## **NDRRMC UPDATE**

### **Final Report re Effects of Magnitude 6.7 Earthquake in Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (10 February – 05 March 2017)**

#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

At 10:03 PM, 10 February 2017, Friday, a strong earthquake of magnitude 6.7 shook the island of Mindanao. The epicentre is located 16 km offshore northwest of Surigao City, Surigao Strait with a depth of 10 km. The earthquake was generated by the movement of Surigao segment of the Philippine Fault. Small-magnitude earthquakes followed afterwards, and as of 12:00 PM, 10 March 2017, 297 aftershocks were recorded by the DOST-PHIVOLCS seismic monitoring network.



Based on preliminary intensity reports, the strongest ground shaking was felt at PHIVOLCS Earthquake Intensity Scale (PEIS) VII (Destructive) in Surigao City. The municipalities of Pintuyan in Southern Leyte, and San Francisco and Malimono in Surigao del Norte experienced the ground shaking at PEIS VI (Very Strong), while the municipalities of Mainit and Placer in Surigao Del Norte, Libjo and San Jose in Dinagat Island, San Ricardo, Limasawa and San Francisco in Southern Leyte and Mandaue City felt the shaking at PEIS V (Strong). This earthquake was felt PEIS IV to I as far as 250 km away (Butuan City, Ormoc City, Tacloban City, Catbalogan City, Bislig City, Cebu City, Cagayan De Oro City, Dumaguete City and Tagbilaran City) from the epicentral area. The strong ground shaking near the epicentral area resulted to damages to some buildings, roads and bridges.

On 05 March 2017, 8:08 AM, an earthquake was felt in Surigao City. PHIVOLCS reported the occurrence of a magnitude 5.9 tectonic earthquake at 9.77°N, 125.38°E – 12 km S 80°W of Surigao City with a depth of focus of 10 km. The seismic event was an aftershock of the magnitude 6.7 earthquake on the 10 February 2017.

Reported intensities were as follows:

- Intensity VI in Surigao City
- Intensity V in San Jose, Basilisa, and Cagdianao, Dinagat Islands; Malimono, Surigao del Norte
- Intensity IV in Limasawa and San Ricardo, Southern Leyte; Alegria and Mainit, Surigao del Norte; Libjo, Dinagat Islands; Alegria and Jabonga, Agusan del Norte; Butuan City
- Intensity III in San Juan and San Francisco, Southern Leyte; Claver, Surigao del Norte; Remedios T. Romualdez, Agusan del Norte; Gingoog City
- Intensity II in General Luna, Surigao del Norte; Ormoc City; Cagayan de Oro City

## II. EFFECTS

### A. Affected Population

A total of **10,947 families** or **54,735 persons** were affected in **91 barangays** in Region CARAGA:

### B. Casualties (TAB A)

A total of **8 persons** were reported dead and **249 persons** sustained injuries due to the 6.7 earthquake and 5.9 magnitude aftershock respectively, 189 was treated/admitted at the CARAGA Regional Hospital.

### C. Damages

A total of **10,873 damaged houses** were reported in CARAGA of which, **522 were totally damaged while 10,351 are partially damaged**. A magnitude 5.9 earthquake, which is an aftershock of the magnitude 6.7 earthquake, took place on 05 March 2017, 8:08 AM. This resulted to some partially-damaged houses to be totally-damaged, and further increased the number of damaged houses.

## 1. Damaged Facilities and Infrastructures (TAB B)

### Schools

- A total of **47 school facilities** incurred damages due to the earthquake in the Province of Surigao del Norte.

### Other facilities

- Damaged Infrastructures (roads, bridges, other infrastructure) were reported in the provinces of Surigao del Norte and Dinagat Islands due to the earthquake.



- After the occurrence of the 5.9 magnitude aftershock on 5 March, additional damages to some buildings in Surigao City were reported as follows:
  - (1) Provincial Sports Complex - back portion collapsed; needs immediate repair
  - (2) Gaisano Capital Mall - collapsed portion

## D. Status of Lifelines

### 1. Roads and Bridges

- A total of **5 national road sections** and **6 bridges (5 national and 1 provincial)** incurred damages in the province of Surigao del Norte due to the earthquake.

### 2. Power

#### 12 February 2017

- At 8:00 AM, about 92.41% was already re-energized.
- About 90% of GM SURNECO coverage area was energized.
- At 4:46 PM, Butuan-Placer 138 kV line was fully energized at 4:46 PM.
- A total of 16 out of 211 barangays covered by SURNECO's franchise in Surigao City were not energized affecting a total of 4,000 households out of 74,000 connections.

