINE" exited the PAR at 6:00 PM today.** It is forecast to move north-northwestward beginning tonight and pass close to Amami Islands and Tokara Islands in the Ryukyu Archipelago (Japan) between tomorrow noon and evening. Afterwards, the typhoon will head towards the sea off the west coast of Kyushu (Japan) and the Korean Peninsula.
- This typhoon is forecast to maintain its current intensity within the next 24 hours before gradually weakening while moving closer towards mainland Japan.

Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

- "KRISTINE" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country throughout the forecast period.
- Gale Warning is in effect for the seaboard of Batanes and Cagayan (including Babuyan Islands) due to rough to very rough seas (2.8 to 4.5 m). Sea travel is risky over these areas.
- Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m) will be experienced over the eastern seaboard of Luzon (except for areas under Gale Warning) and Visayas. Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precaution while venturing out to sea.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today , the eye of Typhoon "KRISTINE" was located based on all available data at 1,080 km Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.6 °N, 130.9 °E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 230 km/h .
Movement	Moving North Northwestward at 15 km/h .
Forecast Positions	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 1,330 km North Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (30.4°N, 129.3°E)

NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNAL

With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final warning for this weather disturbance.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
