I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

07 June 2018

At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "DOMENG" was estimated based on all available data at 615 km Northeast of Borongan City, Eastern Samar, with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph. It is forecast to move West at 15 kph.

The combined effects of the Tropical Depression and the Monsoon Trough will bring moderate to occasional heavy rains over Bicol Region and the western sections of MIMAROPA and Visayas regions today.

While landfall is less likely to occur, "DOMENG" could enhance the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat), which will result in moderate to heavy monsoon rains over Western Visayas and the western sections of CALABARZON and MIMAROPA beginning Friday, with the northward progression of monsoon rains, towards Metro Manila and the rest of the western section of Luzon during the weekend.

RDRRMCs VII, VIII, and CARAGA continuously disseminates weather advisories to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through SMS, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty; alerted and closely coordinates with all PDRRMCs and RDRRMC member-agencies for possible rescue, relief, and other response operations relative to the weather disturbance; and continuously monitors the situation in their respective AORs.