#### 14 February 2017

- Electricity in the municipalities of San Francisco, Malimono and Surigao City, Surigao del Norte was restored.

#### 15 February 2017

- Power was fully restored in all 12 municipalities / city and 76,805 households covered by SURNECO.

#### 05 March 2017

- On 05 March 2017, power outage was experienced in Surigao City, however, power was restored at 1:00 PM of the same day.

### 3. Water

- Surigao Metropolitan Water District conducted an emergency meeting and created 10 working teams assigned to affected areas to gather, assess, and recommend restoration of water supply.



## **E. Status of Ports**

### **1. Airports**

- Cebu Pacific and Philippine Airlines flights bound for Surigao City Domestic Airport were suspended indefinitely effective 11 February 2017 due to damaged runway.

### **2. Seaports**

- All vessels as well as port operations in Lipata Port Station were transferred to Surigao City Port due to damaged and non-passable bridges and national highways.

## **F. Suspension of Classes and Work**

- Classes in all levels in Surigao City were suspended including work in heavily-damaged buildings.
- Surigao City also ordered the temporary closure of high-rise business establishments to ensure the safety of the people.
- Work resumed in offices/buildings which were declared safe to occupy.
- Classes in Surigao City were resumed effective 20 February 2017.
- PDRRMC Proclamation No. 4 suspended classes on 06 March 2017 in all levels, both in public and private schools in Surigao City, San Francisco, Malimono, Taganaan, Sison and Mainit to allow school administrators to assess the status of buildings. Mayors/Chairpersons of C/MDRRMCs were ordered to assess the situation in their areas of responsibility and were authorized to resume classes if conditions warrant safety.

## **G. Declaration of State of Calamity**

- On 11 February 2017, Surigao City of the Province of Surigao del Norte was placed under State of Calamity through Resolution Number 23-2017.
- On 13 February 2017, the entire Province of Surigao del Norte was placed under State of Calamity through Resolution Number 35 series of 2017.

## **III. Disaster Response**

### **NDRRM Operations Center**

- Disseminated the earthquake information to OCDRO CARAGA and concerned stakeholders through facsimile, SMS, website, and twitter accounts for further dissemination to its respective local DRRMCs. Moreover, was advised to undertake initiative/response actions and to continuously monitor the situation for any effects of said earthquake particularly in areas with reported intensities.
- Conducted an Emergency Meeting on the effects of the Ms 6.7 earthquake at the NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC) with representatives from different member agencies on 11 February 2017, 10:00 AM and were joined by OCD/RDRRMCs CARAGA and VIII via Skype video conferencing.
- Raised Alert Status to Red effective 11 February 2017, 5:00 PM.
- The NDRRMC Executive Director and OCD Administrator with the Civil Defense Operations Service Chief conducted field visits in the earthquake affected areas in the Province of Surigao del Norte and provided guidance to the Surigao City Incident Management Team.

### **DOST-Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS)**

- Sent Earthquake Information No. 1, 2, 3, and 4 and closely monitored the situation and any new significant development of which, were immediately relayed to all concerned.

- On 11 February 2017, DOST PHIVOLCS-DYNASLOPE raised alert level 1 over Oslao, San Francisco to warn residents who were at risk to possible landslide.

#### **DENR-Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)**

- Conducted assessment on the damages due to the earthquake.
- Dispatched 3 teams of geologists to the field.
- Placed teams from mining companies on standby.
- MGB CARAGA advised mining companies to submit update on the status of respective mine and immediate communities for possible assistance.

#### **Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)**

- The DSWD-DREAMB's Alert Status was raised to RED on 11 February 2017, 5:00 PM.
- Dignity kits for pregnant and lactating mothers were available and on standby.
- A team from DReAMB conducted an ocular inspection and provided technical assistance to FO CARAGA in the conduct of disaster operation on 18 February 2017, 2:00 PM.
- Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) continuously coordinated with DSWD-FO CARAGA, for updating of regional situation, response operations and significant reports on the provision of assistance to the affected individuals and their families.

#### **DSWD CARAGA**

- A total of 3,900 FFPs worth ₱1,324,611.00 are ready for distribution to affected families in Surigao City

- Manned the disaster operation of the Field Office at Surigao City and assisted the fields staff in the conduct of rapid assessment in the municipalities that were affected by the strong earthquake.
- Field Offices' Disaster Response Assistance and Management Unit (DReAMU) communicated with the SWAD Teams, and Provincial/City/Municipal Action Teams to continue monitoring the situation in close coordination with the LSWDOs and LDRRMOs thereby to provide the Central Office with more updates.
- Conducted psychosocial support in Malimono, San Francisco and Surigao City, Surigao Del Norte.
- DSWD DreAMB continued to coordinate with DSWD-FO CARAGA for significant updates on disaster response operations in Surigao City.

