#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

New Year's Day is one of the important celebrations in the Philippines. It is the time of the year Filipino families get together and welcome a brand new year with the hope of an even better year.

The celebration highlights the fireworks display and loud noise to drive away evil spirits and partake of the first midnight meal or Media Noche.

#### **II. EFFECTS**

##### **A. Incidents Monitored (TAB A)**

A total of **207 incidents** were monitored covering the period of 31 December 2018 – 02 January 2019:

- Fireworks – 200
- Fire-related incidents – 3
- Vehicular Accident – 3
- Shooting Incident – 1

##### **B. Casualties (TAB B)**

A total of **three (3)** dead and **210** injured persons were reported during the Holiday Celebration:

## **IV. PREPAREDNESS MEASURES AND RESPONSE**

### **A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council**

#### **1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)**

NDRRM Operations Center was raised its alert status into BLUE Alert for continuous monitoring and coordination of all efforts relative to the Observance of the New Year's Eve Celebration 2018 and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warnings, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).

#### **2. Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA)**

Provided weather advisories, bulletins, flood advisories, and gale warnings.

#### **3. Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)**

Conducted inspection to a total of 475 vessels and 1,404 motorbancas in different ports nationwide.

### **B. Regional / Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)**

RDRRMCs disseminated weather advisories to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD Short Messaging System, email, facsimile, and uploaded the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty; alerted and closely coordinated with all PDRRMCs and RDRRMC member-agencies for possible rescue, relief, and other response operations relative to the weather disturbance; and monitored the situation in their respective AORs.

#### **1. REGION I**

##### **Office of Civil Defense (OCD) I**

Disseminated RDRRMC I Memorandum re Raising Blue Alert Status for Holiday Season 2018.

##### **Department of Health (DOH) I**

- a. Monitored fireworks and firecracker-related injuries and other health-related events in coordination with RDRRMC Emergency Operations Center (EOC).
- b. The four (4) Provincial DOH Office Operations Center coordinated with their respective DRRMOs and other concerned Regional Agencies.
- c. Submitted gathered data and final reports to the Regional Operations Center.
- d. The three (3) DOH Hospitals (Mariano Marcos Hospital and Medical Center in Batac City, Ilocos Norte; Ilocos Training and Regional Medical Center in San Fernando City, La Union; and Region I Medical Center in Dagupan City, Pangasinan) were on 24-hour duty.

### **Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) I**

- a. Deployed Personnel and Maintenance Staff and Crew in their designated/respective Motorist Assistance Centers strategically located region-wide to assist motorist and traveling public.
- b. Prepositioned Quick Response Equipments (QREs) for any eventualities.

### **Department of Education (DepEd) I**

Issued Regional Memorandum No. 207, s. 2018 re: Preparedness Measures for the Holiday Season.

### **PDRRMC Pangasinan**

- a. Placed on Blue Alert Status effective 21 December 2018 in compliance with RDRRMC Memorandum.
- b. Alerted Cities and Municipalities to monitor the situation in their respective areas of responsibility.
- c. Implemented information dissemination on preparedness and advisories through Tri-Media and social media accounts to ensure public safety.
- d. Informed DRRMO/Cs to implement their prepared measures and to undertake all precautionary measures and be ready with their Rescue and Emergency Response Units whenever necessary especially when tensions erupt resultant to the "Oplan Kapaskuhan 2018".
- e. Monitored beachgoers at the Lingayen Beach for possible influx especially that Gale Warning was in effect in the Province of Pangasinan.
- f. Established incident command post and advance medical post located at the beachfront.

### **CDRRMC Alaminos City, Pangasinan**

- a. Placed CDRRMC thru its Response Cluster (A.R.T./WASAR, member agencies) with their equipment and equipage on standby for possible deployment in case the need arises.
- b. Strategically placed first aid stations manned by trained personnel in areas anticipated to be flocked by tourists.
- c. Established Tourist Assistance desk.
- d. Dispatched roving teams to monitor overall situation within the AOR.

### **MDRRMC Sta. Barbara, Pangasinan**

- a. Coordinated with BDRRMC, PNP, and BFP related to holiday season activities.
- b. Alerted personnel for possible response operations.
- c. Monitored weather through PAGASA, NDRRMC, PDRRMO, Project NOAH, and DILG CODIX.
- d. Alerted all volunteers and WASAR Teams.

