AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "LEON" (I.N. NOUL) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 365 KM NORTH NORTHEAST OF KALAYAAN, PALAWAN (14.2 °N, 114.8°E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 85 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 105 KM/HR. IT IS MOVING WEST NORTHWESTWARD AT 15KM/H. SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING PALAWAN, VISAYAS, AND MINDANAO.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