#### **Department of Energy (DOE)**

- Monitored the power situation and constantly remind the public re Safety Measures.

#### **RDRRMC CARAGA**

- Raised Alert status to Red and monitored the effects of the earthquake particularly in Surigao City and the Province of Surigao del Norte.

- Coordinated with DOH and RESPOND, Inc. and provided drinking water to the emergency responders in Surigao City.
- Police Regional Office (PRO) CARAGA, provincial, city/municipal stations conducted on-site assessment on the effects of the earthquake.
- Philippine Information Agency (PIA) CARAGA disseminated advisories and updates and provided assistance to media for Surigao City and Surigao del Norte Official's interview.
- OCD CARAGA attended the Presidential Visit and Special Cabinet Meeting at Surigao City Gym on 12 February 2017.
- Conducted ocular inspection in the areas affected by earthquake in Surigao del Norte.
- OCD together with DSWD, DOH, PRC, PNP, and PA received and unloaded the humanitarian relief assistance from the AFP C-130 to be provided to the earthquake affected areas in Surigao del Norte.
- Distributed 54 pcs of tents to the affected families in Barangay San Juan, Surigao City, Surigao del Norte.
- Conducted field visit in the earthquake affected areas in the Province of Surigao del Norte.
- Visited the Surigao City Incident Command Post (ICP) and gave guidance to the City Incident Management Team.
- Presented the update on the Effects of 6.7 Magnitude Earthquake in Surigao del Norte during the Interagency Meeting for Rehabilitation Planning.
- Deployed PDNA teams composed of RDRRMC member-agencies, representing the OCD, DILG DPWH, DSWD, DA, DOST, DOH, DepEd, and NEDA.

#### **RDRRMC – City IMT**

- Conducted structural integrity assessment of the affected areas.
- Conducted relief operations to affected areas in the city.
- Conducted of Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (DANA).
- Provided water supply for sanitation and potable water to affected areas.
- Coordinated the distribution of SDA relief goods.
- Monitored the 2 mobile water purifier which were installed in Brgy. Taft and Washington, Surigao City.

#### **PDRRMC Surigao del Norte**

- Disseminated No Tsunami Threat Advisory.
- Coordinated with concerned agencies such as OCD, DSWD, DOH, DILG, PNP, Philippine Army, and CDRRMC Surigao City for emergency response activities.
- Convened a meeting on 11 February 2017, 10:00 AM at the PDRRMO Conference Room to discuss, assess, and recommend immediate and appropriate actions to respond to the needs of the affected families.
- On 13 February 2017, PDRRMC Chairperson activated the PDRRMC Incident Command System to effectively manage response and emergency operations.
- Conducted on-site assessment at the municipalities of Malimono, San Francisco, Mainit, and Sison.
- Deployed emergency responders in the affected areas.
- Coordinated with the Rapid Emergency Assistance on Communications Team (REACT) Surigao del Norte Group, for possible emergency response.
- PDRRMC of Surigao del Norte and CDRRMC of Surigao City provided the needs of victims.
- Dispatched 4 RDANA Teams at the following areas:

Team 2 - Surigao City West (including hospitals and airport)

## C. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) and IDP Protection

### 1. DSWD

- Field Office CARAGA received and distributed solar lamps, blankets, mosquito nets, and dignity kits to the affected families who stayed in open areas near their homes.
- DSWD Central Office DREAMB advised DSWD FO XIII (CARAGA) to immediately identify open areas for possible establishment of tent city in order to protect the internally displaced persons (IDPs) affected by the earthquake.
- Distributed dignity kits for pregnant and lactating mother provided by United Nations Population Fund (UNPF).
- Activated OPLAN LINO (Lindol) or the “Lingap para sa mga Nasalanta ng Lindol.”

## **2. Philippine Red Cross (PRC)**

- Deployed 2 camp management trained personnel with tents on board C130 to Surigao City on 13 February 2017, 7:00 PM.

## **3. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)**

- Assisted in the relief operations of R/P/M/CDRRMCs.

## **4. Armed Forces of the Philippines**

- 35th Infantry Battalion Philippine Army assisted in the relief operations of R/P/CDRRMs.