### **CDRRMC Dagupan City, Pangasinan**

- a. Placed CDRRMO Emergency Response Teams on Blue Alert Status.
- b. Coordinated with Public Order and Safety Office, Dagupan City Police Station/PNP Maritime Group, Bureau of Fire Protection, and Naval Reserve Center Northern Luzon.

- a. Placed on RED Alert Status effective 30 December 2018 – 02 January

- 2019.
- b. Disseminated CVRDRRMC Memo No. 65 s. 2018 re Raising of Alert Status during the Yuletide Season Celebration and CVRDRRMC Memo No. 01 s. 2019 re Maintaining Alert Status at the CVRDRRMC and LDRRMOCs in relation to the prevailing weather condition in the region due to Northeast Monsoon.
- c. Coordinated with RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and other stakeholders.

**Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) II**

Placed Disaster Management and Response Teams (DMRTs) on standby in the provinces.

**Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) II**

Prepared and disseminated OCD Memorandum re Preparedness for the Holidays to LGUs.

**Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) II**

- a. Placed on heightened alert on 23 December 2018 – 01 January 2019.
- b. Activated all communication hotlines 24/7 for a quick and immediate responses and coordination.

**DOH II**

- a. Activated Code White Alert from 24 December 2018 - 05 January 2019.
- b. Directed all DOH Retained Hospitals in the region to be on the same code status and must activate and prepare their personnel.
- c. Coordinated with Health Emergency Management Bureau (HEMB) and OCD II/RDRRMC II Operations Center.
- d. Disseminated health advisories and distributed posters re OPLAN Iwas Paputok.

**PCG – Coast Guard District Northeast Luzon**

- a. Placed on Code Blue Alert from 10 December 2018 to 05 January 2019.
- b. Activated Passengers Assistance Center (PAC) in strategic locations at ports, harbors, and appropriate areas where heavy influx of passengers was expected within respective AOR.
- c. Conducted Mandatory Pre-Departure Inspection (MPDI).
- d. Organized Medical teams to respond to medical situations in ports and major resorts.

**Philippine National Police (PNP) II**

- a. Placed on heightened alert.
- b. Established Assistance Hubs along major highways, airports, seaports, bus terminals, malls, resorts, and other places of convergence in coordination with other concerned law enforcement agencies, LGUs, and volunteer groups.
- c. Conducted inspection on the deployment of personnel to ensure their presence and alertness within respective AORs.
- d. Conducted information campaign in coordination with LGUs and other government agencies for public safety awareness to include information drive against firecrackers.
- e. Designated focal person/s for all firearms, explosives, firecrackers, and

- pyrotechnic issues and concerns.
- f. Identified and monitored areas with fre crackers ban ordinances.

#### **PDRRMC Cagayan**

- a. Activated Operations Center and coordinated with MDRRMOs.
- b. Alerted all Task Force Lingkod Cagayan, Provincial Office for People Empowerment, and Quick Response Team/Responders in the province.

#### **PDRRMC Isabela**

- a. Deployed mobile teams in four districts of Isabela Province to conduct monitoring and possible response operations.
- b. Prepositioned responders and equipment (DART-831) at Benito Soliven for possible evacuation of residents due to potential flooding at Sitio Fugu, Brgy. Maluno Norte.

#### **PDRRMCs Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, and Batanes**

- a. Placed on Alert Status.
- b. Coordinated with PDRRMC and all MDRRMC Operations Center.
- c. Maintained all communication/hotline of rescue units command center open for inquiries and emergency assistance.

### **3. REGION CALABARZON**

#### **OCD CALABARZON**

- a. Placed on BLUE Alert for monitoring and seamless coordination on all efforts relative to the observance of New Year's Eve Celebration 2018.
- b. Issued RDRRMC Memorandum No. 14 dated 22 December 2018 enjoining heightened monitoring and alert status to ensure prompt action in any eventuality that may arise in connection with the activities associated with holiday festivities.

