I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day are celebrated by Filipinos every 01 November and 02 November of the year to pay respect to beloved dead relatives and friends.

On this annual commemoration of "UNDAS", millions are expected to travel to their respective provinces and expected to flock cemeteries around the country in view of the observance of UNDAS 2019.

II. WEATHER SITUATION

03 November 2018

At 4:00 AM, Easterlies affected the eastern section of the country. Metro Manila and the rest of the country experienced partly cloudy skies to at times cloudy with rainshowers or thunderstorm caused by localized thunderstorm.

04 November 2018

At 4:00 AM, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affected Visayas and Mindanao. Visayas and Northern Mindanao, CARAGA, and Zamboanga Peninsula experienced cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorm caused by ITCZ.

Metro Manila and the rest of the country experienced partly cloudy skies to at times cloudy with rainshowers or thunderstorm caused by localized thunderstorm.

05 November 2018

At 4:00 AM, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affected Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. Bicol Region, Central and Eastern Visayas, CARAGA, Northern Mindanao, and Zamboanga Peninsula experienced cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by ITCZ.

Metro Manila and the rest of the country will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers caused by localized thunderstorm. Possible floodings or landslides due to severe thunderstorms.

III. EFFECTS

A. Incidents Monitored

A total of **three (3) incidents** were reported in Regions CALABARZON and VIII.

COLLAPSED WALL - 1

1. On 01 November 2018, at around 4:30 PM, a concrete wall in the vicinity of El Reposo Public Cemetery in Brgy. 55, Tacloban City, collapsed and injured three (3) minors namely Raniel del Rosario (6 years old), Lolito Hobello, (17 years old), and Gian Rodrigo Balibalita, (8 years old). Two of the victims suffered a slight injury in the head, bruised legs and hands and were given first aid by responding BFP medics. Whereas, one of the victims suffered a head injury and was brought to Divine Word Hospital DWU by BFP medics for immediate medical attention.

VEHICULAR ACCIDENT - 2

2. On 01 November 2018, at around 3:30 PM, a vehicle from Gumaca Public Cemetery going to Catanauan was traversing the Bundok Peninsula Road. Upon reaching the area of the incident, the driver loses control on the steering wheel when he tried to avoid hitting the unidentified people who suddenly crossed the road. Seven (7) passengers sustained injuries and was rushed to RAKK Prophet Hospital.
3. On 01 November 2018, at around 10:38 PM, a vehicular accident transpired at Maharlika Highway, Brgy. Balubal, Sariaya, Quezon. Vehicle 1 was traversing from Sariaya to Lucena City when it accidentally collided with Vehicle 2 which was traversing the opposite direction. Victims sustained injuries and were brought to Lucena Doctors Hospital and Medical Center.

Note: Incidents capture are from November 1 to 2, 2018 only.

B. Status of Ports

1. A total of **90,929 outbound passengers** and **92,920 inbound passengers** were monitored while **504 vessel**, and **1,053 motorbancas** were inspected by PCG Districts.

IV. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- Raised the alert status at the NDRRMOC to **RED ALERT** on 29 October 2018, 8:00 AM and remained in view of the observance of UNDAS 2018.
- Issued NDRRMOC Memorandum to Member-Agencies and Regional DRRMCs directing all concerned to maintain their alert status ICOW UNDAS 2018.

2. Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Service Administration (DOST-PAGASA)

- Disseminated Weather Forecasts, General Flood Advisories, and Severe Weather Bulletins (SWBs).

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of the DSWD-DRMB coordinated with the DSWD-Field Offices for significant updates on disaster preparedness for response regarding the observance of UNDAS 2018.
- The DSWD Central Office (CO), concerned Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) had stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱1,454,173,067.09 with breakdown as follows:
 - Stockpiles** – A total of **368,164 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** amounting to **₱131,754,540.17** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱809,722,576.59**.
 - Standby Funds** – A total of **₱1,454,173,067.09 standby funds** in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱1,403,575,664.48** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

4. Department of Public Works and Highway (DPWH)

- a. Placed Districts' Motorists Assistance Teams of DEOs on standby within their respective areas of assignment to provide assistance to the traveling public.
- b. Monitored the condition of national roads and bridges and other infrastructure facilities.

