I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

- An earthquake with the magnitude (tectonic) of **Ms 6.5 occurred in Ormoc City, Leyte** (11.11 °N, 124.69 °E - 015 km N 39° E) on 06 July 2017, 04:03:53 PM. It has a depth of 2 kilometres. Reported and instrumental intensities are as follows:

- From **06 July to 05 August 2017**, a total of **1,099 aftershocks** (ranging from **magnitude 1.5 to 5.8**) were recorded by DOST-PHIVOLCS.
- Landslides** were reported in Mt. Amandiwing, Brgy. Rubas, Jaro; Mt. Banao and along the provincial road within the Lake Danao Natural Park in Brgy. Lake Danao, Ormoc City; and, roads in mountainous areas of the Brgy. Tongonan, Ormoc City.



II. EFFECTS:

A. AFFECTED POPULATION

1. A total of **4,130 families or 16,052 persons** were affected in **27 barangays** in the Province of Leyte (Region VIII). Of which, **2,070 families/8,439 persons** were served in **20 evacuation centers**. While, **1,954 families/7,426 persons** stayed outside the ECs with either their family or friends:

IV. DISASTER RESPONSE

A. NATIONAL DRRM COUNCIL

1. NDRRM Operations Center

- a. Disseminated the Earthquake Information to OCD Regional Offices concerned and other stakeholders through facsimile, SMS, website, and social media accounts for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs. Moreover, advised them to undertake precautionary measures and to monitor the situation for any possible effects of said earthquake particularly in areas with reported intensities.
- b. Prepared the Emergency Alert and Warning Message (EAWM) for dissemination of Telecommunications Companies (TELCOs) to the affected areas.



- c. Deployed three (3) generator sets and one unit of water filtration to improve the living conditions in the affected areas.

2. DOST-Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS)

- a. Disseminated Earthquake Information to stakeholders.
- b. Deployed the first batch of Quick Response Team (QRT) on 07 July 2017 to do Information Education Campaign, earthquake hazard assessment, and building damage assessment.
- c. Deployed Geological Assessment Teams to the affected areas of the earthquake (Jaro, Kananga, and Ormoc City).

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- a. Disaster Response Assistance and Management Bureau (DReAMB) was on Blue Alert.
- b. Directed DSWD Field Office (FO) VIII to activate the Regional Response Cluster for immediate response.
- c. Placed QRT members and Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Teams (RETT) on standby for possible mobilization.
- d. DSWD Central Office, National Resource Operations Center (NROC), and FO VIII had a total stockpiles and standby funds amounting ₱1,119,079,130.34, with breakdown as follows:

Stockpiles

A total of 116,957 Family Food Packs (FFPs) worth ₱44,425,529.08 and Food and Non-Food Items (NFIs) worth ₱210,130,320.21.

Standby Funds

A total of ₱864,523,281.05 standby funds available at the Central Office and Field Offices. Of which, ₱861,523,281.05 is the Quick Response Fund.

4. Department of Health (DOH)

DOH-Health Emergency Management Bureau (HEMB)

- a. Coordinated with DOH-VIII regarding the incident and NDRRMC for latest updates.
- b. Raised Code Alert.
- c. Issued flash report to all EXECOM members.
- d. Conducted Incident Command System (ICS) - Incident Management Team (IMT) meeting at the DOH Command Center.
- e. Prepared IEC materials in Health Promotion and Communication Service (HPCS).
- f. Conducted site visit in Ormoc City and discussed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with government and private hospitals regarding hospital bills of the earthquake casualties (ill/injured).

- g. Coordinated with the City Health Officer and City HEM Coordinator of Ormoc City and Municipality of Kananga for information management and logistical supply needs.
- h. Coordinated with the Provincial HEM Coordinator during acute response phase and interdisciplinary data sharing and management.
- i. Conducted Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED) and reported the following:
 - A total of 940 consultations were reported from 08 July to 21 July 2017, of which, 39% or 370 total consultations are children below five years of age.
 - Top five (5) leading consultations were Acute Respiratory Infections (463), Open Wounds and Bruises (134), Hypertensions (89), Difficulty of Breathing and Wheezing (38), and Loose Stool (27).
 - Other significant consultations reported include Acute Watery Diarrhea, known Tuberculosis, and Acute Blood Diarrhea.
- j. Provided nutrition such as Vitamin A and Zinc supplementation, Ferrous Sulfate, micronutrient supplementation, Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF), complementary feeding, nutritional assessment, and counselling on breastfeeding and Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF), and an egg a day to 9,064 persons.
- k. Provided mental health and psychological services (psychological first aid, processing, stress management and referral) to 585 persons.
- l. Provided 770 water containers, 750 hygiene kits, and 2,720 water treatment/disinfectants.
- m. Installed water bladders and distributed jerry cans in Rizal Evacuation Center, Kananga, and installed six (6) collapsible portalets in Brgy. Milagro, Dolores and Tongonan, Ormoc (two portalets in each barangay).
- n. Palompon Water District conducted water treatment activities.
- o. Rural Sanitary Inspector conducted WASH assessment in barangay of Kananga.
- p. Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) provided Psychosocial Processing in Kananga National High School to 329 teachers and school personnel.
- q. Health Facilities Enhancement Program (HFEP) Team conducted infrastructure assessment, Disease Surveillance monitoring, and WASH Activities in all affected barangays.
- r. Conducted MHPSS Basic Training Course on selected personnel of Ormoc, Kananga, Matagob, and other stakeholders.

5. Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP)

- a. Deployed personnel at the NDRRMOC to render duty as Duty Detailed Officer (DDO) to ensure a seamless coordination among member-agencies.

6. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)

- a. Deployed personnel at the NDRRMOC to render duty as Duty Detailed Officer (DDO) to ensure a seamless coordination among member-agencies.

7. Department of Energy (DOE)

- a. Coordinated with energy facilities and power distributor utilities.

- h. Assisted in the deployment of the water treatment unit to augment Ormoc City's water supply.
- i. Facilitated a meeting regarding the harmonization of data and the protocols on coordinating and reporting relative to the magnitude 6.5 earthquake in Kananga and Ormoc city.
- j. Attended the Health Quad-Cluster Coordination Meeting at Ormoc City Health Office, Ormoc City.

- c. Provided burial assistance to the families of two (2) dead victims and financial assistance worth ₱5,000.00 to each injured individual admitted in hospitals.
- d. Delivered additional relief commodities to the affected LGUs of Ormoc City and Kananga, Leyte.
- e. As of 16 July 2017, a total of ₱293,700.00 was provided to cover the hospital bills (₱238,700.00) and additional financial assistance (₱55,000.00) of the 39 injured individuals.
- f. Received SM Foundation donation of 1,000 relief packs (containing the following items: 7 pcs Noodles, 2 tins sardines, 1 tin meatloaf, 1kg. rice, and 6 liters bottled water) for Ormoc City and Kananga, Leyte.
- g. Received 30 packs of family food packs donations from various schools containing 4 bottled water, 2 instant noodles, 3 biscuits, 2 canned goods, 5kg. rice, 23 pcs. Soap, 12 sachets milo, 10 pcs. 3-in-1 coffee, and 12 tins mega sardines.
