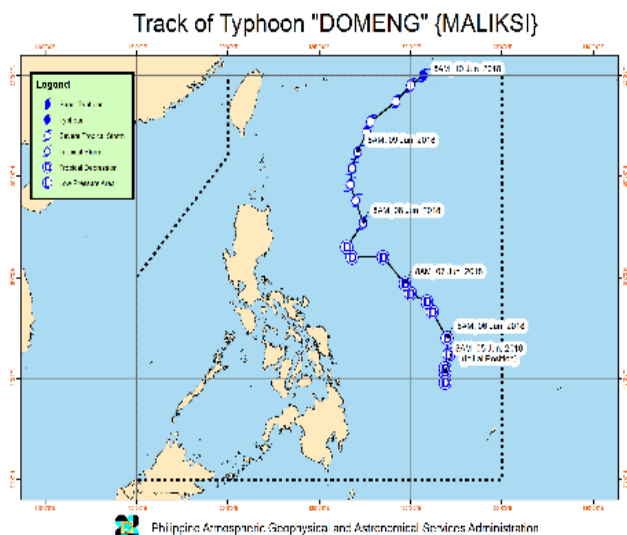

### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **A. Chronology of Typhoon Track**



#### **05 June 2018**

At 11:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Northern Mindanao and inside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) developed into a Tropical Depression and was named “DOMENG”.

TD “DOMENG” enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) during its stay on PAR and brought considerable amount of rain over Luzon and Visayas.

#### **06 June 2018**

At 10:00 AM, the center of TD “DOMENG” was estimated at 805 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.2 °N, 132.0 °E), with maximum sustained winds of 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 60 kph.

#### **07 June 2018**

At 10:00 AM, the center of TD “DOMENG” was estimated at 615 km Northeast of Borongan City, Eastern Samar, with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph.

#### **08 June 2018**

At 3:00 AM, the center of TD “DOMENG” was estimated at 470 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (16.5 °N, 126.5 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 60 km/h near the center and

gustiness of up to 75 km/h. It was forecasted to move North at 15 km/h. Monsoon Trough affected Luzon and Visayas.

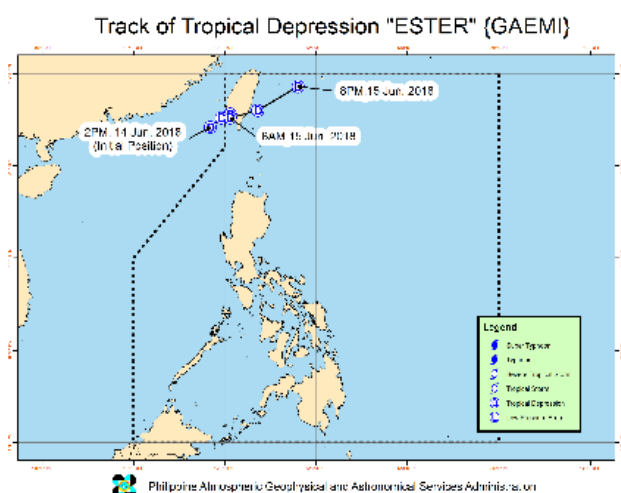
Monsoon rains was experienced over CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, and the provinces of Aurora, Bataan, and Zambales caused by monsoon trough/Tropical Depression/Southwest Monsoon.

TD “DOMENG” intensified into a Tropical Storm as it moved in a northeastward direction.

## **09 June 2018**

At 3:00 AM, the center of Tropical Storm "DOMENG" was estimated at 505 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.6 °N, 126.8 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 80 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 95 km/h. It was forecasted to move North Northeast at 17 km/h. Southwest Monsoon affecting Luzon and Visayas.

At 9:30 AM, TS “DOMENG” exited PAR as a Typhoon.



## **14 June 2018**

At 5:00 PM, the LPA outside PAR located at west northwest of Batanes developed into a Tropical Depression and was named “ESTER”.

TD “ESTER” slightly intensified while moving almost stationary over the Mountainous Region of Southern Taiwan.

TD “ESTER” enhanced Southwest Monsoon during its stay on PAR and has brought considerable amount of rains over the

western section of Luzon particularly Ilocos Region and Central Luzon.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 1 was raised over Batanes.

## **15 June 2018**

At 8:00 PM, TD “ESTER” exited PAR.

## **B. Tropical Cyclone Analysis**

### **TY “DOMENG”**

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Northern Mindanao and inside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) developed into a Tropical Depression “DOMENG” on 05 June 2018 at 11:00 AM. “DOMENG” intensified into a Tropical Storm as it moved in northeastward direction on 08 June 2018 at 11:00 AM. It exited PAR on 09 June 2018 at 9:30 AM as a Typhoon. It was given an international name “MALIKSI” which means fast. The name was contributed by the Philippines.

“DOMENG” enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) during its stay on PAR and had brought considerable amount of rains over Luzon and Visayas.

“DOMENG” had spared the country as it moved generally North Northwest to North Northeast, east of the country inside PAR.

The Science Garden recorded the greatest accumulated rainfall and greatest 24-hour rainfall of 370.7 mm and 193.5 mm respectively.

The period of occurrence of Typhoon “DOMENG” inside the PAR is from 05 June 2018 (8 AM) – 09 June 2018 (8 AM). During the stay of Typhoon “DOMENG”, the estimated highest maximum sustained winds attained was 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 145 kph with a central pressure of 981 hPa. Five (5) Weather Advisories, 21 Tropical Cyclone Warning for Shipping (IWS) and 11 Severe Weather Bulletins (SWB) (TC Alert) were issued.

No Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal was raised.

### **TD “ESTER”**

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) west northwest of Batanes have developed into a Tropical Depression “ESTER” on 14 June 2018 at 5 PM. “ESTER” slightly intensified while moving almost stationary over the Mountainous Region of Southern Taiwan. It exited PAR on 15 June 2018 at 8:00 PM. It was given an international name “GAEMI” meaning ant. The name was contributed by Republic of Korea.

“ESTER” enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) during its stay on PAR and had brought considerable amount of rains over the western section of Luzon particularly Ilocos Region and Central Luzon.

Subic Bay recorded the greatest accumulated rainfall and greatest 24-hour rainfall of 270.0 mm and 141.0 mm respectively.

The period of occurrence of Tropical Depression “ESTER” inside the PAR is from 14 June 2018 (5 PM) – 15 June 2018 (8 PM).

During the stay of TD “ESTER”, the estimated highest maximum sustained winds attained was 60 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 100 kph with a central pressure of 992 hPa. One (1) Weather Advisory, 6 Topical Cyclone Warning for Shipping (IWS), and 5 Severe Weather Bulletins (SWB) (TC Alert) were issued. Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 1 was in effect in Batanes.

## **II. EFFECTS**

### **A. Incident Monitored (TAB A)**

A total of **fourteen (14) incidents** (collapsed riprap, flashflood, overflowed spillway, air mishap, uprooted trees, drowning, collapsed structure, and rock fall) were n CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, CARAGA, NCR, and CAR.

A total of **17 families / 73 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in CALABARZON due to possible flooding and landslide.

Monitored and disseminated weather advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warning, and other advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