B. Regional / Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)

- **RDRRMC/OCDROs I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, ARMM, CAR, and NCR** disseminated weather advisories/ bulletins to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD Text Blast System, and uploaded the same to social media accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty.

- a. Disseminated RDRRMC I Memorandum No. 127, s. 2018 re: Sustained Red Alert Status in observance of All Saints/ Souls Day 2018.

Office of Civil Defense (OCD) I

- a. Disseminated RDRRMC I Memoranda No. 127, s. 2018 re Sustained Red Alert Status, and No. 128, s. 2018 during Downgrade of Alert Status from Red to Blue in observance of All Saints/Souls Day.

Department of Health (DOH) I

- a. Detailed Duty Officer (DDO) rendered duty at OCD-RDRRMC I OpGen.
- b. Was on "Code White" status and on 24-hour duty to monitor health events related to the celebration of UNDAS 2018.

Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) I

- a. Activated OPLAN Kaluluwa effective 27 October 2018 in commemoration of All Saints' and All Souls' Day.
- b. Raised alert status to Code BLUE from 27 October 2018 until 29 October 2018.
- c. Was on Code RED from 30 October 2018 to 02 November 2018 to maximize the deployment of personnel and keep all stations ready to respond to any untoward incidents.

PDRRMC PANGASINAN

- a. Raised alert status to RED on 31 October 2018, in compliance with the RDRRMC Memorandum dated 31 October 2018.
- b. Alerted Cities and Municipalities to continuously monitor the situation within their respective areas of responsibility.
- c. Conducted information dissemination on preparedness and advisories through Tri-Media and social media to ensure public safety.
- d. Informed DRRMO/Cs to implement their preparedness measures and be ready with their Rescue and Emergency Response Units.
- e. Monitored the road situation in the entire province in coordination with PNP.
- f. Established incident command post and advance medical post located at beachfronts.

- a. Placed emergency operations center on RED Alert status to closely monitor situation within the Area of Responsibility.

- b. Conducted response cluster meeting on 31 October 2018 and advised RDRRMC member-agencies to prepare assets for deployment in preparation for All Souls Day.
- c. Downgraded the Alert Status of Operations Center from Red to Blue on 03 November 2018, 8:00 AM.

- a. Activated all provinces and HUCs Operations Center to provide medical and other necessary assistance in their respective areas of jurisdiction

- a. Prepared directories for deployment of assets for All Souls Day.
- b. Placed alert status to Code White for UNDAS 2018.

- a. Monitored and assisted accidents occurred in the AOR.
- b. Monitored, coordinated, and submitted the reports to RDRRMC OpCen.

Philippine National Police (PNP) III

- a. Prepared directories for deployment of assets for All Souls Day.
- b. Deployed personnel at the assistance hubs for LIGTAS UNDAS 2018.

PDRRMC Bulacan

- a. Prepared directories for deployment of assets for All Souls Day.
- b. Established a total of 104 First Aid Stations all over the province.

PDRRMC Nueva Ecija

- a. Monitored the situation in the different cemeteries around Nueva Ecija.

PDRRMC Pampanga

- a. Coordinated and submitted the status update to RDRRMC OpCen through OCD III.

PDRRMC Tarlac

- a. Established command post and first aid station in front of SM City Tarlac.
- b. Deployed and prepositioned composite team personnel from PDRRMC/volunteers manning Motorist and Medical Assistance Advanced Command Post.