# **D. Logistics Cluster**

## **1. Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP)**

- Coordinated with DOH for the inclusion of four (4) standby medical teams from the Philippine Airforce, Philippine Navy, and PAF DRTU Team.
- Facilitated the airlift of the DSWD relief goods going to Butuan City on 12 February 2017, 5:00 AM via C130.

- 402<sup>nd</sup> Brigade provided manpower and mobility assistance in the conduct of Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR).

## **2. OCD**

- Coordinated with AFP OJ3 for the accommodation of DSWD relief goods at PAF C130 on 12 - 14 February 2017.
- Facilitated the request for aircraft for transportation of various goods and personnel of DOH and DSWD, including CAMPOLAS kit (composed of Cotrimoxazole, Amoxicillin, Mefenamic Acid, Paracetamol, ORS, Lagundi, Vit A, and skin ointment), family kit, jerry cans, hygiene kit, family tent, mobile kitchen, laminated sacks, high energy biscuits, family tent, brown rice bar, and plastic mat.
- Coordinated and facilitated the request for M35 trucks and personnel to assist in the transport of the DSWD food and non-food items from Butuan Airport to Surigao.
- Facilitated the transport via C130 of 2 units water filtration equipment from SnS Enterprises.

## **3. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)**

- Installed warning signs and deployed personnel and equipment to conduct clearing operations and placement of filling materials on bridge approaches.

#### **4. DPWH CARAGA**

- Deployed RDANA team to conduct initial assessment on damaged buildings, roads and bridges.

- Provided security to damaged structures and conducted “rekorida” to the affected population.
- Deployed a total of 169 personnel to conduct disaster operations and provide assistance in Surigao City.

- Provided transportation service for response operations of OCD-CARAGA.

Of which, DOH Central Office logistics support amounted to ₱2,339,430.32 consisting of drugs and medicines (CAMPOLAS kits), 712 First Aid kits, 500 hygiene kits, 500 jerry cans, and 2 drums of Hypochlorite Wichlor.
- As of 19 February 2017, additional augmentation of assorted drugs and medicines worth ₱451,270.00 was provided to Surigao City. A total of ₱3,410,392.80 worth of logistics were provided by the DOH Central Office and Region XIII (CARAGA).
- Coordination were made with the following:
  - a. Health Managers of Regions VII, VIII, X, XIII, and NIR.
  - b. Philippine Red Cross for provision of water treatment unit to the affected hospitals.
  - c. Health Facility Development Bureau Structural Engineers re conduct of cost estimate of damaged health facilities in the affected areas.
  - d. PDRRMC Dinagat Islands to augment Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) Team.
  - e. DOH Region X for NNMC referral of cases for MAP assistance and WASH concerns.
- Deployed health personnel/teams as follows:
  - a. A 10-man medical/public health team from CARAGA Regional Office to provide initial logistical needs to CARAGA Regional Hospital.
  - b. Composite teams of 9 nurses on WASH and surveillance from Regional Office X to provide technical assistance to Surigao.
  - c. Additional MHPSS and WASH teams to Surigao City.
  - d. MHPSS teams from DOH-CO, DOH Regional Office VII and VIII were deployed in Butuan while MHPSS team from RO VIII in Surigao City.
- Deployed a total of 41 teams from DOH Central Office, DOH CARAGA, DOH RO XI, DOH RO VIII, DOH RO VII, Drug Treatment and Rehabilitation Center (DTRC) Region XIII, LGU Agusan del Norte, Dinagat Island, DepEd Region XIII, and Philippine Red Cross in Surigao del Norte. The team consisted of 4 public health/assessment teams, 18 medical, 4 WASH, and 15 MHPSS teams.
- Conducted Rapid Health Assessment in Surigao City to assess the needs and structural damage on health facilities brought about by the earthquake.
- Provided psychosocial services to a total of 109 patients in CRH.

- Sub-allotted the amount of ₱10,000,000.00 to the CARAGA Regional Hospital to support the treatment and management of the casualties of the earthquake.

