**I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

**15 January 2021**

Tail-end of Frontal System (Shear line) affecting the eastern sections of Southern Luzon and Visayas. Northeast Monsoon affecting the rest of Luzon.

Hazards affecting land areas: In the next 24 hours, the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) will bring light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Bicol Region. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rainshowers during thunderstorms are also likely over Caraga and Northern Mindanao due to Easterlies.

**14 January 2021**

Tail-end of Frontal System (Shear line) affecting the eastern sections of Southern Luzon and Visayas. Northeast Monsoon affecting the rest of Luzon.

Hazards affecting land areas: In the next 24 hours, the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) will bring moderate to heavy rains over Bicol Region. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains are also likely over the southern portion of Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, Northern Samar, Samar, Eastern Samar, Capiz, and Aklan.

**13 January 2021**

The Low Pressure Area South of Zamboanga City has dissipated at 8:00 AM today. However, the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) is still affecting the Eastern Visayas.

Hazards affecting land areas: In the next 24 hours, the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) will bring moderate to heavy rains over Samar Provinces while, light to moderate with at times heavy rains over the rest of Eastern Visayas, Bicol Region, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

**12 January 2021**

At 10:00 AM, 12 January 2021, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 170 km Southeast of General Santos City (5.1°N, 126.3°E). This weather disturbance is less likely to develop into a Tropical Depression in the next 48 hours. Hazards

affecting land areas: In the next 24 hours, the combined effects of the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) and the LPA will bring moderate to heavy rains over Eastern Visayas, Central Visayas, and CARAGA Region. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains are also likely over Bicol Region and the rest of Visayas and Mindanao.

### **11 January 2021**

The combined effects of the Tail-End of A Frontal System (Shear Line) and the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will bring moderate to heavy rains over Eastern Visayas, Camotes Islands (Cebu), Dinagat Islands, Surigao Del Norte, Surigao Del Sur, Davao Oriental, and Davao de Oro. Light to Moderate with at times heavy rains are also likely over Sorsogon, Masbate Including Ticao Island, Bukidnon, Misamis Oriental, Camiguin, Balabac Islands (Palawan), Pangutaran Islands (Sulu), Mapun And Turtle Islands (Tawi-Tawi), and the rest of Visayas, Caraga, and Davao Region.

### **10 January 2021**

Tail-end of a Frontal System (Shear line) affecting eastern section of Visayas. Northeast Monsoon affecting Luzon.

### **09 January 2021**

The Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear line) will bring moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Ticao Island, and Northern Samar. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Camarines Norte, Masbate including Burias Island, Cagayancillo Islands, Antique, Aklan, Guimaras, Capiz, Iloilo, the northern and central portions of Negros Occidental, the northern portion of Cebu including Bantayan and Camotes Islands, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, and Leyte.

### **08 January 2021**

Tail-end of a Frontal System affecting eastern section of Southern Luzon. Northeast Monsoon affecting the rest of Luzon

## **II. EFFECTS**

### **A. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)**

A total of **94 incidents** were monitored in Regions V, VI, and VIII.

## B. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

A total of **54,855 families / 279,542 persons** in **136 barangays** in Regions V, VI, and VIII were affected due to TEFS. Of which, **7,296 families / 31,992 persons** are currently staying in **19** evacuation centers while **1,070 families / 3,034 persons** opted to stay with relatives.

## C. NATIONAL DRRM COUNCIL (NDRRMC)

- b. Deployed one (1) response team to monitor water levels in various overflows and rivers within the AOR and ERTs for evacuation.
- c. Prepositioned of resources and assets at the command center.
- d. Established hot kitchen and provided hygiene kits for displaced families.
- e. Close coordination with CHO, CSWD, PNP, BFP, CEO, and Punong Barangays.
- f. Mobilized resources to support various barangays in the conduct of pre-emptive evacuation.
- g. Deployed inspection team for damage assessment.

#### **CDRRMC Escalante City**

- a. Conducted rescue operation at the flooded areas together with BFP and PNP.
- b. Evacuated affected individuals to nearest evacuation center.
- c. Disseminated current weather situation to the public and monitoring of water levels especially in flood-prone areas.

- a. Continuous monitoring of the weather situation and dissemination of weather updates thru social media to concerned offices and the general public.

- a. Placed response unit on standby and monitoring the AOR.

- c. Advised BDRRMCs to monitor respective AOR for possible evacuation.
- d. Conducted rescue operation together with BFP and Barangay Rescue Unit (BRU) at affected areas.

- d. Coordinated with PDRRMO Northern Samar regarding flooding on the Municipality of Allen.
- e. Coordinated with DPWH VIII on the provision of Wing Vans for the delivery of FFPs to Eastern Samar.
- f. Provided FOL for the DPWH VIII Wing Vans for the delivery of FFPs to Eastern Samar.
- g. Coordinated with DOH VIII and DSWD VIII for the transport of medical supply to PDOH Eastern Samar.
- h. Coordinated with TOG8 PAF regarding availability of air assets for the conduct of SAR Operation for the missing fisherman of Silago, Southern Leyte.

- a. Prepositioned 5,500 family food packs amounting to ₱2,871,736.00.

- a. Placed Disaster Response Units (DRU) on standby and ready for deployment.
- b. Tasked line units to closely coordinate with the different P/C/MCDRRMCs and monitor the effect of TEFS for the possible conduct of HADR operations.
- c. DRO team of 543ECB proceeded to Brgy. Cabacungan, Allen, Northern Samar to conduct clearing operation.

#### **Philippine Coast Guard Eastern Visayas**

- a. Advised CGDEV Stations and Sub-Stations to ensure strict implementation of HPCG Memorandum Circular Number 02-13 (Guidelines on the Movement of Vessels during Heavy Weather and HPCG Memorandum Circular 03-02 (Guidelines on Vessels/Motorboats in the Absence of Weather Bulletin in the locality).
- b. Disseminated the Weather updates to EV-Stations and Sub-Station.
- c. Directed all EV-Stations and Sub-Stations to activate their respective Quick Response Team (QRT) and on standby for possible emergency response.
- d. Continued monitoring of the bad weather condition and Stations/Sub-Stations Situations.

#### **PDRRMC Leyte**

- a. Continuous monitoring on rainfall and water levels in the different stations installed.
- b. Activated interoperability communication and response networks.

- c. Disseminated advisories to frontline service departments in Provincial Government of Leyte.
- d. Prepositioned all goods in PSWD Office, water assets, and other equipment for any untoward incidents.
- e. Placed 24/7 SAR Team on standby for possible deployment.
- f. Monitoring of weather advisories, reports, or any related issuances and disseminate PDRRM Council members, LGUs, other stakeholders, and the public.

#### **C/MDRRMCs of Leyte**

- a. Continuous monitoring of weather updates in Operations Center within AOR.
- b. Placed response team on alert and standby for possible deployment.

#### **PDRRMC Samar**

- a. Coordinates with LGUs and concerned offices/agencies for preparation of SRR Teams for immediate response if needed, activation of Evacuation Centers and CCCM Teams in preparation for pre-emptive/forced evacuation on low lying areas and hazard prone areas specially LGUs with Storm Surge Warning.
- b. LGUs conducted clearing operations.
- c. Continuous updating and monitoring of Weather Updates from PAGASA and dissemination of gathered information to LGUs
- d. Placed heavy equipment on standby alert ready for dispatch.

#### **PDRRMC Eastern Samar**

- a. Continuous dissemination of weather updates to the LDRRMCs.
- b. Conducted 24/7 monitoring on current weather condition.

#### **MDRRMC Oras**

- a. Advised all barangays identified as High to Very-High Susceptibility Ratings to Flooding and Landslide to conduct pre-emptive evacuation especially those vulnerable groups.
- b. Advised residents of Barangay Saurong for pre-emptive evacuation.
- c. Activated all BDRRMCs and constantly monitoring their situation especially those flood-prone areas.
- d. EOC conducted constant monitoring of situation in the AOR especially at identified vulnerable areas together with PNP, BFP, AFP, Coastguard, and Oras Emergency Response Team.
- e. Recorded reports submitted by BDRRMCs.

#### **MDRRMC Guiuan**

- a. Cancelled all maritime activities due to issued Gale Warning.
- b. Advised BDRRMCs near the low-lying areas to conduct pre-emptive evacuation if sudden rise of flood waters occurs.
- c. Issued travel advisories to sea travelers to island barangays will be prohibited.
- d. Advised fishermen not to venture out to sea and land travelers outside Guiuan to take precautionary measures regarding possible landslides in their AORs.

#### **PDRRMC Northern Samar**

- a. Coordinated with Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils and monitoring of flooded areas, water level at Brgy. Polangi Bridge, Catarman River, and Macagtas Dam.



- b. Placed emergency response cluster on standby alert for any untoward incidents.
- c. Conducted 24/7 monitoring on current weather condition.
- d. Conducted RDANA on the affected areas.
- e. Deployed rescue teams on the affected municipalities brought by the LPA.
- f. Continuous dissemination of weather updates to the LDRRMCs.

#### **MDRRMC Catarman**

- a. Placed emergency response cluster on standby alert for any untoward incidents.
- b. Continuous monitoring and info dissemination of latest weather updates and rainfall advisory thru social media, two-way radio and text blasts.
- c. Monitoring of flooded areas and water level at Brgy. Polangi Bridge, Catarman River and Macagtas Dam.
- d. Continuous coordination with BDRRMCs.

#### **MDRRMC Capul**