3. RDRRMC CALABARZON

OCD CALABARZON

- a. Raised the alert status to BLUE for the Oplan UNDAS 2018.
- b. Disseminated Memorandum No. 08 s. 2018 re Activation of Local DRRM Emergency Operations Center.
- c. Monitored and coordinated with CALABARZON P/C/MDRRMOs and RDRRMC member agencies re situation in their respective AORs.

DILG CALABARZON

- a. Alerted all DILG Provincial, City, and Municipal Offices and coordinated with LCEs, Chief of Police, Fire Marshalls, and other concerned authorities for strict monitoring of AOR..
- b. Activated DILG Operations Center for monitoring of reports based from LGU's actions taken and incident monitoring.
- c. Assisted in the dissemination of weather advisories to Local Government Units respective AORs thru channels.
- d. Coordinated with RDRRMC OpCen.

DSWD CALABARZON

- a. DSWD Disaster Management Unit (DMU) on heightened alert with the Quick Response Teams (QRTs).
- b. Ensured the availability of funds and family food packs that may be given to victims if disaster occurs. Prepositioned stockpile (food and non-food items) at the field office and at the warehouses in all 5 provinces of the region.
- c. Placed DSWD QRTs on standby for possible deployment if disaster operations occur.
- d. DMU alerted all Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) and advised them to intensify their operations and be vigilant to ensure public safety services to the community before, during, and after the observance of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day.
- e. Advised LSWDOs to closely monitor the overall conduct of the operations within its AOR in coordination with their respective LDRRMOs.
- f. Coordinated with SWAD Team Leaders and Provincial Action Team of CALABARZON provinces and advised them to monitor and coordinate with the LGUs to gather reports on the disaster incidents/events and emergencies that may occur during UNDAS 2018.
- g. Placed LSWDOs, LDRRMOs, and member agencies on standby for possible response operations.

Armed Forces of the Philippines Southern Luzon Command (AFP SOLCOM)

- a. Directed all AFP units to coordinate with PNP counterparts for the conduct of Joint-Target hardening to secure targeted facilities and establishments against threat and organized crime groups in order to ensure the security and safety of the general public at places of convergence like cemeteries, transport terminal, malls, market, churches, and other places of worship.
- b. Conducted checkpoints in coordination with PNP to maximize the presence of government forces in critical areas.
- c. Provided motorist assistance in major thoroughfares and highways.
- d. Intensified intelligence effort.
- e. Maximized the utilization of K9 and EOD Units in the conduct of explosive detection at possible entry/exit points in urban centers and/or cities.

BFP CALABARZON

- a. Issued a memorandum regarding the measures/policies to be observed during All Saint's Day and All Soul's Day to all the BFP Offices.
- b. Heightened alert status and was directed to implement Operation Plan Kaluluwa in their respective area of responsibility.
- c. Operating Field Unit conducted personnel visibility to 220 public and 248 private cemeteries within the region.
- d. Instructed City and Municipal Fire Station to set up motorist assistance centers and special rescue units for 24/7 operations and ready for deployment in case of emergency.

DOH CALABARZON

- a. Activated DOH Hospitals and Centers for Health Development to Code White Alert on All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day.
- b. Placed the Health Emergency Management Staff (HEMS) Operations Center on active surveillance on 01 and 02 November 2018 to monitor any health-related emergencies.
- c. Coordinated with Provincial HEM of CALABARZON on the status of reports.
- d. Coordinated and validated with PHO Quezon re cases of seven (7) persons involved in the vehicular accident in Pitogo, Quezon.

DPWH CALABARZON

- a. Assigned personnel and deployed skeletal workforce for Lakbay Alalay to all District Engineering Offices (DEOs).
- b. Ensured all national highways, specially those leading to public and private cemeteries, be thoroughly maintained and always kept in good shape for safer travel and ensure uninterrupted flow of traffic.

