I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

09 July 2018

Typhoon "GARDO" maintained its strength while moving west-northwestward over the Philippine Sea.

"GARDO" enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) which brought monsoon rains over MIMAROPA and Western Visayas, and occasional rains over Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Zambales, Bataan, and Aurora until 10 July 2019.

10 July 2018

Typhoon "GARDO" maintained its strength and is headed towards Northern Taiwan area.

"GARDO" enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) which brought monsoon rains over Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro, Northern Palawan, and Romblon.

11 July 2018

Typhoon "MARIA" made landfall in Fujian, China

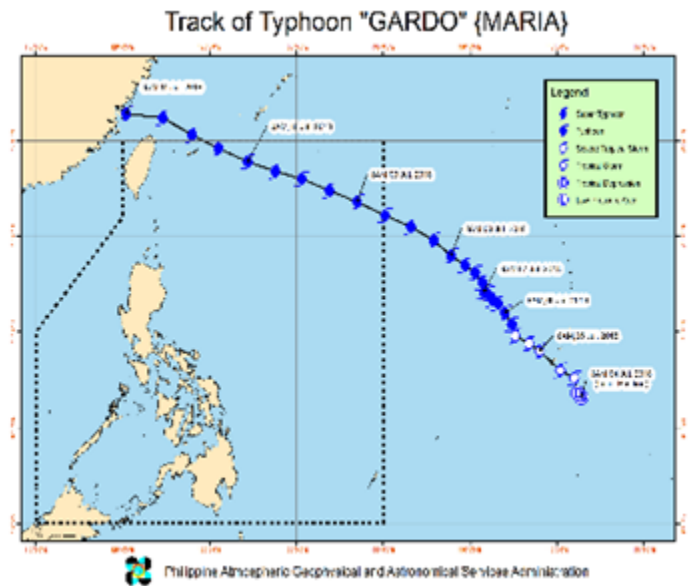
Typhoon "MARIA" had no direct effect on any part of the country. However, it enhanced the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat), which brought monsoon rains over Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, Romblon, Palawan, and Western Visayas.

12 July 2018

"MARIA" weakened over South-eastern China. Meanwhile, the Southwest Monsoon continuously brought scattered to widespread rains over Mindanao, Western Visayas and the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Mindoro and Palawan.

II. TROPICAL CYCLONE ANALYSIS

A Tropical Depression (TD) was formed on 03 July over Mariana Islands. On the following day, the system intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS). Early morning of 05 July 2018, the Tropical Cyclone intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) and further intensified into a Typhoon (TY). TY GARDO entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) at 5:00 AM of 09 July 2018. It moved west-northwest ward while maintaining its strength and headed toward Northern Taiwan. GARDO exited PAR on 8:00 PM, 10 July 2018.



Moreover, GARDO enhanced Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) during its stay on PAR and brought considerable amount of rain over the western section of Central and Southern Luzon. GARDO has spared the country as it moved generally northwestward toward Northern Taiwan Area outside PAR. No Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) was raised during its occurrence inside the PAR.

III. EFFECTS

A. Incidents Monitored

A total of **4 incidents** transpired in **Regions MIMAROPA and BARMM** due to the said weather disturbance, as follows:

- Uprooted tree in San Agustin Romblon causing damage to 1 residential house.
- Maritime incident in Bongabong, Oriental Mindoro involving a fishing vessel, M/V Champion II with its 7 crew. Said crew were rescued by Local fishermen from Brgy. Masaguisi, Bongabong and Bansud Oriental Mindoro.
- Strong winds and heavy rains in Maluso, Basilan causing multiple damages to properties in Barangays Samal Village, Calang, Canas, Shioyard Main, Shipyard Tabuk, and North Gaunan.
- Tornado incident in Barangay Brgy. Baas, Lamitan, Basilan.

B. Affected Population

1. A total of **24 families / 87 persons** were affected in Region III, of which a total of **5 families/18 persons** stayed in evacuation centers.

IV. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting for TY “GARDO” with Extended Core Group and RDRRMCs concerned through Skype video conferencing on 09 June 2018.
- b. Issued NDRRMOC Memorandum No. 75 dated 09 July 2018 requiring NDRRMOC Member-Agencies and RDRRMCs/OCDROs on the following actions to be taken:
 - Monitor settlements in areas identified as very high/critical landslide zones, in low-lying areas or near riverbanks which have experienced recent and repeated flooding;
 - Implementation of Forced Evacuation Protocol in areas identified with Very-High Susceptibility Ratings to landslide and flood, and Pre-Emptive Evacuation Protocol High Susceptibility Ratings to landslide and flood.
- c. Monitored and disseminated weather advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warnings, and other advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites.

2. DOST-Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

- a. Monitored the situation and ensured the provision of Weather Advisories, Severe Weather Bulletins, and 24-hour Public Weather Forecast to all stakeholders.

3. Department of Health (DOH)

- a. Raised Code Alert.
- b. Issued alert memorandum to all regional offices regarding the conduct of the following:
 - Monitoring of the weather disturbance;
 - Activation of Code Alert and 24/7 Operations Center; and
 - Preparation of medicines and medical supplies for augmentation.
- c. Deployed HEMB Staff and attended the Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) meeting at the NDRRM Operations Center.
- d. Prepositioned a total of ₱10,496,627.01 worth of logistics from DOH Regional Offices.

4. Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)

- a. Issued MGB's list of Barangays Susceptible to floodings and landslides on 09 July 2018.