## **2. DOH CARAGA**

- Coordinated with CARAGA Regional Hospital Operations Center.
- CARAGA Regional Hospital raised Code Blue Alert Status.
- Provided a total of ₱429,760.00 worth of logistics consisting of 230 water containers with drinking water, 5 family tents, assorted drugs and medicines, 1 portable generator, 20 cot beds, 30 liters of gasoline and additional jerry cans and hygiene kits.
- Provided 200 pcs water containers/jerry cans for CARAGA Regional Hospital (CRH) and other responding agencies.
- Coordination were made with the following:

  - c. Emergency response teams conducted rapid assessment and delivered additional logistics.
  - d. Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) Team to Surigao City on 14 February 2017.
- Conducted coordination meeting with DOH RO X Mental Health Psychosocial Services Team.
- Conducted Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) in the Municipalities of Malimono and Sison.
- Provided Psychosocial Services to 109 patients in CARAGA Regional Hospital.
- Conducted WASH assessment in Barangays Ipil and Mabua in Surigao City on 13 February 2017.
- Provided psycho-social support intervention to the affected population
- Health Cluster conducted Diseases Surveillance at City Hospitals and City Main and District Health Centers.
- Wash Cluster coordinated with CDRRMC regarding status of water rationing and supply in the different Barangays of Surigao City.
- Conducted onsite monitoring and reassessment at Sitio Aton, Brgy. Ipil, San Francisco, Surigao del Norte regarding the reported displacement of some families setting temporary tents.

## **3. DOH Region X**

- Deployed 22 WASH teams and Surveillance personnel with water treatment unit.
- Assisted the MHPSS teams deployed in Surigao City.
- Assisted in the data collection of the Operations Center in Surigao City.
- Assisted the Emergency Operations Center and Disease Surveillance Section of the CRH –Emergency Room.

- Conducted RHA of earthquake-affected areas in Surigao City.
- Regional Office X Medical Team assisted in the emergency operations and disease surveillance at CRH.
- Evaluated water source of Sitio Bioborjan, Brgy. Rizal for the water treatment mobile unit.

#### **4. DOH Region VIII**

- Public Health, MHPSS, and WASH teams are on standby and ready for deployment when needed.
- Deployed a 5-man team to provide psychological assessment to the affected individuals in Surigao City.

#### **5. Philippine Red Cross (PRC)**

- Provided first aid management to the injured persons.
- Assisted the regional hospital in transferring of patients.
- Deployed 2 water tanker with 10,000-liter capacity from Zamboanga City, 2 water filtration/treatment units, 2 onion tanks, and 6 water bladders together with personnel from Tacloban City stationed at CRH, and 4 generator sets in Surigao City.
- Deployed a total of 4 ambulance teams.
- Placed 2 ambulance teams from Agusan del Norte and Agusan del Sur Chapters which arrived in Surigao City on 12 February 2017 and were on standby for referrals at the Capitol Compound and City Hall.
- Deployed 2 Assessment Teams, 2 Ambulance Teams, 2 WASH Teams to Surigao City.
- PRC Surigao del Norte provided psychosocial support intervention to the affected population.
- Provided tents for the people who stayed at the Provincial Capitol of Surigao del Norte.

#### **6. MGB CARAGA**

- Provided 2 ambulances with nurses to transport victims needing referrals.

#### **7. Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA)**

- Deployed 5 water filtration equipment in Surigao City and augmented water system restoration team.

### **F. Education Cluster**

#### **1. Department of Education (DepEd)**

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA to send reports on schools that were used as evacuation centers.
- Activated Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA to monitor the damages reported by the various schools.
- Disseminated advisory on the submission of Rapid Assessment of Damages Report via Infoboard text blast.
- Standby funds were made available for setting-up Temporary Learning Spaces and support for school clean-up and minor repairs.
- Created learning, teaching, and book library kits and were made available and on standby through the support of UNICEF.
- Activated #SchoolPatrolPH in order to engage the general public in collecting pictures of damaged schools through social media in coordination with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators.



- Conducted structural assessment of public and private schools by the DepEd Engineers of CARAGA.
- Conducted Psychosocial First Aid (PFA) and Alternative Delivery Mode (ADM) training in the affected areas of DepEd CARAGA.

## **G. Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC)**

### **1. OCD**

- Activated the Emergency Telecommunication Cluster effective February 2017, 5:00 PM and placed the Satellite Phone System at the Regional Offices on standby alert. 11
- Deployed ETC to Surigao City and provided link ad updates to the National Response Cluster.

### **2. SMART**

- Provided Libreng Charging and Libreng Tawag Station at Philcom Surigao, Narciso St., Surigao City, Surigao del Norte.
- Smart Store and Sun Shop located in damaged commercial buildings were transferred to temporary locations to continuously provide service to subscribers.

- Conducted restoration of the affected sites of GLOBE Telecom by Mindanao Field Operations Team.
- Made sure that 36 cell sites in Surigao del Norte and all 8 cell sites in Dinagat Islands are operational.

- Deployed Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) in CARAGA Region.
