I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. CHRONOLOGY AND TRACKING

20 August 2019

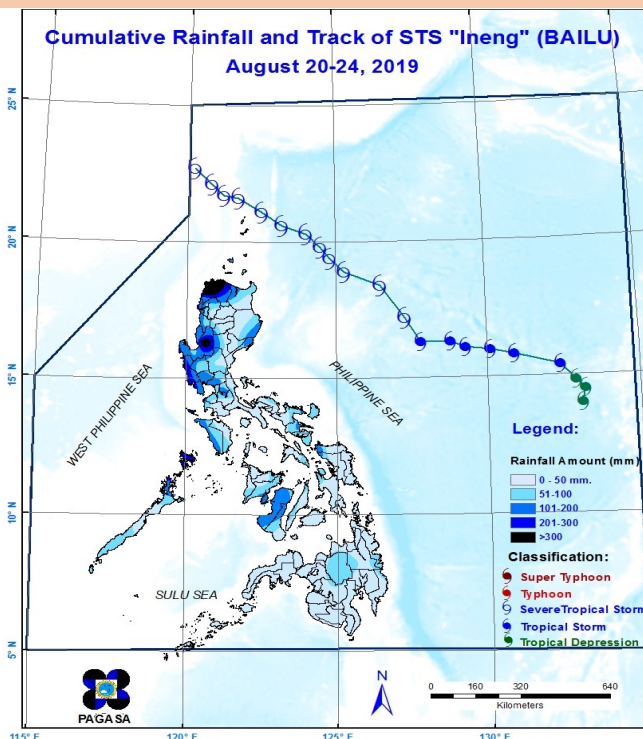
At 10:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 930 km East Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes (14.2 °N, 132.8 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h, moving West Northwest at 15 km/h.

"INENG" is less likely to make landfall on any part of the country.

21 August 2019

At 10:00 AM, the center of Tropical Depression "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 1,155 km East of Infanta, Quezon (14.8 °N, 132.4 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h, moving Northwest slowly.

"INENG" brought light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains over Bicol Region and Eastern Visayas. The Southwest Monsoon brought light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains over MIMAROPA and rest of Visayas. The trough of a shallow Low Pressure Area (LPA) off the southwestern coast of Taiwan (outside the PAR) brought



light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains over Batanes and Babuyan Group of Islands.

At 10:00 PM, the center of Tropical Storm "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 970 km East of Infanta, Quezon or 910 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (15.8 °N, 130.6 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph, moving West Northwest at 25 km/h.

22 August 2019

At 10:00 AM, the center of Tropical Storm "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 725 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (16.1 °N, 128.9 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 90 km/h, moving West Northwest at 15 km/h.

Moderate to occasionally heavy rains due to "INENG" affected Bicol Region, Northern Samar, and Quezon Province. Light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains due to the Southwest Monsoon will prevail over Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, northern Palawan (including Calamian and Cuyo Islands), Antique and Aklan.

At 4:00 PM, the center of Tropical Storm "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 670 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (16.2 °N, 128.4 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 90 km/h, moving West Northwest at 10 km/h.

Moderate to occasionally heavy rains was experienced over Catanduanes. Light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains will prevail over Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, northern portions of Palawan (including Calamian and Cuyo Islands), Antique, Aklan, and the rest of Bicol Regions.

At 10:00 PM, the center of Tropical Storm "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 585 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (16.4 °N, 127.6 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 85 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 105 km/h, moving West Northwest at 15 km/h.

23 August 2019

At 4:00 AM, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "INENG" was estimated based on all available data at 580 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.4 °N, 127.2 °E). Maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h, moving North Northwest at 20 km/h.

Moderate to heavy rains may be experienced over Batanes, Cagayan (including Babuyan Group of Islands), Ilocos Norte and Apayao. Light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains may prevail over Metro Manila, Central Luzon, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, northern portions of Palawan (including Calamian and Cuyo Islands), and the rest of Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region and Cagayan Valley.

24 August 2019

"INENG" maintained its strength while moving towards Southern Taiwan - Batanes area. At 4:00 PM, the center of STS "INENG" (I.N. BAILU) was at 330 km East Southeast of Basco, Batanes (19.3 °N, 124.9 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h. It moved West Northwest at 25 km/h.

Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 2 was hoisted over Batanes and Babuyan Islands while, TCWS No. 1 was issued over Cagayan, Isabela, Apayao, Kalinga, Northern Abra and Ilocos Norte.

"INENG" accelerated and left the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

At 7:00 PM, the center of STS "INENG" (I.N. BAILU) was at 395 km Northwest of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (23.1 °N, 119.4 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h. It moved Northwest at 25 km/h.

25 August 2019

At 4:00 PM, Luzon and Western Visayas was affected by Southwest Monsoon.

Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms condition has prevailed over Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Zambales, Bataan, Batanes and Babuyan group of islands caused by Southwest Monsoon. Possible flash floods or landslides due to scattered light to moderate to at times heavy rains.

