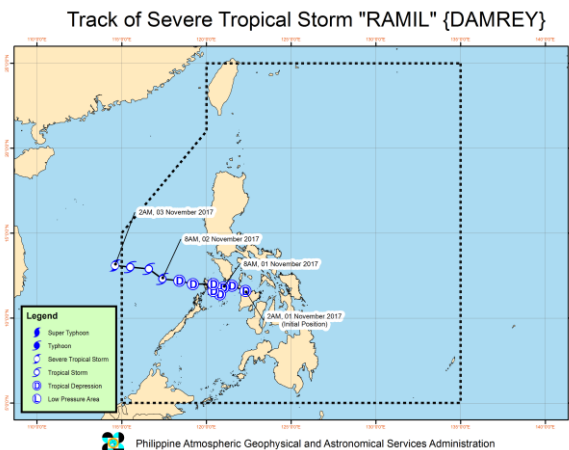
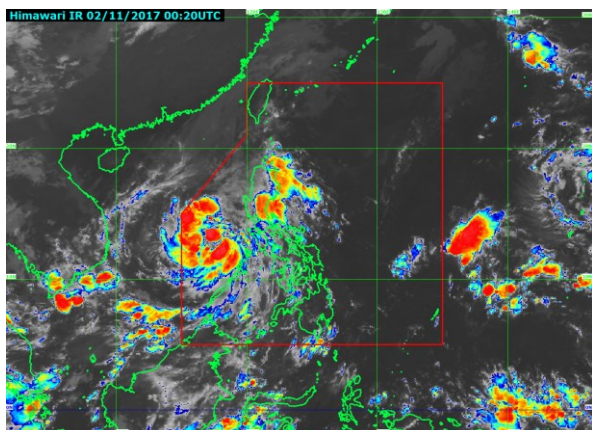

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW



A. Chronology

31 October 2017

At 10:00 AM, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was estimated in the vicinity of Sogod, Southern Leyte. This weather system was forecasted to bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over Visayas, Bicol Region, and MIMAROPA.

Also, it was forecasted to bring light to moderate rains over the regions of Northern Mindanao and CARAGA.

01 November 2017

The LPA was located South Southwest of Masbate City, Masbate and developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "RAMIL".

At 4:00 AM, it was estimated based on all available data at 85 km West of Roxas City, Capiz (11.6°N, 122.0°E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h. It was forecasted to move West at 20 km/h. Northeast Monsoon affect Northern Luzon.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was raised over Northern Palawan including Calamian Group of Islands, Aklan, and Antique.

At 7:00 AM, "RAMIL" maintained its strength as it moved toward Calamian Group of Islands. Additional provinces under TCWS No. 1 were raised in Southern Occidental, Mindoro, and Southern Oriental Mindoro.

At 4:00 PM, "RAMIL" slightly intensified and was located in the vicinity of Calamian Group of Islands. Its center was estimated at 25 km South of Coron with maximum winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 75 kph. It was forecasted to move west at 18 kph.

At 8:00 PM, it maintained its strength as it crossed the Calamian Group of Islands with TCWS No. 1 still hoisted over the remaining provinces, Northern Palawan including Calamian Group of Islands and Southern Occidental Mindoro.

02 November 2017

TD "RAMIL" maintained its strength and was over the West Philippine Sea. At 4:00 AM, it was located at 230 km West of Coron, Palawan with maximum winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It was forecasted to move West at 15 km/h.

At 10:00 AM, "RAMIL" intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) while moving Westward over the West Philippine Sea. TS "RAMIL" was estimated at 365 km West of Coron, Palawan (12.4°N, 116.9°E).

At 11:00 PM, TS "RAMIL" slightly accelerated. "RAMIL" is expected to exit PAR between 11:00 PM, 02 November 2017 and 2:00 AM, 03 November 2017.

03 November 2017

At 3:00 AM, the center of Tropical Storm "RAMIL" was estimated at 240 km North of Pagasa, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) (13.1°N, 114.5°E).

