### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **17 February 2021**

At 10:00 AM, Tropical Depression (TD) southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "AURING" with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h.

At 10:00 PM, TD "AURING" continued to maintain strength while moving westward. It was estimated at 755 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h moving Westward at 10 km/h.

#### **18 February 2021**

"AURING" intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) while moving slowly northwestward over the Philippine sea. At 10:00 AM, the center of TS "AURING" was estimated at 685 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur with maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h moving Northwestward slowly.

At 11:00 PM, TS "AURING" continued to intensify while moving slowly westward. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was hoisted in Davao Oriental and the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, Compostela, New Bataan).

#### **19 February 2021**

At 10:00 AM, "AURING" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) as it moves slowly over the Philippine Sea East of Mindanao. STS "AURING" was estimated based on all available data at 535 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur, with maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h.

TCWS No. 1 was raised Davao Oriental, the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, New Bataan, Compostela, and Monkayo), the eastern portion of



Agusan del Sur (Sibagat, Bayugan City, Prosperidad, Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Santa Josefa, and Trento), and Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, the eastern portion of Davao de Oro (Pantukan, Maragusan, New Bataan, Compostela, and Monkayo), the eastern portion of Agusan del Sur (Sibagat, Bayugan City, Prosperidad, Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Santa Josefa, and Trento), and Surigao del Sur.

At 2:00 PM, **"AURING" weakened into a Tropical Storm and moved westwards.** TCWS No. 1 was raised in Southern Leyte and the southeastern portion of Eastern Samar, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, Davao City, Camiguin, the western portion of Misamis Oriental (Balingasag, Balingoan, Binuangan, Claveria, Gingoog City, Jasaan, Kinoguitan, Lagonglong, Magsaysay, Medina, Salay, Sugbongcogon, Tagoloan, Talisayan, Villanueva), and the western portion of Bukidnon (Cabanglasan, Impasug-ong, Lantapan, Malaybalay City, Malitbog, Manolo Fortich, Maramag, Quezon, San Fernando, Sumilao, Valencia City).

## **20 February 2021**

At 4:00 AM, **TS "AURING" slightly weakens over the Philippine Sea.** It has maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 90 km/h.

At 10:00 AM, the center of "AURING" was estimated at 595 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur. TCWS No. 1 is raised over Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Cebu, Negros Oriental, Bohol, and Siquijor, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, Davao City, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Bukidnon, and Lanao del Sur.

## **21 February 2021**

At 4:00 AM, TS "AURING" was estimated at 395 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur. **TCWS No. 2** was raised over the southern portion of Eastern Samar, Dinagat Islands and the northern portion of Surigao del Norte including Siargao and Bucas Grande Islands. **TCWS No. 1** was raised over Sorsogon, mainland Masbate, and Ticao Island, Northern Samar, the rest of Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Cebu, Bohol, Siquijor, Negros Oriental, the northern and central portions of Negros Occidental, the eastern portion of Iloilo, and the eastern portion of Capiz, rest of Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, Davao City, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental, and Bukidnon.

"AURING" slightly decelerates while moving towards the west-northwest. At 7:00 AM, the center of TS "AURING" was estimated at 370 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur.

## **II. EFFECTS**

### **A. Affected Population**

A total of **1,410 families or 5,475 persons** were affected in 40 barangays in Regions XI and CARAGA. Of which, **1,297 families or 5,054 persons** are currently taking temporary shelter inside 37 evacuation centers and **71 families or 261 persons** sought shelter with their relatives and/or friends.

### III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE (TAB A)

#### 1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- Maintained RED ALERT status since COVID-19 response operations.
- Continuous monitoring and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories, and General Flood Advisories to all concerned RDRRMCs/OC드로 through SMS, NDRRM website, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- Conducted PDRA re TD "AURING" on 17 February 2021, 1:30 PM and convened on 19 February 2021, 2:00 PM for Weather Updates.

#### 2. National Response Cluster

Issued NDRRM Memorandum dated 19 February 2021 advising select clusters (Food and Non-Food Items, Camp Coordination and Camp Management, Internally Displaced Persons Protection, Health, Logistics, Emergency Telecommunication, and Search, Rescue and Retrieval) to prepare and place their resources on standby for possible augmentation to areas to be affected.

#### A. Pre-emptive Evacuation (TAB B)

A total of **3,162 families or 10,911 individuals** were pre-emptively evacuated in Regions VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA.

#### B. Cost of Assistance

A total of **₱179,000.00** worth of assistance was provided by the LGUs to the affected families in the Municipality of Corte, Surigao del Sur (CARAGA).

**5. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)**

- a. The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱1,258,822,330.15**.

