I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Tail-End of a Cold Front (TECF) affected some parts of Luzon and Visayas on 10-29 January 2018.

13 January 2018

TECF affected eastern section of Southern Luzon and Visayas. Bicol Region, Eastern and Central Visayas, and Quezon experienced cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms.

14 January 2018

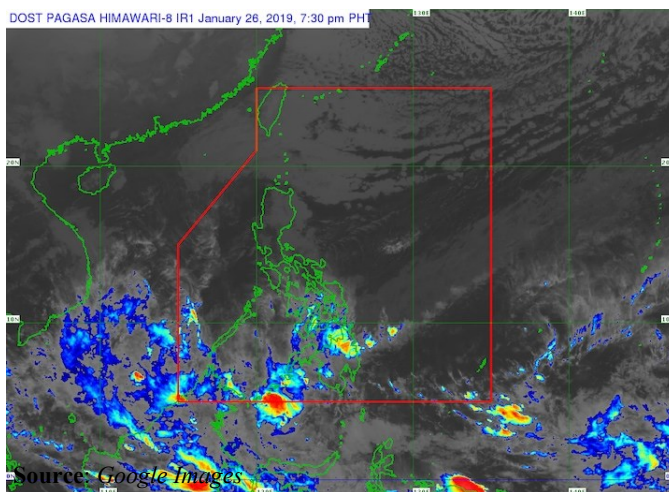
TECF affected Eastern Visayas and Eastern Mindanao. Sorsogon, Masbate, Palawan, Visayas and Mindanao experienced cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms.

15 January 2018

TECF affected Eastern Visayas and Eastern Mindanao. Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Palawan, Visayas, and Mindanao experienced cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms.

16 January 2018

Three weather systems affected the country: a) The Low Pressure Area (LPA) estimated at 300 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (7.8N, 129.0E); b) The Northeast Monsoon which affected Northern and Central Luzon; and c) The Tail-End of a Cold Front which affected Eastern Section of Southern Luzon



17 January 2018

Three weather systems affected the country: a) Trough of the Low-Pressure Area affected Visayas, CARAGA, and the rest of Mindanao; b) Northeast Monsoon which affected Northern Luzon; and c) Tail-End of a Cold Front affecting Eastern Section of Central and Southern Luzon.

27 January 2018

The Tail-end of a Cold Front brought moderate to occasional heavy rains and isolated thunderstorm over CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Samar Provinces, and Aurora.

28 January 2018

The Tail-End of a Cold Front brought moderate to occasional heavy rains and isolated thunderstorms over Surigao Del Norte, Dinagat Province, Bicol Region, and Visayas.

29 January 2018

The effect of a Tail-End of a Cold-Front has weakened. Improved weather conditions were experienced over Visayas, Bicol Region, and Caraga.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

1. A total of **39,211 families / 179,552 Persons** in **277** barangays were affected in Regions V, VI, VIII, X, and XI.
2. Of which, a total of **6,271 families / 26,420 persons** were served inside **82 Evacuation Centers (ECs)** and **27 families / 109 persons** outside ECs.

C. Casualties (TAB C)

- A total of **36 individuals** were reported missing in Regions V, VII, and VIII. Of which, **32 persons were already found alive** and **4 were still missing**.
- A total of **4 individuals were reported dead** in Region XI.

D. Flooded Areas (TAB D)

A total of **73 areas were flooded** in Regions V, VI, VIII, and CARAGA. All of which have already subsided.

E. Suspension of Classes and Work (TAB E)

- Classes were suspended in Regions V, VII, VIII, XI, and CARAGA due to the weather disturbances.
- All government offices in Tacloban City suspended its operations on 15 January which immediately resumed the following day, 16 January 2018.

F. Status of Lifelines

1. Status of Roads and Bridges

Roads in Regions V and VIII were rendered impassable due to flooding and landslides. Immediate clearing operations were conducted:

Damaged Structure

The airport operations of Daniel Z. Romualdez (DZR) Airport were suspended due to an ongoing repair of the damaged runway which started on 17 January 2018 at around 5:35 PM. The damage was caused by continuous heavy rains experienced in the past few days.

III. ACTIONS TAKEN

A. National DRRMC

- a. Coordinated with affected Regional DRRM Councils regarding the submission of preparedness actions in relation to the Tail-end of a Cold Front (TECF).

dissemination to its respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).

- a. Provided weather updates/advisories including localized weather updates.
- b. Conducted continuous weather monitoring.
