#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

### 05 June 2018

At 11:00 AM, the Low-Pressure Area east of Mindanao has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "DOMENG."

At 3:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression "DOMENG" was estimated, based on all available data, at 690 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (9.8 °N, 131.9 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 60 km/h.

At 10:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression "DOMENG" was estimated, based on all available data at 670 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.6 °N, 131.8 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 60 km/h.

#### 06 June 2018

At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "DOMENG" was estimated based on all available data at 805 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.2 °N, 132.0 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 60 kph. Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.

#### II. EFFECTS

#### A. Incident Monitored

 A flashflood incident occurred on 05 June 2018 in Purok 6, Brgy. Hanagdong and Purok 3, Brgy. Tinago, Malimono, Surigao del Norte caused by river overflow due to heavy rains brought by TD "DOMENG". Ten (10) households and barangay roads were reportedly affected. At 4:00 PM, 05 June 2018, the Provincial Engineering Office of Surigao del Norte conducted removal of debris and clean-up operations along the riverbed and affected areas. Affected roads are now passable to all types of vehicles.

### **B. Suspension of Classes**

#### III. DISASTER PREPAREDNES AND RESPONSE

# A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

# 1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Extended Core Group Meeting for TD "DOMENG" on 04 June 2018 and 06 June 2018.
- b. Issued NDRRMC Memorandum requiring RDRRMCs/OCDROs II, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VII, VIII, XI, and CARAGA to raise their respective alert status to BLUE effective 5:00 PM, 04 June 2018.
- c. Continuous monitoring and dissemination of weather advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warning, and other advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).

# 2. DOST-Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

a. Continuously monitors the situation and ensures the provision of Weather Advisories, Severe Weather Bulletins, and 24-hour Public Weather Forecast to all stakeholders.

# 3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

a. The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱1,155,540,517.90 with breakdown as follows:

#### Standby Funds

A total of **P207,223,921.85** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **P165,181,069.00** is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

### Stockpiles

A total of **485,636** Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to **₱169,742,460.28** and available Food and Non-food Items (FNIs) amounting to **₱778,574,135.77**.

# 4. Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)

 Issued MGB's list of Barangays Susceptible to floodings and landslides on 6 June 2018.

# 5. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- a. Provided constant information/advisories/weather forecasts to all concerned DILG ROs regarding TD DOMENG thru emails and sms.
- b. Provided constant updates on weather alerts/advisories to all ROs.
- c. Instructed all concerned DILG ROs to take proactive measures.
- d. Advised all DILG DRR-CCA Regional Focal Persons on PAGASA updates re Tropical Depression "DOMENG".

# B. Regional / Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)

RDRRMCs VII and CARAGA continuously disseminates weather advisories to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through SMS, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty; alerted and closely coordinates with all PDRRMCs and RDRRMC member-agencies for possible rescue, relief, and other response operations relative to the weather disturbance; and continuously monitors the situation in their respective AORs.

- a. On BLUE ALERT status effective 05 June 2018.
- b. Coordinated with Coast Guard District Central Visayas and DSWD FO VII for the status and updates of actions taken.

# Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) VII

a. Activated District Disaster and Risk Management Team, for possible damages that may affect the area of jurisdiction.

# Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- a. Conducted PDRA with the majority of LGUs.
- b. Coordinated with the LDRRMOs re prepositioning of assets/resources.

#### PDRRMC Cebu

- a. Monitored weather updates re Low Pressure Area (LPA).
- b. PDRRMOC-CEBU is on BLUE ALERT status effective 5 June 2018.

- Has stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱ 19,683,824,34.

- c. Visibility of fire trucks in identified flood prone areas.
- d. Activated Brgy. Emergency Response Services.
- e. Intensive monitoring of identified flood prone areas.

#### Philippine National Police (PNP)

 Alerted SRR teams and placed manpower and equipment on standby due to heightened alert.

#### Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)

a. Issued public warnings regarding the track of TD "DOMENG".

#### Philippine Information Agency (PIA)

a. Disseminated advisories thru traditional, digital, and social media.

#### Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- a. Has available standby funds amounting to ₱3,000,000.00 and a total of 15,715 Family Food Packs ready for augmentation.
- b. Placed Disaster Response Teams (DRTs) and Quick Response Teams (QRTs) ready for deployment.
- c. Alerted all SWAD teams and advised to closely coordinate with Local DRRMOs.
- d. Alerted all QRT members for 24/7 operations.

# Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

a. Cascaded advisories to the provincial and municipal offices.

#### Department of Health (DOH)

- a. Prepositioned provincial buffer stock amounting to ₱1,884,196.61 and DOH Office buffer stock of ₱2,883,354.37
- b. Prepared available transport vehicle.
- c. Established composite teams with pre-identified members on standby.

d. Implemented HEM Information Management System at CHO, PHO and PDO HEM.

# PDRRMC Biliran