### **4. REGION MIMAROPA**

#### **OCD MIMAROPA**

- a. Issued Memorandum No. 117 s. 2018 re BLUE Alert Status to RDRRMCs MIMAROPA and LDRRMCs MIMAROPA in connection with Christmas and New Year Celebration.
- b. Placed Operations Center on BLUE Alert Status for coordination/monitoring and assistance.
- c. Disseminated weather advisories to R/P/C/MDRRMCs, LGUs, Local Radio Stations, and line-member agencies through SMS, facsimile, and uploaded the same to OCD-RDRRMC MIMAROPA social media accounts to ensure widest dissemination of these advisories.
- d. Coordinated with RDRRMC MIMAROPA and LDRRMOs re Preparedness Measures for Christmas and New Year Celebration.
- e. Ensured close coordination with response agencies and concerned LGUs re situation updates in connection with the Holiday Celebration.
- f. Coordinated with Coast Guard Station and Substations within the area re status of port operations and influx of passengers.
- g. Made available stockpile of 1,150 family packs and 82 Hygiene Kits in the OCD MIMAROPA Regional Warehouse.
- h. Prepositioned Portable Generator Set, Family Pack NFI, and Hygiene Kit in the provinces of Marinduque,

Occidental Mindoro, Romblon, and Oriental Mindoro.

#### **DILG MIMAROPA**

- a. Informed all concerned personnel through DILG MIMAROPA's official social media page on Blue Alert Status for Christmas and New Year Celebration.
- b. Advised field officers and ensured that the LGU formulate a contingency plan on peace and order and public safety for the Holidays.
- c. Advised LGU to maintain the cleanliness and orderliness in their respective areas of jurisdiction specially before and during the celebration.
- d. Implemented other necessary measures towards a peaceful and meaningful observance of Holiday Season.

#### **DSWD MIMAROPA**

- a. Activated Field Office Operations Center to monitor daily local weather condition and provide situational awareness.
- b. Alerted all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in five (5) provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situation in their areas.
- c. Placed all members of R/P/C/M QRTs and Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team on call status ready for deployment if needed.
- d. Advised P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities in their respective areas and take appropriate actions.
- e. Made available stockpile of 25,080 family food packs and standby funds amounting to ₱3,034,141.75 to all SWADT and Regional Warehouses including prepositioned goods in identified critical areas.

#### **DOH MIMAROPA**

- a. Coordinated and monitored the mobilization of all logistical requirements of the DOH needed in the region.
- b. Monitored health-related events including regional and local events and incidents with potential impact to a particular area of the region.
- c. Placed response teams on standby for possible deployment.
- d. Coordinated with regional hospitals on their preparedness and availability of back-up teams.
- e. Facilitated the issuance of appropriate warnings to all concerned health offices and facilities in anticipation of impending emergencies.
- f. Prepositioned drugs, medicines, and medical supplies in Provincial DOH Offices and DOH Retained Hospitals.
- g. Prepositioned dome tent in strategic areas and areas of concern or health services.

#### **PCG SOUTHERN TAGALOG**

- a. Organized and activated Passenger Assistance Centers (PAC) from 10 December 2018, 8:00 AM to 05 January 2019, 8:00 AM in all ports, harbors, and appropriate areas within their respective AORs where heavy influx of passengers was expected.
- b. Advised all stations and sub-stations and OPCON units to be on heightened alert status from 10 December 2018 to 05 January 2019.

### **DPWH MIMAROPA**

- a. Alerted Maintenance Crew of the District Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Teams to monitor condition of National Roads and Bridges and other infrastructure facilities.
- b. Placed equipment on standby status and ready to mobilize as situation warrants.
- c. Placed District Motorists' Assistance Teams on their respective area of assignment to provide immediate assistance to traveling public and motorists.

### **PRO MIMAROPA**

- a. Directed all PDs, PPOs, CD, PPCPO, and FC, RMFB to prepare all contingencies and have teams on alert to secure respective AOR and if necessary, assist the LGU.
- b. Directed all members of RHQ/RMFB SAR Team to be ready for any possible Search and Rescue Operations.

### **PDRRMC Palawan**

- a. Activated all Palawan Rescue 165 for monitoring and emergency response.
- b. Activated Operations Center of 4 out of 23 municipalities.
- c. Deployed mobile and floating assets for possible response operations.
- d. Disseminated weather advisories to all MDRRMOs.
- e. Prepositioned a total of 14,500 family food packs.

### **MDRRMC Linapacan, Palawan**

- a. Activated MDRRM Operations Center and issued memorandum order to concern agencies to render duty for prompt coordination with their respective offices for any untoward incidents.
- b. Activated Disaster Response Volunteers for possible deployment.
- c. Ensured constant coordination, monitoring, and updating of situation with all barangays through its Barangay Chairman.

