**TYPHOON "HAISHEN" HAS ENTERED THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY AND WAS NAMED "KRISTINE"**

### Track and intensity outlook:

- "HAISHEN" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) at 9:00 AM today. It is forecast to move west-northwestward and northwestward while inside the PAR. It will remain far from the Philippine landmass and may exit the PAR between tomorrow (05 September) evening and Sunday (06 September) early morning. After leaving the PAR, "HAISHEN" will head towards southern Japan and the Korean Peninsula.
- This typhoon is undergoing rapid intensification at the moment. It is forecast to reach peak intensity of around 205-215 km/h on Sunday.

### Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

- "HAISHEN" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country throughout the forecast period.
- This tropical cyclone may bring rough to very rough seas over the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon beginning tonight or tomorrow morning. Sea travel is risky under such sea conditions.

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At <b>10:00 AM</b> today, the eye of <b>Typhoon "KRISTINE"</b> was located based on all available data at <b>1,340 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (21.8°N, 134.8°E)</b> .
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of <b>185 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>230 km/h</b> .
<b>Movement</b>	Moving <b>Northwestward at 15 km/h</b> .
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>24 Hour</b> (Tomorrow morning): <b>1,080 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (23.5°N, 131.9°E)</b></li><li><b>48 Hour</b> (Sunday morning): <b>1,110 km Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (27.0°N, 130.2°E)</b></li><li><b>72 Hour</b> (Monday morning): <b>1,525 km North Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (32.8°N, 128.6°E)</b></li></ul>