**Standby Funds**

A total of **₱502,446,273.45** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱459,860,852.15** is the available **Quick Response Fund (QRF)** in the CO.

## Stockpiles

- Coordinated with the concerned field offices for significant disaster response updates.
- Placed all QRT members and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment.
- Participated in the Online Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment Meeting on Tropical Depression (TD) "AURING" on 18 February 2021 with other response cluster member agencies.

## 6. Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- DILG-CODIX attended PDRA re TD "AURING" on 17 February 2021, 1:30 PM.
- Activated Emergency Operations Center and Disaster Online Reporting and Monitoring System (DORMs) for TS "AURING".
- Directed all concerned regions to undertake the following:
  - Advise concerned LGUs to establish critical preparedness actions based on the Operation LISTO Protocols, and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2020-125 - LISTO SA TAG-ULAN AT COVID-19: Preparedness Measures of LGUs for the Rainy Season CY 2020, and prioritize the prepositioning of supplies, equipment and personnel for response
  - Remind LGUs to assess the structural integrity of the structures that will be used for evacuation and other related purposes, and ensure

that they can withstand the strong winds brought about by TS “AURING”;

- Continue to monitor all PAGASA weather advisories and typhoon bulletins
- Assist the RDRRMC in coordinating with LGUs and ensure that existing LGU Covid-19 testing requirements will not hamper and/or delay the entry, passage and operations of all government and the private sector disaster response personnel
- Activate concerned Barangay DRRMCs for early warning measures and vigilant monitoring of areas with settlements at the base of sliding slopes or ridges with manifestations of rockslide/landslide, tension cracks, and areas identified as very high/critical landslide zones
- Vigilant monitoring and reporting of weather disturbances and other incidents
- Continuously inform and advise all communities thru, but not limited to, the local television and radio stations, of situation updates and preparedness actions of the localities
- Intensify the use of social media platforms for public information
- Monitor with vigilance the level of river waters and settlements in low-lying areas such as ricelands or near riverbanks, which have experienced recent and repeated flooding; Vigilant monitoring for possible riverbank erosion and shift of river flow direction
- Monitor, and prepare the necessary critical preparedness actions for the possible overflow of dams and sudden release of water that may affect the communities
- Implement Preemptive Evacuation in areas with high to very high susceptibility to storm surge, floods and landslides, especially residents whose dwellings are susceptible to damage due to strong winds; Ensure that physical distancing is always observed in the evacuation centers
- Ensure the availability of sanitation stations in the evacuation centers
- Ensure that clean, running water and hand soaps are always available
- Ensure that doctors and other emergency response personnel are prepositioned in clusters of evacuation centers
- Ensure that evacuation centers are properly and regularly disinfected;
- Ensure that communication lines are working properly
- Restrict or ban tourist activities such as, but not limited to, mountaineering, hiking, surfing, diving, etc., within their areas of jurisdiction during this period



- Warn small-scale miners to stay in safer grounds and stop all mining activities
- Enforce a no-fishing policy and ensure that sea travel and small-scale fishing activities are closely monitored and prohibited

## 7. Department of Agriculture (DA)

- a. Activated the DRRM Operations Centers.
- b. Closely monitoring the weather updates and regular dissemination of advisories to the LGUs and other RDRRM related offices
- c. Conducted inventory and prepositioning of rice, corn, vegetable seeds, drugs, and biologics for livestock and poultry in safe storage facilities.
- d. Prepositioned rice, corn and vegetable seeds, drugs and biologics for livestock and poultry.
- e. Mobilized Agricultural Program Coordinating Offices (APCOs) for the dissemination of advisory to farmers and fisherfolks.
- f. Closely monitoring of standing crops that could be affected by TS "AURING".

## 8. Department of Health (DOH)

- a. Raised Code Alert.
- b. Sent weather alert memorandum to all Centers for Health Development and BARMM Ministry of Health and DOH-retained hospitals on the following:
  - Weather disturbance
  - Activation of Code Alert and 24/7 Operations Center
  - Health Emergency Response Teams are on stand-by and ready for deployment
- c. A total of **₱19,508,368.70** worth of drugs, medicines, medical supplies, health kits, including PPEs and other Covid-19 supplies were prepositioned by different CHDs. Moreover, a total of **₱27,880,352.74** worth of commodities are available at the DOH Central Office warehouse.

## B. REGIONAL DRRM COUNCILS (RDRRMC)

RDRRMCs III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, CARAGA, and CAR are continuously monitoring its areas of responsibility. Further, said RDRRMCs are in coordination with their respective member agencies to ensure the widest dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, and General Flood Advisories through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites.

### 1. RDRRMC III

#### Office of Civil Defense (OCD) III
