

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Chronology and Tropical Cyclone Track

01 January 2018

At 2:00 PM the LPA which was monitored at 545 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "AGATON".

At 3:00 PM, TD "AGATON" moved at 200 km East Northeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur, with maximum winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 60 km/h. Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon.

02 January 2018

At 2:00 AM, TD "AGATON" made landfall over Dinagat Island Province - Siargao Island area.

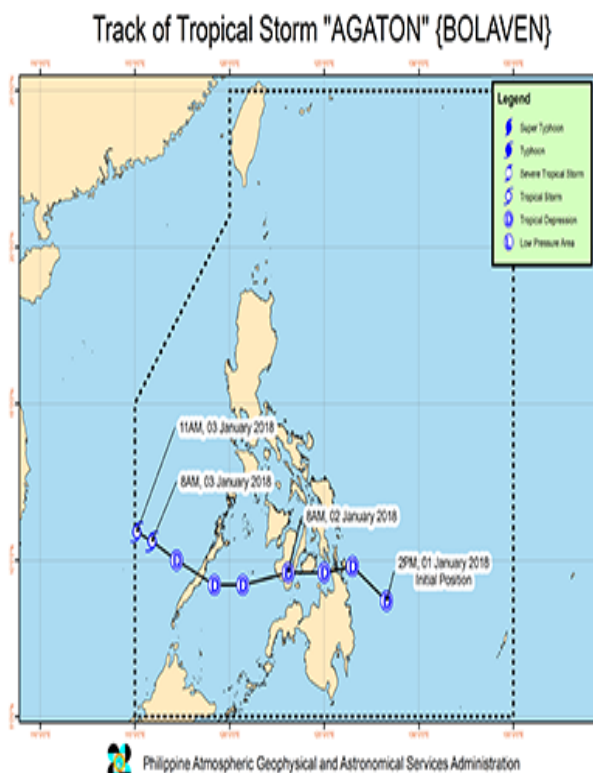
TD "AGATON" continued to move towards Palawan with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph moving West at 28 kph.

At 11:00 PM, TD "AGATON" made landfall in the vicinity of Aborlan, Palawan.

03 January 2018

At 4:00 AM, TD "AGATON" slowed down slightly and headed towards the West Philippine Sea. All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal were lifted.

At 2:00 PM, TD "AGATON" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.



B. Tropical Cyclone Analysis

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east southeast of Surigao City had developed into a Tropical Depression inside PAR and was named "AGATON" on 01 January 2019, 5:00 PM. AGATON intensified into Tropical Storm (TS) after crossing Palawan on 03 January 2018 when it was about to exit the PAR. It was given an international name "BOLAVEN" meaning a Plateau in the southern part of LAO. The name was contributed by Lao PDR.

TS "AGATON" made landfall six times on 02 January 2018 namely: Socorro, Surigao Del Norte (1:00 AM); Claver, Surigao Del Norte (1:15 AM); Jagna, Bohol (4:00 AM); Santander, Cebu (5:00 AM); Bais City, Negros Oriental (7:30 AM) and Aborlan, Palawan (10:45 PM). AGATON intensified into Tropical Storm (TS) after crossing Palawan on 03 January 2018 when it was about to exit the PAR.

Bicol Region particularly Juban, Sorsogon was affected by TS "AGATON" as shown in the reported rainfall from PRSD stations. Juban, Sorsogon Station recorded the highest maximum rainfall of 354.9 mm/hr.

Period of occurrence of TS "AGATON" inside the PAR is from 01 January (5:00 PM) - 03 January (2:00 PM), 2018. The estimated highest maximum sustained winds were 110 kph near the center, gustiness of up to 140 kph, and central pressure of 977 hPa. 1-Weather Advisory, 13-International Warning for Shipping (IWS) and 18-Severe Weather Bulletin (SWB) - (Alert and Warning) were issued; The lowest observed barometric MSLP of 996 hPa was observed in Maasin, Leyte station on 2 January. The highest maximum wind was 65 kph near the center and gustiness of 80 kph. 2-Weather Advisory, 9-International Warning for Shipping (IWS), and 14-Severe Weather Bulletin (SWB) - (Alert and Warning) were issued.

Highest Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal issued was TCWS #1 in LUZON - Palawan and Cuyo Island; VISAYAS - Southern Leyte, Bohol, Southern Cebu, Cebu, Siquijor, Guimaras, Southern Negros Oriental and Southern Negros Occidental, Southern Antique and Southern Iloilo; and MINDANAO - Surigao del Norte, Siargao Island, Surigao del Sur, Dinagat Island, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao del Norte, Compostela Valley, Misamis Oriental, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Camiguin, Bukidnon, Northern Bukidnon, and Zamboanga del Norte.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

1. A total of **18,547 families / 83,908 persons** were affected in **267 barangays** in Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA due to TD "AGATON".
2. Of which, 9,557 families / 41,183 persons were served inside 247 evacuation centers and **1,384 families / 5,906 persons** outside evacuation centers.
