I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

14 June 2018

At 11:00 AM, Southwest Monsoon (HABAGAT) will continue to bring monsoon rains over Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Batanes, Babuyan Group of Islands, Zambales, Bataan, Tarlac, Pampanga, Bulacan, Cavite and Batangas.

A Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) was estimated, based on all available data, at 385 km West Northwest of Basco, Batanes (21.9 °N, 118.6 °E). While it has no direct effect on any part of the country as of the moment, it is expected to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) today. Furthermore, this weather disturbance may develop into a Tropical Depression in the next 24 hours.

Meanwhile, another LPA estimated at 690 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (6.5 °N, 132.3 °E) will bring cloudy skies with light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Caraga and Davao Region. However, this weather system is less likely to become a Tropical Depression in the next 24 hours.

II. EFFECTS

A. Incident Monitored (TAB A)

1. **Twelve (12) incidents** (collapsed riprap, flashflood, overflowed spillway, air mishap, uprooted trees, drowning **and collapsed structure**) were monitored in CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, CARAGA, NCR and **CAR**. Three (3) dead and one (1) injured were reported during these incidents.

B. Affected Population

1. **As of 8:00 AM, 14 June 2018, a total of 32 families / 132 persons were affected in Region III.** Of which, **22 families/ 93 persons** affected in San Fernando City Pampanga are staying with relatives. **While 10 families / 39 persons affected in**

Sta. Cruz, Zambales are staying in Malibago Elementary School, Sta Cruz, Zambales.

C. Casualties

DEAD - 1

1. A certain **Algemon Dalisam Nuñez**, Male, 27 years old, resident of Brgy. Corong-Corong, El Nido, Palawan, staff of Orange Pearl Resort, went missing after he fell into the sea when his jetski toppled due to strong current. Orange Pearl Resort personnel, Philippine Coast Guard El Nido and Municipal Police Station (MPS) El Nido immediately conducted Search and Rescue Operations. At 7:40 PM, 08 June 2018, an African national saw a lifeless body lying at the seashore in Brgy. Corong-Corong, El Nido, Palawan. This was immediately reported to the staff of Buko Beach (nearest resort), who informed El Nido MPS. Subsequently, the cadaver found at the seashore was positively identified by the staff of Orange Pearl Resort and family of the deceased as Algemon Dalisam Nuñez. The victim reportedly died from drowning when he fell from a jet ski at the sea.

D. Damaged Houses

1. A total of **16 houses** were damaged in San Fernando, Pampanga. Of which, **6 were totally** and **10 were partially** damaged.

E. Suspension of Classes (TAB B)

1. **A total of ninety-one (91) municipalities/cities suspended classes** in **CAR, NCR, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Regions VIII, III and I** due to southwest monsoon enhanced by TS "DOMENG". **As of 13 June 2018, classes in five (5) municipalities in Occidental Mindoro (MIMAROPA) has resumed.**

F. Flooded Areas (TAB C)

1. **Forty-eight (48) barangays** and **six (6) areas (streets)** were reported flooded in NCR and CALABARZON. Of which, floodwaters in **forty-three (43) barangays and six (6) areas** have already subsided.

G. Status of Lifelines POWER

1. **Vigan City, Ilocos Sur (Region I) experienced power interruption on 13 June 2018, 6:15 PM.**

A. Pre-emptive Evacuation

1. A total of **17 families / 73 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in CALABARZON due to possible flooding and landslide.

B. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Extended Core Group Meeting for TD "DOMENG" on 04 June 2018 and 06 June 2018.
- b. Issued NDRRMC Memorandum requiring RDRRMCs/OCDROs II, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VII, VIII, XI, and CARAGA to raise their respective alert status to BLUE effective 5:00 PM, 04 June 2018.
- c.