Philippine Coast Guard – Southern Tagalog (PCG-STL) and NCR

- a. Strictly observed heightened alert during the implementation of the OPLAN LIGTAS BYAHE: UNDAS 2018.
- b. Coordinated with the local PPA and MARINA within the area regarding the establishment of DOTC Passenger Assistance Center and enjoined members of the PCGA to participate.
- c. Ensured observance of full alert in all stations/substations within AOR and activation of respective Passenger Assistance Centers (PACs) together with cognizant agencies with appropriate number of personnel manning the help desks.
- d. Directed CGK9-STL, CGSOU-STL, and CGMED-STL to augment and act as additional deployment in the Passengers Assistance Centers (PAC) in CGDSTL stations and substations.
- e. Placed Deployable Response Group (DRG) was placed on standby and ready to respond.
- f. Coordinated with local PNP, AFP, PPA, and shipping companies to emphasize respective or integrated commitment to security and safety in water transport services by improving and enforcing safety standards and regulations, such as inspection of baggage's and implementation of security layers in the ports and passenger terminals to prevent hostile elements from perpetrating terrorist acts and other focus of security threats, and likewise, to strictly ensure no overloading of passengers.

Police Regional Office (PRO) CALABARZON

- a. Provided security coverage and other public safety services during the UNDAS.
- b. Implemented active defense against lawless armed groups who may perpetrate violent activities against lightly defended installations.
- c. Ensured police presence through foot and mobile patrols in public areas, terminals, cemeteries, churches, resorts, and other areas vulnerable to terrorist hostile activities in coordination with other concerned law enforcement agencies, LGUs, and private security providers.
- d. Deployed Road Safety Marshals in strategic areas along the routes to and from cemeteries and other areas of convergence.
- e. Intensified intelligence, counter-intelligence, and police operations to preempt terrorist and criminal activities.
- f. Coordinated with LGUs, concerned government agencies, and radio groups for their assistance in addressing traffic congestion in major thoroughfares.
- g. Managed active security patrols in residential areas during the occasion to prevent break-ins and akyat-bahay incidents.
- h. Conducted random mobile checkpoints/chokepoints in accordance to PNP Operational Procedures.
- i. Established Assistance Hubs (AHs) along major highways, cemeteries, airports, seaports, bus terminals, malls, and resorts, in coordination with other concerned law enforcement agencies, LGUs, and volunteer groups.

- j. Maintained safe exclusion area for all conveyances/vehicles such as cars, trucks, delivery vans, motorcycles, and tricycles away from cemeteries.
- k. Conducted information campaigns in coordination with LGUs for public safety awareness.
- l. Provided security coverage to power plants, telecommunication relay stations, and other vital installations.
- m. Coordinated with LGUs for the establishment of AHs for people with disability and the elderly in all cemeteries.
- n. Alerted Quick Response Teams to respond to any emergency cases.
- o. Coordinated with local electric companies within the area for advisories on the power shutoffs.
- p. Installed tarpaulins in entrances of cemeteries containing rules and regulations to be followed including list of prohibited items inside cemeteries;
- q. Coordinated with community-based volunteers and other force multipliers to be deployed during the security operations to wear appropriate uniform or identification cards for security reasons.
- r. Coordinated with concerned LGUs for provision of additional parking areas / spaces in the vicinities of cemeteries so as not to hamper the smooth flow of traffic within the vicinities of cemeteries.

Philippine Red Cross (PRC) Rizal, Laguna, and Cavite

- a. Placed on 24/7 standby to provide first aid and medical assistance to possible road accidents and other emergencies that may occur.
- b. Established First Aid Stations and Welfare Desk manned by PRC personnel.
- c. Provided updates to RDRRMOC CALABARZON.

Philippine Information Agency (PIA) CALABARZON

- a. Ensured timely and accurate dissemination of situation reports.

