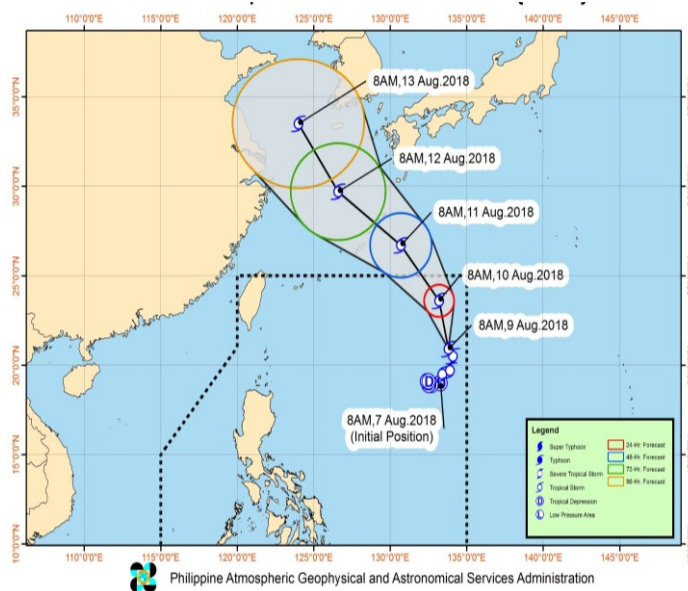

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Tropical Cyclone Analysis

Tropical Storm “KARDING” was the 11th tropical cyclone (TC) that entered or developed within the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) in 2018 and the 1st TC for the month of August. The Regional Specialized Meteorological Center also named the system “YAGI”, a Japanese word for “goat” or “Capricorn”.

Originating from an area of low pressure over the Philippine Sea, KARDING was first noted as a tropical depression at 8:00 AM (07 August 2018). Despite marginally favorable atmospheric conditions, the system intensified into a tropical storm at 2:00 PM the following day. Its peak intensity within the PAR was reached by 2:00 AM (10 August 2018), with maximum winds of 75 km/h and 90 km/h gusts.



During its tropical depression stage, KARDING remained nearly stationary over the Philippine Sea. However, it began moving generally northwestward as soon as it reached Tropical Storm category, although erratic behavior in its movement was still observed in the afternoon on both 9 and 10 August. By 9:00 AM of 11 August, the center of Tropical Storm KARDING has left the PAR.

The passage of KARDING resulted in the enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon, which brought scattered to widespread monsoon rains over Central Luzon and the western sections of Northern and Southern Luzon. Due to the nature of its track, KARDING continued to enhance the monsoon rains over the country even after leaving the PAR. These heavy rains resulted in severe flooding in many areas in Region 1, CALABARZON and NCR.

II. EFFECTS

A. Incident Monitored (TAB A)

A total of **54 incidents** were monitored in Regions I, II, CALABARZON, and CAR.

B. Affected Population (TAB B)

A total of **434,573 families / 1,756,891 persons** were affected in **1,334 barangays** in Regions I, III, CALABARZON, CAR and NCR. Of which, a total of **59,983 families / 257,591 persons** were being served inside and outside evacuation centers.

D. Status of Lifelines

Roads and Bridges (TAB C)

A total of **111 road sections and one (1) bridge** were affected in Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, and CAR. As of **23 August 2018**, a total of **95 road sections** were reported passable.

Power Supply (TAB D)

A total of **75 areas** in Regions I, III, CALABARZON, and CAR experienced power interruption since 11 August 2018. As of **23 August 2018**, power was restored in **sixty-two (62) areas**.

E. Damaged Houses (TAB E)

A total of **3,379 houses** were damaged in Regions I, III, CALABARZON, and CAR (**515 – totally / 2,864 – partially**).

F. Suspension of Classes (TAB F)

To date, a total of **435 cities/municipalities** in Regions I, III, CALABARZON, CAR and NCR suspended classes in their respective areas. **A total of 20 cities/municipalities suspended classes on 17 August 2018.**

G. Flooded Areas (TAB G)

A total of **816 areas** were reported flooded in Region I, III, CALABARZON and NCR since 11 August 2018. Of which, **523 were already subsided.**

H. Cost of Damage (TAB H)

A total of **₱996,001,275.65 worth of damages** to infrastructure (**₱952,290,000.00**) and agriculture (**₱43,711,275.65**) were incurred in Regions I, II and CAR.

I. Cost of Assistance (TAB I)

A total of **₱125,297,461.95 worth of assistance** from OCD, DSWD and LGUs has been provided to Regions I, III, CAR, CALABARZON and NCR.

J. Declaration of State of Calamity (TAB J)

The Local Sanggunian of one (1) Province and six (6) Municipalities declared their respective areas under state of calamity in Regions III, CALABARZON, and CAR.

2. DOST-Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

5. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- a. Continuous monitoring of reports from affected DILG Regional Offices and LGUs of preparedness actions based on Operation LISTO protocols.
- b. Recommended to NDRRMC the activation of the Response Cluster, especially the Food and Non-Food Cluster considering the volume of evacuees, the LGUs relief supplies are expected to become insufficient, as well as the Search, Rescue and Retrieval (SRR), and Law and Order Clusters, for augmentation support.