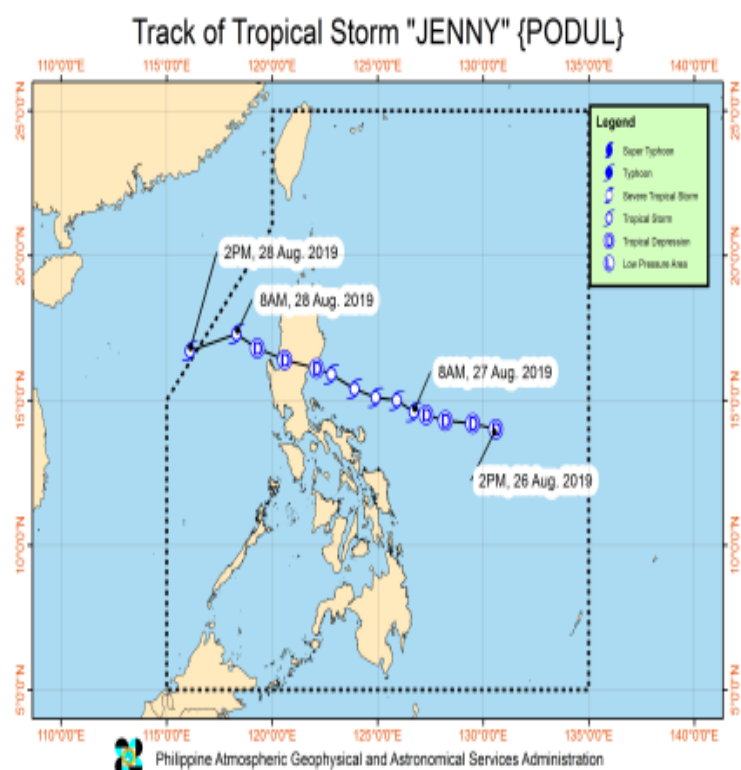
Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers had prevailed over Cagayan, Isabela, Apayao, Kalinga, Abra, and Ilocos Norte caused by STS "INENG". Possible flash floods or landslides due to scattered light to moderate to at times heavy rains.

26 August 2019

At 3:00 AM, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was at 770 East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (12.2°N, 132.7°E). Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms were experienced over MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, CARAGA Region, Northern Mindanao and Zamboanga Peninsula caused by Southwest Monsoon / Trough of LPA.

27 August 2019

"JENNY" slightly accelerated while moving westward. At 4:00 AM, the center of TD "JENNY" was at 395 km East Northeast of



Virac, Catanduanes or 525 km east of Daet, Camarines Norte (14.3°N, 127.8°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph, moving West at 20 kph.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 1 was hoisted over the provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Benguet, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Aurora, Nueva Ecija, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, Rizal, northern portion of Quezon including Polillo Islands, Cavite, Laguna, Camarines Norte, northeastern portion of Camarines Sur and Catanduanes.

28 August 2019

Tropical Depression "JENNY" had crossed the mountainous terrain of northern Luzon and left the landmass emerging over the Lingayen Gulf at around 3:00 AM. Tropical Storm "JENNY" had slightly intensified and was now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

B. TROPICAL CYCLONE ANALYSIS

SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "INENG"

"INENG" developed into a tropical depression from a low-pressure area approximately west of the Mariana Islands on 20 August. On the next day (21 August), Ineng has intensified into a tropical storm and given an international name Bailu. Owing to favorable environmental conditions, Ineng gradually intensified over the Philippine sea while moving in a northwestward direction under the influence of a subtropical ridge (STR) located in the northeast. On 23 August, Ineng has intensified into a severe tropical storm. On the next day (24 August), Ineng slightly intensified as it continues to move northwest and has made a close approach to Batanes province. Later that day, Ineng has made landfall over southern Taiwan and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). Though Ineng did not make landfall in the country, it brought a considerable amount of rains over the western section of Luzon, particularly over Laoag City, Baguio City, Iba Zambales, Coron Island, and Sinait.

TROPICAL STORM "JENNY"

On 24 August, a low-pressure area formed near the Caroline Islands. The system moves northwesterly, enters the PAR on 26 August, intensified into a tropical depression and was named "JENNY". The analysis shows a marginally favorable environmental condition and on the next day (27 August), Jenny intensified into a tropical storm and given international name Podul. Jenny began to move west-northwesterly toward Aurora province while maintaining its strength. Later that same day, Jenny has made landfall over Casiguran, Aurora at around 10:40 PM. Due to land interaction, the system has weakened into a tropical depression on 28 August. Jenny has crossed the mountainous terrain of northern Luzon and emerged over the Lingayen Gulf in the early morning of the same day. The system has re-intensified into a tropical storm while over the West Philippine Sea before exiting the PAR.

II. EFFECTS

C. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total of **28,450 families / 118,635 persons** were affected in Regions I, II, III, VIII and CAR, of which, 1,192 families / 4,309 were served inside 96 Evacuation Centers and 464 families / 1,731 persons were served outside ECs, broken down as follows:

F. Status of Lifelines

1. Power Supply

Purok 3 and Purok 4 in San Fernando City, La Union experienced power outage on 24 August 2019, 5:31 PM. Power was restored on the same day around 11:00 PM.

2. Roads and Bridges (TAB B)

A total of 21 road sections (17 national/ 4 local) and 7 local bridges were reported not passable to vehicles in Region I, II, V and CAR. As of 30 August 2021, all road sections and bridges were passable except one local road in Iitogon, Benguet.
