#### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

**AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "LEON" (I.N. NOUL) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 365 KM NORTH NORTHEAST OF KALAYAAN, PALAWAN (14.2 °N, 114.8°E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 85 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 105 KM/HR. IT IS MOVING WEST NORTHWESTWARD AT 15KM/H. SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING PALAWAN, VISAYAS, AND MINDANAO.**
