#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

##### **16 January 2017**

At 10:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated at 130 km West of Cotabato City, Maguindanao. This weather system along with the Tail-End of a Cold Front brought cloudy skies with moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over Palawan, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, and Northern Mindanao.

##### **17 January 2017**

At 11:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East Northeast of Zamboanga City has dissipated. Meanwhile, the Tail-End of a Cold Front continued to bring cloudy skies with moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over Visayas and the Regions of Northern Mindanao and CARAGA.



##### **18 January 2017**

At 11:00 AM, the effect of Tail-End of a Cold Front (TECF) over Visayas and Mindanao has weakened. However, cloudy skies with light to moderate rains and isolated thunderstorms continued to prevail over Visayas, Mindanao, and the province of Palawan.

##### **19 January 2017**

TECF affected the eastern section of Visayas and Mindanao while Northeast Monsoon affected Luzon.

Cloudy skies with moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms which may trigger flashfloods and landslides was experienced over the regions of Central Visayas, CARAGA, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula and the province of Southern Leyte.

##### **20 January 2017**

TECF affected the eastern section of Visayas while Northeast Monsoon affected Luzon.

Cloudy skies with moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms which may trigger flashfloods and landslides was experienced over the Region of Eastern Visayas. Moderate to strong winds blowing from the northeast prevailed over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.

### **21 January 2017**

TECF affected the Eastern section of Southern Luzon and of Visayas while Northeast monsoon affected Northern and Central Luzon.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Northeast prevailed over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.



### **22 January 2017**

Trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) affected Mindanao while Northeast Monsoon affected Northern and Central Luzon. Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Northeast was experienced over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.

### **23 January 2017**

TECF affected the Eastern Section of Southern Luzon while Northeast Monsoon continued to affect Northern and Central Luzon.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Northeast prevailed over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.



### **24 and 25 January 2017**

TECF affected the eastern section of Mindanao while Northeast Monsoon affected Luzon and Visayas.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Northeast was experienced over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.

### **26 January 2017**

Northeast monsoon affected the whole country.

Cloudy skies with light rains was experienced over Metro Manila, the Regions of Cagayan Valley, Ilocos, Cordillera, Central Luzon, Eastern Visayas, CARAGA, and the Province of Quezon and moderate over the Province of Aurora. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains prevailed over the rest of the country.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the Northeast was experienced over the entire archipelago with moderate to rough seas.

## **II. EFFECTS:**

### **A. Pre-emptive Evacuation (TAB A)**

A total of **17,366 families / 90,697 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in Regions VI, VII, IX, X, XI, CARAGA, and NIR.

## B. Affected Population (TAB B)

1. A total of **167,004 families / 809,356 persons** were affected in **916 barangays** in Regions VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, and ARMM due to the said weather disturbances.
2. Of which, a total of **17,436 families / 85,019 persons** were served inside and outside **170 Evacuation Centers (ECs)**.

## C. Casualties (TAB C)

**19 dead, 10 injured, and 2 missing persons** were reported in Regions VIII, IX, X, and CARAGA.

#### F. Damaged Houses (TAB E)

A total of **1,301 houses** were damaged in Regions VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA due to the weather disturbance. Of which, **662** were totally damaged and **639** were partially damaged.

#### G. Suspension of Classes and Work (TAB F)

- Classes in 62 Cities/Municipalities in Regions VI, VII, VIII, X, NIR, CARAGA, and ARMM were suspended from 16 to 25 January 2017 due to continuous rains and flooding.
- Work in the Provincial Capitol of Cebu was suspended on 16 January 2017 except those offices which provides emergency response services.
- Work in government offices in the Municipality of La Libertad, Negros Oriental was suspended.

#### H. Status of Lifelines

##### 2. Roads and Bridges (TAB G)

A total of **53 road sections** (34 national and 19 local), **5 national bridges and 1 spillway** were rendered impassable due to flooding and slides in Regions VI, VII, VIII, X,XI, and CARAGA.

#### I. Status of Ports

##### 1. SEAPORTS

All trips of sea vessels in San Carlos Port, San Carlos City, and Negros Occidental were cancelled on 16 January 2017 and resumed on 19 January 2017.

##### 2. AIRPORTS (TAB H)

**18 domestic flights were cancelled** on 16 and 18 to 23 January 2017 due to the bad weather. All flights were resumed on 24 January 2017.