Reminded all Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) to continuously disseminate NDRRMC/RDRRMC advisories through local/community leaders and/or local media to inform/warn communities particularly residents in low-lying areas, mountain slopes and coastal areas of possible flooding, flashfloods, landslides, storm surges, and big waves.

PDRRMCs CAVITE, LAGUNA, BATANGAS, RIZAL, and QUEZON

- a. Activated 24/7 Operations Center.
- b. Provided updates regarding the situation in the entire Province especially on the suspension of classes.
- c. Advised LDRRMOs to monitor landslide prone-areas.

3. RDRRMC MIMAROPA**Office of Civil Defense (OCD) MIMAROPA Satellite Office**

- a. Disseminated Weather Advisories and General Flood Advisories to all Local DRRM Councils, NGA line agencies through SMS, facsimile, local radio stations and uploaded the same to OCD-RDRRMC MIMAROPA social media accounts to ensure widest dissemination.
- b. Coordinated with LGUs to gather updates regarding the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by TY "GARDO".
- c. Coordinated with Coast Guard Stations and Substation within the area regarding the status of port operations.

Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) MIMAROPA

- a. Coordinated with Local Government Operations Offices (LGOOs) and Local DRRM Offices for weather advisories and forecasts.
- b. Advised to all provincial offices and LGUs to take precautionary measures.

Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) MIMAROPA

- a. Activated Field Office Operation Center to monitor daily local weather conditions and provide situational awareness.
- b. Alerted all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in the 5 provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations within its areas.
- c. Placed all members of R/P/C/M QRTs on standby for possible deployment.
- d. Advised P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities within its respective areas and take appropriate actions.
- e. Activated the Information and Communication Technology Management Unit (ICTMU) to ensure a robust communication system.
- f. Ensured the availability of an on-call truck for delivery of goods to areas that will be affected.
- g. Placed logistical equipment and workforce on standby through coordination with SWADT and concerned LGU's on management of any stranded passengers in ports and terminals.
- h. Ensured that Relief Goods both Food and Non Food Items (F/NFI) are also ready and available at any given time.
- i. Coordinated with RDRRMC MIMAROPA through the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) regarding warning signal updates for monitoring purposes and response mechanism to affected areas.
- j. Prepositioned stockpile of 31,085 family food packs to all SWADT and Regional Warehouses and prepositioned goods in identified GIDA/critical areas.
- k. Ensured the availability of standby funds amounting to ₱547,760.00.

Department of Health (DOH) MIMAROPA

- a. Sent Code Alert Memo in the DOH Regional Office, Provincial DOH Offices and DOH-Retained Hospitals through the Health Emergency Response and Operation Center.
- b. Activated the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) on 24/7 basis and manned by Emergency Officers on duty.
- c. Coordinated and monitored the mobilization of all logistical requirements of the DOH as needed by the province/s.
- d. Issued directives regarding the deployment of NDPs and RHMPPs to all areas of concern including exit entry points (Air/Sea Ports) and identified evacuation areas for the establishment of Health Assistance Desk on a 24/7 basis.
- e. Prepared and disseminated HEARS (*Health Emergency Alert Reporting System*) reports and to all concerned units and agencies.
- f. Monitored all health and health-related events on a 24/7 basis, including all regional and local events and incidents with potential impact to a particular area or the region as a whole.
- g. Ascertained the timely mobilization, prioritization, and maximum utilization of resources, and minimization of wastage.
- h. Placed Response Teams on standby for possible deployment:
 - i. Checked inventory of logistics in all Regional and Provincial warehouses and the availability of funds, including Quick Response Fund (QRF) amounting to ₱500,000.00.
 - j. Ensured the availability of vehicles and drivers 24/7.
- k. Placed standby Administrative Staff, Engineers, Security and Safety Officers.
- l. Anticipated escalation of incidents and start preparing necessary documents in case Petty Cash amounting to ₱50,000.00 (monthly) will be needed.
- m. Advised PAMAS Air Ambulance Services for possible utilization of air evacuation.

- n. Established the direction and the points of command, control and communication during anticipated escalation of the event
- o. Anticipated scenarios and alerts and guide additional teams going to the site as needed.
- p. Coordinated with regional hospitals for its preparedness and availability of back-up teams.
- q. Ensured the availability of communication equipment such as radio and mobile phones.
- r. Coordinated with all health-related response efforts to major health emergencies and disasters.
- s. Placed all regional and provincial personnel on standby for immediate deployment if warranted and in the event of elevation of the code.
- t. Facilitated the issuance of appropriate warnings to all concerned health offices and facilities in anticipation of impending emergencies.
- u. Prepositioned drugs, medicines and medical supplies in provincial DOH offices and DOH retained hospitals amounting to ₱1,709,304.52.
- v. Prepositioned dome tent in strategic areas and areas of concern for health services amounting to ₱5,312,472.00.

Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) MIMAROPA

- a. Alerted maintenance crew of the District Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Teams to monitor the condition of National Roads and Bridges and other infrastructures facilities.
- b. Placed equipment on standby status and ready to mobilize as situation warrants.

COAST GUARD DISTRICT SOUTHERN TAGALOG

- a. Placed assets on standby status ready for deployment on flood-prone and coastal areas.
- b. Instructed all Coast Guards Stations and Sub-Stations to closely monitor weather forecasts.

- d. Ensured the operational status of HF and VHF radio communications in support to the Province's operational concern in case of power black-out.

 - Reviewed of contingency plans
 - Preposition SAR equipment
 - Ensure widest information-dissemination of advisories within AORs.
