UPDATE ON THE NDRRMC MEMO NO. 26 s. 2021 RE "REVIEW AND ENHANCEMENT OF THE NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE PLANS (NDRPs)"

In reference to NDRRMC Memorandum No. 26, s. 2021, with the subject: Review and Enhancement of the National Disaster Response Plans (NDRPs), all key players, NDRRMC members, NDRRMC-acknowledged partners and Regional DRRMCs involved in disaster response operations were requested to provide inputs and recommendations on the current three (3) NDRPs developed by the NDRRMC in 2018 covering: 1.) Hydro-meteorological hazards 2.) Earthquake and Tsunami and 3.) Consequence Management for Terrorism-related Incidents. The review and enhancement were initiated in consideration of the experiences and developments in disaster management environment, as well as the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

On May 14 and May 25, 2021, the Core Group for the review and enhancement of NDRPs composed of technical staff from the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) conducted two (2) virtual meetings/workshops to assess the submitted inputs and recommendations. Based on the submissions, the TWG identified the following list of items that need further review and vetting from the concerned agency:
