Situational Report for the Observance of Holy Week (Semana Santa) (2022)

SitRep No. 1 for the Observance of Holy Week (2022)

April 13, 2022 08:00 am

The Lenten Season or Semana Santa is a significant annual religious observance for the Filipino Roman Catholics. It begins on Palm Sunday and continues on through Eastern Sunday. During this season, people go to churches to attend mass to reflect and offer prayers.

Also, Catholics observe Spanish-influenced rituals such as processions, passion plays (senakulo), and pabasa. It is also an opportunity for families to spend time together.

Eastern Sunday culminates the celebration of Semana Santa, Viewed as the greatest feast of the Church year. It is one of the most festive events, a day of joy, and celebration for the faithful commemorating Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead.

ACTIONS TAKEN**

National



National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)

- Raised its alert status to BLUE effective 09 April 2022.
- Issued Memorandum No. 51, s. 2022 dated 05 April 2022 re Blue Alert Status at the NDRRMOC in connection with the Holy Week (Semana Santa) 2022 to all concerned NDRRMC Member-Agencies and Regional DRRM Councils.



PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD (PCG)

- Activated the DOTr Malasakit Help Desk (MHD) in the observance of "OPLAN Biyaheng Ayos: Semana Santa and Summer Vacation 2022" as of 10 April 2022.
- Monitored a total of 5,649 outbound and 4,697 inbound passengers as of 12 April 2022.
- Inspected a total of 1,471 vessels and 1,315 motorbancas in different ports nationwide.

- The DOH CHD-I Operations Center (DOH CHD-I OpCen) in on "CODE WHITE" status and on 24-hour duty to monitor health events related to the observance of Holy Week from April 09-18, 2022. We are in direct coordination with the regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC), Provincial DOH

Offices (PDOHOs), DOH-Retained Hospitals in the Region.

- The four (4) PDOHOs are also on an oncall duty and are in direct coordination with their respective Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (PDRRMCs).
- The Health Emergency Management Staff of the three (3) DOH-Retained Hospitals (Mariano Marcos Memorial Hospital and Medical Center, Batac City, Ilocos Norte; Ilocos Training and Regional Medical Center, San Fernando City, La Union; and Region I Medical Center, Dagupan City, Pangasinan) are on 24-hour duty to attend to casualties related to current events.

- Coordination with Sual PNP, BFP, PNP Maritime, PCG and Tourism staff stationed in the municipality, as well as the BDRRMC for the implementation of Safety Health Protocols and guidelines in the observance Lenten Season
- Close Monitoring of Tropical Cyclone Bulletin issued by DOST PAGASA, DENR-MGB and other surveillance agencies.
- Strengthen risk communication
- Heighten monitoring of tourist destination spots particularly the beach resorts and falls within the Area of Responsibility.
- Distribution of IEC materials on safe observance of the Semana Santa and Disaster Preparedness.
- In coordination with the PCG Sual, implement No Sailing, Fishing and Swimming activities in the areas with issuances of Gale Warning and other related bulletins.
- Perform necessary preparedness and response activities as situation requires.

LGU Pozorrubio, Pangasinan

- Coordinated with the PNP, BFP and CSO partners for the deployment of personnel to assist motorists along the national highway and TPLEX.
- Coordinated with the barangay officials for the monitoring of rivers and resorts within their AOR and to implement precautionary measures for swimming safety.
- Posted MGA PALAALA PARA SA SEMANA SANTA at the MDRRMO Pozorrubio FB Page for the guidance of the public.
- Rescue Vehicle, Fire Truck, Police Patrol Car and Heavy Equipment are on standby for any incidents/accidents
- Adopted skeletal duty during the Holy Week (April 14-17) for vigilant monitoring of high risk areas and implementation of the Minimum Public Health Standards.

PNP RO1

- Conduct inspection on tourist establishments and sites to ensure that minimum health standard protocols and IATF-MEID guidelines were properly observed such as wearing of facemask/face shield, social distancing, temperature check, contact tracing document, placement of disinfectants, and authorized capacity of venues;
 - Conduct mobile patrols and ensure maximum police presence in places of convergence, transportation hubs and other areas vulnerable to illegal activities and violation of MPHS in coordination with other concerned law enforcement agencies, and LGUs
 - Ensure the safety and security to tourist in tourist destination areas through Tourist Police Units in coordination with LGUs, local tourism councils and DOT;
 - Deploy dedicated personnel to areas with ongoing road construction/rehabilitation to assist the traffic 24/7. Unit Commanders must also consider on their deployment threat group such as CTGs and other lawless elements which might put a risk to the security deployed personnel;
 - Conduct information campaigns in coordination with LGUs public safety awareness;
 - Display of PNP hotline numbers and establish Police Assistance Desk (PADs) with detailed personnel and tourist police for the general public, people with disabilities, and the elderly in strategic areas within respective AORs;
 - Prepare respective media release on security preparations based on the template provided by RCADD and provision of Crime Prevention Tips for the public NLT March 19, 2021
- Coordinate with the management of Petron and Shell Service Stations for the utilization of space to serve as assembly Areas for patrollers for community-related activities, information desk for motorist and for posting of safety reminders/tips;
- Mobilize force multipliers on deployment of personnel;
 - Monitor the possible existence of rallyist during Labor Day and implement SOP and contingency plan;
 - Ensure that all Unit Commanders/COPs supervise the deployment and operations of their personnel;
- Conduct Red teaming Operations personnel;
- Deploy Road Safety Marshals in public terminals and roads leading to places to convergence, tourist destinations, and recreational area to assist motorist in coordination with the police stations in the area;
 - Conduct regular inspection BLOWBAGETS (Brakes, Lights, Oil, Water, Battery, Air. Gas. Engine, Tools, Self) of bus and other public utility transports to prevent tragic vehicle incidents and ensure the safety and security of motorists and tourists;
 - Undertake appropriate security measure and assistance to arriving and departing travelers and tourist in seaports

BFP RO1

- Deployment of Fire Personnel and Fire Truck at OPLAN SEMANA SANTA 2022 Operation Center.
- Monitoring along National Road.
- Response Team on standby in case of emergency.

BJMP RO1

- Maintain zero escape and incident free during the observance of the Holy Week.
- All Provincial Jail Administrators were directed to assess and declare commensurate alert status within their

areas of responsibility and ensure extra vigilance by our personnel in the performance of their duties and responsibilities.

- Reminded the Jail Wardens to ensure that our POL will not perform self-flagellation and to undertake the following precautionary measures to maintaining the security and safety of the jail facilities.
- Regular conduct of greyhound operations and surprise searches and inspections to flush out contrabands inside jails;
- Daily inspection of all security facilities, such as but not limited to, banging of grills and iron bars and inspection and maintenance of locks and keys;
- Secure firearms and anti-riot equipment in an armory beyond the reach of POL located and within easy reach of personnel in case of emergencies;
- Regular headcount of PDL at least 5-6 times within a 24-hour period;
- Monitor the movement of PDL throughout their activities;
- Intensify intelligence and counter-intelligence system in jail units;
- Maximize deployment of personnel;
- Activate operational plans for foreseeable incidents; and
- For security purposes, when medical treatment and hospitalization of POL is necessary, the PDL shall be kept in a restraining device except when removal is necessary for physical examination and medical treatment.

 - Ensure cleanliness and orderliness by mobilizing all resources in garbage collection and disposal and clean-up operations of all public places.
 - Implement other necessary measures to ensure the peaceful and safe observance of Semana Santa.
