I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

An earthquake with **Magnitude of 6.5** occurred in **San Julian, Eastern Samar** with details as follows:

As of **01 May 2019, 5:00 AM**, a total of **614 aftershocks** were recorded of which, **261** were plotted and **4** felt, ranging from Magnitude **1.5 to 5.5**.

III. DISASTER RESPONSE

A. NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

1. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- NDRRMOC maintained its BLUE alert status which was raised on 22 April 2019, 7:00 AM for continuous monitoring and coordination with member-agencies.
- Disseminated Earthquake Information Nos. 1, 2, and 3 to OCD Regional Offices concerned and other stakeholders through facsimile, SMS, website, and twitter account for further dissemination to its respective local DRRMCs. Moreover, advised ROs to undertake precautionary measures and to monitor the situation for any possible effects of said earthquake particularly in areas with reported intensities.
- Prepared the Emergency Alert and Warning Message (EAWM) for dissemination by Telecommunications Companies (TELCOs) to the affected areas.

2. DOST-Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS)

- Disseminated Earthquake Information Nos. 1, 2, and 3.

- b. Monitored significant earthquake activity/development.

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FO), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) ensured stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱2,234,150,833.96** with breakdown as follows:

- **Stockpiles**

A total of **348,925 Family Food Packs (FFPs)** amounting to **₱133,782,569.36** and available **Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱762,853,229.19**.

- **Standby Funds**
