### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **17 February 2021**

At 10:00 AM, Tropical Depression (TD) southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "AURING" with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h.

At 10:00 PM, TD "AURING" continued to maintain strength while moving westward. It was estimated at 755 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h moving Westward at 10 km/h.

#### **18 February 2021**

"AURING" intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) while moving slowly northwestward over the Philippine sea. At 10:00 AM, the center of TS "AURING" was estimated at 685 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur with maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h moving Northwestward slowly.

At 11:00 PM, TS "AURING" continued to intensify while moving slowly westward. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was hoisted in Davao Oriental and the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, Compostela, New Bataan).

#### **19 February 2021**

At 10:00 AM, "AURING" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) as it moves slowly over the Philippine Sea East of Mindanao. STS "AURING" was estimated based on all available data at 535 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur, with maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h.



TCWS No. 1 was raised Davao Oriental, the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, New Bataan, Compostela, and Monkayo), the eastern portion of Agusan del Sur (Sibagat, Bayugan City, Prosperidad, Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Santa Josefa, and Trento), and Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, New Bataan, Compostela, and Monkayo), the eastern portion of Agusan del Sur (Sibagat, Bayugan City, Prosperidad, Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Santa Josefa, and Trento), and Surigao del Sur.

At 2:00 PM, **"AURING" weakened into a Tropical Storm and moved westwards.** TCWS No. 1 was raised in Southern Leyte and the southeastern portion of Eastern Samar, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, Davao City, Camiguin, the western portion of Misamis Oriental (Balingasag, Balingoan, Binuangan, Claveria, Gingoog City, Jasaan, Kinoguitan, Lagonglong, Magsaysay, Medina, Salay, Sugbongcogon, Tagoloan, Talisayan, Villanueva), and the western portion of Bukidnon (Cabanglasan, Impasug-ong, Lantapan, Malaybalay City, Malitbog, Manolo Fortich, Maramag, Quezon, San Fernando, Sumilao, Valencia City).

## **20 February 2021**

At 4:00 AM, **TS "AURING" slightly weakens over the Philippine Sea.** It has maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 90 km/h.

At 10:00 AM, the center of "AURING" was estimated at 595 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur. TCWS No. 1 is raised over Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Cebu, Negros Oriental, Bohol, and Siquijor, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, Davao City, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Bukidnon, and Lanao del Sur.

## **II. EFFECTS**

### **A. Status of Lifelines**

#### **1. Flights**

A total of **32 domestic Philippine Airlines' flights were cancelled** on 20-22 February 2021.

### III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

#### A. Pre-emptive Evacuation

A total of **1,141 families or 4,847 individuals pre-emptively evacuated** in the Provinces of Surigao del Norte and Surigao del Sur, and Butuan City (CARAGA).

#### B. NATIONAL DRRM COUNCIL (NDRRMC)

##### 1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- Maintained RED ALERT status since COVID-19 response operations.
- Continuous monitoring and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories, and General Flood Advisories to all concerned RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, NDRRMC website, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- Conducted PDRA re TD "AURING" on 17 February 2021, 1:30 PM and convened on 19 February 2021, 2:00 PM for Weather Updates.

##### 2. National Response Cluster

Issued NDRRMC Memorandum dated 19 February 2021 advising select clusters (Food and Non-Food Items, Camp Coordination and Camp Management, Internally Displaced Persons Protection, Health, Logistics, Emergency Telecommunication, and Search, Rescue and Retrieval) to prepare and place their resources on standby for possible augmentation to areas to be affected.

##### 3. Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical Services Administration (PAGASA)

Continuous weather monitoring and provision of weather updates.

##### 4. Department of Environment and Natural Resources - Mines and Geosciences Bureau (DENR-MGB)

- Activated 24/7 Geohazards Operations Center in Central and Regional Offices on 17 February 2021.
- Disseminated Geohazard Advisory for TS "AURING" and List of Cities/Municipalities Susceptible to Flood as of 19 February 2021, 2:00 PM.

##### 5. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱1,204,692,327.12**.

##### Standby Funds

A total of **₱496,446,273.45 standby funds** in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱459,860,852.15** is the available **Quick Response Fund (QRF)** in the CO.



## Stockpiles

A total of **301,112** family food packs (FFPs) amounting to **₱137,272,645.95**, other food items amounting to **₱200,840,879.45** and non-food items (FNIs) amounting to **₱406,860,848.54** are available.

- Coordinated with the concerned field offices for significant disaster response updates.
- Placed all QRT members and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment.
- Participated in the Online Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment Meeting on Tropical Depression (TD) "AURING" on 18 February 2021 with other response cluster member agencies.