"RAMIL" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm and was outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. EFFECTS

B. Affected Population

A total of **78 families / 305 persons** were affected in **6 barangays** in MIMAROPA, and Region V, all of which, were evacuated in its respective barangays' evacuation centers:

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. The NDRRMOC raised alert status to BLUE on 31 October 2017, 8:00 AM to continuously monitor the situation and maintain close coordination with concerned, Regional DRRMCs, member-agencies and offices.
- b. Disseminated Severe Weather Bulletins to RDRRMCs/OCDROs concerned through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to its respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).

2. Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA)

Disseminated Severe Weather Bulletins, General Flood Advisories, Flood Bulletins and Gale Warnings re TS "RAMIL".

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

The DSWD Central Office (CO), concerned Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱908,689,530.69 with breakdown as follows:

- Stockpiles - A total of 338,824 Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱120,042,440.94 and available Food and Non-food Items (FNIs) amounting to ₱404,670,479.96
- Standby Funds - A total of ₱383,976,609.79 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱337,496,759.05 is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO

B. Regional/Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/L DRRMCs)

RDRRMCs I, II, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VIII, and NCR Disseminated weather advisories to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD InfoBoard Text Blast System, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty; alerted and closely coordinates with all PDRRMCs and RDRRMC member-agencies for possible rescue, relief, and other response operations relative to the weather disturbance; and continuously monitors the situation in its respective AORs.

1. RDRRMC II

Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Region II

- a. Raised BLUE Alert Status on 30 October 2017, 8:00 AM.
- b. Disseminated the Cagayan Valley RDRRMC Memorandum No. 31 dated 27 October 2017 regarding the Raising of Alert Status at the Cagayan Valley RDRRMOC and LDRRMOCs to BLUE Alert Status to P/C/MDRRMCs and other stakeholders.

DSWD Field Office (FO) II

- a. Placed the Disaster Management and Response Team (DMRT) in the Field Office, Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) and Municipal Action Teams (MAT) in the provinces of Batanes, Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino and Nueva are on-call and standby.
- b. The Field Office had an available standby fund amounting to ₱5,396,786.43 and stockpile of 11,902 family food packs, readily available in the event the LGUs are in need of assistance.
- c. Prepositioned a total of 13,400 family food packs in different municipalities of Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, and Nueva Vizcaya.
- d. Prepositioned a total of 264 sacks of NFA rice and assorted canned goods (92 cases corned beef, 88 cases sardines, 92 cases sausage) in the province of Batanes.

Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) II

- a. Placed all units on Full Alert Status starting 31 October 2017 to 02 November 2017 to maximize the deployment of personnel and to keep all stations ready to respond to any untoward incidents.
- b. Directed all stations to conduct lectures or community information drive, going about its areas of responsibility, distributing safety materials, and announcing on public address systems safety precautions.
- c. Directed all BFP to conduct safety inspection at air transport stations and terminals (land and air), marine public transportation and pier, and other places of assembly.
- d. Directed all stations to deploy personnel and firefighting apparatus, ambulances, and EMS to areas likely to be affected by the weather system.

CDRRMC Tuguegarao (Cagayan)

- a. Disseminated advisories to all CDRRMC members, BLGUs, BDAOs, and other stakeholders through SMS.
- b. Monitored the AOR.
- c. Directed all BDRRMCs to undertake the necessary precautionary measures.
- d. Prepositioned rescue equipment at rescue outposts.

2. RDRRMC CALABARZON

OCD CALABARZON

Raised Blue Alert on 28 October 2017, 8:00 AM.

Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) CALABARZON

- a. Alerted all the DILG Provincial, City, and Municipal Offices to closely coordinate with LCEs, Chief of Police, Fire Marshalls, and other concerned authorities for strict enforcement of protocols.
- b. Activated DILG Operations Center and monitored the reports of LGU's actions taken and incident monitoring (thru channels).
- c. Disseminated weather advisories to Local Government Units in respective AOR thru channels.
- d. Coordinated with RDRRM OpCen.

DSWD CALABARZON

- a. Heightened alert status DSWD Disaster Management Unit (DMU) together with the Quick Response Teams (QRTs) for possible deployment.
- b. Ensured availability of funds and family food pack that may be given to victims if disaster occurs.
- c. Prepositioned stockpile (food and non-food items) at the field office and at the warehouses in all 5 provinces of the region.

Department of Health CALABARZON

- a. The Health Emergency Management Staff (HEALTH EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICE) operations center was on active surveillance to monitor any health or health-related emergencies.