### **MDRRMC Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro**

- a. Disseminated weather advisories to all affected barangays thru SMS and uploaded the same to MDRRMC official social media account for further dissemination to their respective BDRRMC.
- b. Deployed ERTs on a 24-hour basis.
- c. Coordinated with PNP, BFP, MSWD, RDRRMC, PDRRMO, PNNRC, and BDCs.
- d. Prepositioned response assets and equipment.
- e. Issued memorandum re Blue Alert Status to BDRRMCs to closely monitor their AOR.
- f. MPS-PNP established monitoring stations for security measures and conducted Operation Bakal/Checkpoint.

### **MDRRMC San Agustin, Romblon**

- a. Conducted meeting re Preparedness Measures in line with the Celebration of Christmas and New Year.
- b. Conducted monitoring of stores selling firecrackers.
- c. Conducted Public Information Awareness Campaign together with BFP.

- d. PNP conducted muscle taping of firearms.
- e. Monitored untoward incidents during the Christmas and New Year Celebration.

#### **MDRRMC Looc, Romblon**

- a. Activated Emergency Operations Center including preparations of necessary equipment/vehicles and deployment of staff and volunteers on 21 December 2018.
- b. Conducted roving and coordinated to all barangays on their contingency/preparedness measures.

### **5. REGION VIII**

#### **OCD VIII**

Conducted PDRA meeting and discussed on the preparedness measures for the Holiday Season.

#### **DSWD VIII**

- a. Assigned Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Teams and DRMD-PDOs at the province and alerted and advised them to coordinate with P/C/MSWDOs and/or P/C/MDRRMOs and immediately report any eventualities on the ground.
- b. Alerted all Quick Response Team (QRT) members and Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) in case there was a need to render duty.
- c. Monitored weather condition in close coordination with SWADT, QRTs, and PDOs for any incident reports.
- d. Alerted Regional Resource Operation Section (RROS) to ensure the readiness of dispatching the food and non-food commodities whenever necessary.
- e. Made available standby fund amounting to ₱3,000,000.00 to be used in the purchase of other commodities when needed.
- f. Placed a total of 1,381 personnel on standby.

#### **DOH VIII**

- a. Placed on Code White Alert.
- b. Placed DOH Regional Office Response Team on standby ready for deployment if the need arises.
- c. Activated Operations Center.
- d. Implemented Health Emergency Management Information System in the Provincial Health Offices.
- e. Ensured the availability of drugs, medicines, supplies, and equipment prepositioned in the Provincial DOH offices and the availability of transport vehicle for responders and materials logistics.
- f. Placed Regional Assessment Team and Disease Surveillance Teams on standby for any eventualities.

#### **PCG VIII**

- a. Placed on heightened alert.
- b. Conducted preparations for the availability of assets and equipment.
- c. Placed QRTs in the region on standby for possible deployment.



**BFP VIII**

- a. Disseminated memorandum alerting BFP provincial and field station for any eventualities that may arise during the Holiday Season.
- b. Directed all units to be standby and conducted Information Campaign.
- c. Conducted lateral and vertical coordination with other National Government Agencies.

**PNP VIII**

- a. Placed on Full Alert.
- b. Coordinated with the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils in Eastern Visayas for their actions taken and preparedness measures in connection with the Holiday Season.
- c. Disseminated weather advisories to all RDRRMC Member agencies, LDRRMOs, and LCEs.

**8ID, Philippine Army**

- a. Alerted army detachments against any eventualities that may arise.
- b. Activated Emergency Response Company and alerted the brigades in the region to prepare and respond to any eventualities.

**Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) VIII**

- a. Advised LDRRMC to be on BLUE Alert Status.
- b. Activated PDRRMC Emergency Response Team (ERT) station and roving schedule.

Strictly implemented Muntinlupa City Ordinance No. 14-092, "An ordinance prohibiting the manufacture, display, sale, distribution, possession, or use of firecrackers or pyrotechnic devices and such other similar devices and the exploding of firecrackers or other similar explosives within the territorial jurisdiction on Muntinlupa City".
- h. Prepositioned assets and equipment for possible response operations.

- i. Established specific tasking per agency.
- j. Established roving teams for situational analysis, operational readiness, and monitoring within the AOR.
- k. Deployed workforce from Public Order Safety, PNP, and Muntinlupa Traffic Management Bureau which were posted along national roads, on the areas of concerns, and traffic checkpoint areas.