## 6. Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- DILG-CODIX attended PDRA re TD "AURING" on 17 February 2021, 1:30 PM.
- Activated Emergency Operations Center and Disaster Online Reporting and Monitoring System (DORMs) for TS "AURING".
- Directed all concerned regions to undertake the following:
  - Advise concerned LGUs to establish critical preparedness actions based on the Operation LISTO Protocols, and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2020-125 - LISTO SA TAG-ULAN AT COVID-19: Preparedness Measures of LGUs for the Rainy Season CY 2020, and prioritize the prepositioning of supplies, equipment and personnel for response
  - Remind LGUs to assess the structural integrity of the structures that will be used for evacuation and other related purposes, and ensure that they can withstand the strong winds brought about by TS "AURING";
  - Continue to monitor all PAGASA weather advisories and typhoon bulletins
  - Assist the RDRRMC in coordinating with LGUs and ensure that existing LGU Covid-19 testing requirements will not hamper and/or delay the entry, passage and operations of all government and the private sector disaster response personnel



- Activate concerned Barangay DRRMCs for early warning measures and vigilant monitoring of areas with settlements at the base of sliding slopes or ridges with manifestations of rockslide/landslide, tension cracks, and areas identified as very high/critical landslide zones
- Vigilant monitoring and reporting of weather disturbances and other incidents
- Continuously inform and advise all communities thru, but not limited to, the local television and radio stations, of situation updates and preparedness actions of the localities
- Intensify the use of social media platforms for public information
- Monitor with vigilance the level of river waters and settlements in low-lying areas such as ricelands or near riverbanks, which have experienced recent and repeated flooding; Vigilant monitoring for possible riverbank erosion and shift of river flow direction
- Monitor, and prepare the necessary critical preparedness actions for the possible overflow of dams and sudden release of water that may affect the communities
- Implement Preemptive Evacuation in areas with high to very high susceptibility to storm surge, floods and landslides, especially residents whose dwellings are susceptible to damage due to strong winds; Ensure that physical distancing is always observed in the evacuation centers
- Ensure the availability of sanitation stations in the evacuation centers
- Ensure that clean, running water and hand soaps are always available
- Ensure that doctors and other emergency response personnel are prepositioned in clusters of evacuation centers
- Ensure that evacuation centers are properly and regularly disinfected;
- Ensure that communication lines are working properly
- Restrict or ban tourist activities such as, but not limited to, mountaineering, hiking, surfing, diving, etc., within their areas of jurisdiction during this period
- Warn small-scale miners to stay in safer grounds and stop all mining activities
- Enforce a no-fishing policy and ensure that sea travel and small-scale fishing activities are closely monitored and prohibited

#### **7. Department of Agriculture (DA)**

- a. Activated the DRRM Operations Centers.
- b. Closely monitoring the weather updates and regular dissemination of advisories to the LGUs and other RDRRM related offices
- c. Conducted inventory and prepositioning of rice, corn, vegetable seeds, drugs, and biologics for livestock and poultry in safe storage facilities.
- d. Prepositioned rice, corn and vegetable seeds, drugs and biologics for livestock and poultry.
- e. Mobilized Agricultural Program Coordinating Offices (APCOs) for the dissemination of advisory to farmers and fisherfolks.
- f. Closely monitoring of standing crops that could be affected by TS "AURING".

#### **8. Department of Health (DOH)**

- a. Raised Code Alert.
- b. Sent weather alert memorandum to all Centers for Health Development and BARMM Ministry of Health and DOH-retained hospitals on the following:



- Weather disturbance
  - Activation of Code Alert and 24/7 Operations Center
  - Health Emergency Response Teams are on stand-by and ready for deployment
- c. A total of **₱19,508,368.70** worth of drugs, medicines, medical supplies, health kits, including PPEs and other Covid-19 supplies were prepositioned by different CHDs. Moreover, a total of **₱27,880,352.74** worth of commodities are available at the DOH Central Office warehouse.

### **OCD IX**

- b. Advised LDRRMOs to disseminate weather advisories to local residents particularly those who are residing along the coasts, river banks, floodplains, and mountainous areas to immediately effect pre-emptive evacuation.
- c. Required concerned agencies to submit reports to RDRRMC IX through OCD on any related incidents.
- d. Monitored preparations and actions being undertaken by LDRRMOs and required them to submit reports to RDRRMC IX Operations Center.

## **8. RDRRMC X**

### **OCD X**

- a. Conducted the PDRA on 18 February 2021 with RDRRMC Vice Chairpersons and LDRRMCs.
- b. Conducted regular dissemination of weather advisories.

### **DILG X**

- a. Placed Regional Quick Response Teams on standby consisting of 18 Teams as well as Provincial QRTs.
- b. Prepositioned logistics materials, NFIs, two (2) wingvan trucks, and ETC equipment on standby alert.

### **TOG X – PAF**

Prepositioned air assets and two (2) search and rescue groups.

- a. DSWD DROMIC in close coordination with the SWAD Team and respective LGUs for reports and updates of the weather disturbance in AORs.
- b. Issued memorandum for the Activation of Quick Response Team (QRT) for possible deployment and augmentation to Disaster Response.

Placed on heightened alert and placed on standby for possible augmentation

**PDRRMCs**

- a. Placed on heightened alert status to ensure the readiness of response teams in case of any untoward incident within the AOR.
  - b. Monitored municipalities and barangays along Abra River Basin and other flood-prone areas.
  - c. Maintained RED alert status to continuously monitor the COVID-19 and weather disturbance.
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
