I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

26 January 2019

The Tail-End of a Cold Front brought moderate to occasionally heavy rains over CARAGA Region and the Provinces of Misamis Oriental, Camiguin, Bukidnon, Davao Oriental, and Compostela Valley. The rest of Mindanao experienced cloudy skies with light to moderate with at times heavy rains.

27 January 2019

The Tail-end of a Cold Front brought moderate to occasionally heavy rains over Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, and Compostela Valley. The rest of CARAGA and Davao Regions experienced cloudy skies with scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population

- A total of **133,191 families / 606,000 persons** were reported affected in Regions XI and CARAGA due to TECF.
- Of which, a total of **131,229 families / 593,582 persons** were served inside and outside of the evacuation centers.