Land Transportation Office (LTO) CALABARZON

- a. Coordinated with the Local Government Units, and set-up and manned help desks in various public land transportation terminals to provide passenger assistance.
- b. Heightened efforts to tighten security over passengers, goods, and transport facilities and enhanced response capability to emergencies.
- c. Ensured compliance on safety measure.
- d. Conducted inspections in different terminals within the region.
- e. Conducted pre-departure and inspection of buses.
- f. Checked and validated registration and franchise documents, and counter checked conductors and driver's license to determine its propriety and validity.
- g. Conducted alcohol and drug tests to drivers and conductors.

Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) CALABARZON

- a. Coordinated with the members of DOTr Inter-Agency Task Force, such as the LTO and HPG.
- b. Conducted anti-corruption operations.
- c. Established help desks in key areas/terminals within the area of jurisdiction.

PDRRMC Laguna

- a. Placed on Blue Alert Status.
- b. Disseminated RDRRMC CALABARZON Memorandum re Preparedness for All Souls / Saints Day to all City/Municipal DRRMOs.
- c. Conducted PDRA / ERP meeting with C/MDRRMOs on 26 October 2018.

- d. Disseminated advisories through all means of communication.
- e. Placed rescue vehicles and other equipment on standby ready for augmentation.
- f. Activated the Incident Command System.
- g. Activated emergency preparedness and response assets and their respective incident management teams to address any untoward incidents in the observance of All Saints/Souls Day.

PDRRMC Batangas

- a. Convened PDRRMCs to discuss different preparedness measures for Oplan UNDAS 2018.
- b. Activated the Operations Center.
- c. Directed C/MDRRMC to assure the public of their preparedness for the solemnity and orderliness of the observance of UNDAS 2018.
- d. Monitored the status of the travelers passing through Batangas Port.
- e. Deployed the provincial Medical Service Team to cemeteries to provide medical assistance to the public.
- f. Coordinated with Police Provincial Office (PPO) and PCG to ensure that safety and security plans are in place.
- g. Activated preparedness and response assets and their respective IMTs to address any untoward incidents in the observance of UNDAS 2018.

PDRRMC Rizal

- a. Activated the Operations Center and continuously monitored the AOR.
- b. Activated the preparedness and response assets, and respective IMTs to address any untoward incidents in the observance of UNDAS 2018.

PDRRMC Quezon

- a. Activated the Operations Center and continuously monitored the AOR..
- b. Activated the preparedness and response assets and respective IMTs to address any untoward incidents in the observance of UNDAS 2018.
- c. Reminded DRRMCs to disseminate advisories through local/community leaders and/or local media for the safety of the public.
- d. Monitored and coordinated with C/MDRRMOs re weather situation and any untoward incident.

4. RDRRMC MIMAROPA

OCD MIMAROPA

- a. Placed Operations Center on Blue Alert Status for monitoring, coordination, and assistance in observance of All Saints/Souls Day.
- b. Disseminated Weather Bulletins, Flood Advisories, and Gale Warning to P/C/MDRRMCs, LGUs, Local Radio Station, and line member-agencies through SMS, infoboard, facsimile, and uploaded the same to OCD-RDRRMC MIMAROPA facebook and skype accounts to ensure widest dissemination of these advisories.
- c. Advised all concerned agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs chairpersons to activate all local DRRMCs Operations Center and closely monitor its AOR for any untoward incident during the observance of UNDAS 2018.
- d. Coordinated with Coast Guard Stations re influx of seafaring public.
- e. Coordinated with response agencies and monitored the AOR.
- f. Coordinated with RDRRMC member-agencies re Oplan UNDAS 2018.

DILG MIMAROPA

- a. Advised field offices and ensured that LGU convene the Local Peace and Order Council to formulate a contingency plan on peace and order, and public safety for UNDAS 2018.
- b. Advised the LGU to maintain the cleanliness and orderliness in cemeteries and other public places before, during and after UNDAS 2018.
- c. Implemented other necessary measures towards a peaceful and meaningful observance of UNDAS 2018.

DSWD MIMAROPA