Coast Guard District (CGD)-Southern Luzon and NCR

- a. Coordinated with the local PPA and MARINA in the area regarding the establishment of DOTC Passenger Assistance Center. Likewise, enjoin members of the PCGA to participate.
- b. Ensured that all Stations/Substations within AOR would observe full alert and activate respective PACs together with cognizant agencies with appropriate number of personnel manning the help desks.
- c. Directed CGK9-STL, CGSOU-STL, CGMED-STL to augment and act as additional deployment in the Passengers Assistance Centers (PAC) in CGDSTL stations and substations.
- d. Directed DF310 and DF 308 to ensure readiness of its vessels to be deployed in maritime related incidents.
- e. Ensured the promptness of Deployable Response Group (DRG) to respond in any companies to emphasize respective or integrated commitment to security and safety in water transport services by improving and enforcing safety standards and regulations, such as inspection of baggage's and implementation of security layers in the ports and passenger terminals to prevent hostile elements from perpetrating terrorist acts and other focus of security threats, and likewise, to strictly ensure no overloading of passengers.

Police Regional Office (PRO) CALABARZON

- a. Enhanced police presence through foot and mobile patrols in areas frequented by the general public, such as malls, train tracks stations and other transport facilities and terminals (bus stations, airports, and seaports), cemeteries, churches, resorts and other areas vulnerable to terrorist hostile activities in coordination with other concerned law enforcement agencies, LGUs, and private security providers.
- b. Conducted information campaigns in coordination with LGUs for public safety awareness.
- c. Alerted Quick Response Teams to respond to any emergency cases.
- d. Coordinated with local electric companies in the area for advisories on the power shut-offs.
- e. Coordinated with community-based volunteers and other force multipliers to be deployed during the security operations to wear appropriate uniform or identification cards for security reasons.

Philippine Red Cross (PRC) Laguna and Rizal Chapters

- a. Updates to alert RDRRMOC.
- b. Provided prepositioned personnel on standby 24/7 to provide first aid and medical assistance to possible road accidents and other emergencies that may occur.

Philippine Information Agency (PIA) CALABARZON

Ensured timely and accurate dissemination of situation reports that will be the basis of government agencies involved in disaster response to act immediately in the rescue, relief and rehabilitation of the affected population.

Southern Luzon Command, AFP

- a. Directed all AFP units to coordinate with PNP counterparts for the conduct of Joint Target hardening to secure targeted facilities and establishments against threat and organized crime groups in order to ensure the security and safety of the general public at places of

convergence like cemeteries, transport terminal, malls, market, churches, and other places of worship.

- b. Conducted checkpoints in coordination with PNP to maximize the presence of government forces in critical areas.
- c. Provided motorist assistance in major thoroughfares and highways.
- d. Intensified intelligence effort.
- e. Maximized the utilization of K9 and EOD Units in the conduct of Explosives Detection at possible entry/exit points in urban centers and/or cities.

Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) Batangas

- a. Ensured passengers' security and safety while within port premises and on-board sea vessels through its destination of choice are all in place.
- b. Established a Public Assistance Desk.
- c. Operationalized the safety and security equipment.
- d. Conducted random inspection of transport vehicles.
- e. Implemented stricter security checks at port facilities.
- f. Conducted vehicle inspection and set manual frisking and inspection of carry-on bags and luggage in all PPA gates.

PDRRMCs Batangas, Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, and Quezon

- a. Placed the Operations Center on 24/7 monitoring.

3. RDRRMC MIMAROPA

OCD MIMAROPA

- a. Coordinated with response agency and monitoring of weather situation in area of responsibility.
- b. Ensured close coordination with response agencies and concerned LGUs regarding situation updates and the possible effects of TS "RAMIL".

Department of Science and Technology (DOST) MIMAROPA

- a. Provided update to LGUs and uploaded updates on Facebook page Thru DOST Provincial Science and Technology Center (PSTC).
- b. Ensured availability of Automatic Rain Gauges and Water Level Monitoring Station in MIMAROPA as source of data thru "Project NOAH" and "PREDICT" website.

DILG MIMAROPA

Disseminated advisories to all provincial offices.

DSWD MIMAROPA

- a. Activated all Provincial, City, and Municipal Quick Response Teams in MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations in its areas.
- b. Advised our P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities in its respective areas
- c. Conducted with OCD for any warning signal updates for monitoring purposes and response mechanism for areas that will be affected.
- d. Had available stockpile of 34,424 family food packs to all SWADT and Regional Warehouses including prepositioned goods in identified GIDA/critical areas.

BFP MIMAROPA

- a. Coordinated with LGUs NGOs and other government agencies to support the operational activities.
- b. Coordinated with Police Forces, Barangay Officials, Tanods, and Citizen Crime Watch to provide security to the evacuation centers.
- c. Alerted all BFP personnel for any disaster related response.
- d. Prepositioned all response assets.

DOH MIMAROPA

- a. Prepositioned water disinfectant and collapsible Jerry Cans in flood prone areas of MIMAROPA and Provincial DOH Office.
- b. Advised Quad-Cluster Teams (Health, NIE, MHPSS, WASH) to be on standby for deployment and augmentation of services.
- c. Advised Human Resource Management for Health to be available on its catchment areas to augment health services and establish health assistance desk once evacuation starts.
- d. Coordinated and actively monitored all Provincial DOH Office and Health Emergency Management Service Point Persons for any untoward incident.
- e. Coordinated with DOH retained hospitals and other attached agencies including entry and exit point.
- f. Coordinated with other Regional agencies including, PCG, PPA, RDRRMC, OCD, LGUs, PNP station and other stakeholders.
- g. Advised Provincial DOH Office to coordinate with the following:
 - i. Health Emergency Management Service-PHO for the health emergencies monitored.
 - ii. Ports Authority and advised nearby port health facilities to be on standby for possible health assistance in relation to the surge of passengers with medical assistance needed.
 - iii. Philippine National Police, Provincial and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices and other response groups in relation to the preparedness and response activities in relation to the event/s being monitored.
- h. Advised Provincial DOH Office to conduct roving to all areas of concern potential risk for mass casualty incident and evacuation.
- i. Coordinated with Provincial DOH Office and DOH Retained Hospital in relation to the inventory of all available drugs, medicines and medical supplies including vaccines and transportation assets.
- j. Coordinated with Human Resource Management for the inventory of Regional / Provincial DOH Office. warm bodies for the period of monitoring.
- k. Coordinated with General Services Unit for the inventory of transportation assets in the Regional Office, Provincial DOH Offices and DOH retained hospitals.
- l. Coordinated with Logistics Management Unit in relation to the availability of essential drugs/medicines and medical supplies.
- m. Coordinated with all Health Emergency Management Service Coordinators in the Provinces of MIMAROPA and advised to proactively coordinate with RO HERO OpCen for and submit daily situation updates.
- n. Coordinated with Philippine Air Force 505 Search and Rescue for the utilization of Air Medical Services in the Provinces of MIMAROPA as contingency for Air Medevac.

- o. Advised PAMAS Air Ambulance Services through the Provincial DOH-Palawan for possible utilization of air evacuation.
- p. Conducted inventory of available drugs and medicines in all Provincial DOH Offices, coordinated and prepared standby drugs and medicines with the support of Logistics Management Unit.
- q. Coordinated with RESU MIMAROPA and advised to send ESR updates and notifiable diseases.
- r. Coordinated with Health Promotion Unit MIMAROPA to disseminate and establish health information kiosk to areas of gathering.
- s. Advised Provincial DOH Offices to render duty at the PDRRMO Operation Center ensure seamless and effective multi agency coordination for the potential effects brought by STS in its respective catchment areas.

Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) MIMAROPA

- a. Alerted maintenance crew of the District Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Teams to monitor condition of National Roads and Bridges and other infrastructures facilities.
- b. Placed necessary equipment on standby and ready for mobilization.

CGD Southern Tagalog

- a. All Coast Guard stations and substations monitored weather forecast and advised to ensure strict implementation of Guidelines on the Movement of Vessels during Heavy Weather (HPCG Memo Circular 01-09) and in the absence of weather bulletin in the locality (HPCG Memo Circular 03-01).
- b. Placed deployable Response Groups (DRGs) and assets on standby status 24/7.
- c. Coordinated with LGUs and other government agencies.

- d. Directed lower units to undertake precautionary measures and other disaster preparedness activities.
