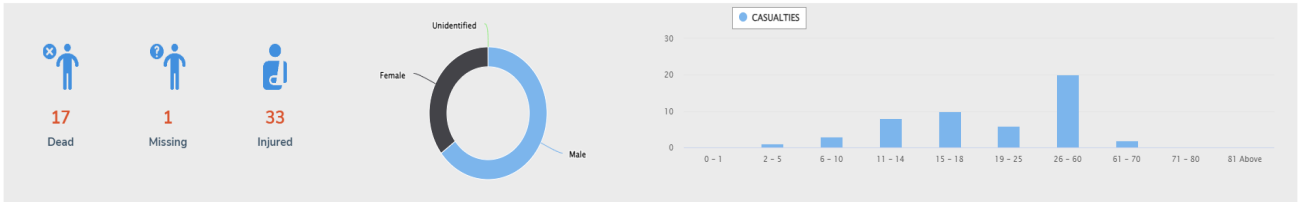

SitRep No. 7 for the Observance of Holy Week (2022)

April 19, 2022 08:00 am

The Lenten Season or Semana Santa is a significant annual religious observance for the Filipino Roman Catholics. It begins on Palm Sunday and continues on through Eastern Sunday. During this season, people go to churches to attend mass to reflect and offer prayers.

Also, Catholics observe Spanish-influenced rituals such as processions, passion plays (senakulo), and pabasa. It is also an opportunity for families to spend time together.

Eastern Sunday culminates the celebration of Semana Santa, Viewed as the greatest feast of the Church year. It is one of the most festive events, a day of joy, and celebration for the faithful commemorating Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead.

- Raised its alert status to BLUE effective 09 April 2022.

Personnel from the DOTR, LTO, LTRFB, MMDA, DILG, PNP and I-ACT along with QC DPOS serve as support to ensure safe travel of commuters.
- The QC Department of Sanitation released their operations / collection schedule for the Holy Week.
- Maintains 24/7 monitoring
- Disseminates timely advisories and PAGASA bulletins through their social media account
- Conducted phone brigade to 142 barangays to establish possible coordination in line with the observation of Semana Santa
- Provided Medical Assistance to individuals at the QCDRRMO tent located at Sto. Domingo Church
- Ongoing deployment of personnel for stand by at identified gathering areas by QCPD
- Continuously monitors the situation in the city;
- Provided medical assistance to 1 patient;
- Augmented 7 buses and other transportation services to commuters

9. Makati City

- Oplan Semana Santa Help Desk established in Barangay Poblacion in anticipation of Semana Santa Activities.
- PNP Help Desk established in all Churches within the City
- SUMVAC (Summer Vacation) Desk established in strategic locations within the city

10. Mandaluyong City

- Mandaluyong CDRRMO will be assisting the scheduled processions facilitated and organized by the San Felipe Neri Parish in Celebration of Holy Week 2022.
- Deployment of CDRRMO EMS first aid station in San Felipe Neri Parish.
- CDRRMO Operations Center to closely monitor the scheduled processions.
- Response Cluster members of the Mandaluyong City DRRM Council are placed on standby alert.
- CDRRMO roving ambulance on standby.
- Other Barangay Ambulance on standby.
- BFP-Mandaluyong on standby.

11. Marikina City

- Marikina City DRMMO in coordination with the barangays thru the BDRRMO are on alert status.
- Alternate routes for the observance of Semana Santa are currently being implemented and cascaded by the barangays to the Marikinaños.
- Marikina PNP are also on alert status and checkpoints are being managed.
- Continuously monitors the situation in the city

12. Municipality of Pateros

- The Municipality of Pateros in coordination with the barangays, PNP, and PBDAO are on 24/7 monitoring.
- Mayor Ponce has reminded the public on the minimum health standards as well as other peace and order concerns during his FB Live session at 2PM today.
- Closely monitoring traffic in the city

13. Muntinlupa City

- The Muntinlupa Department of Disaster Resiliency and Management is on 24/7 monitoring. 16. Taguig City

- The Taguig CDRRMO and BDRRMOs are on alert status.
- PNP personnel are deployed in strategic areas to monitor the peace and order situation. Police Assistance desks are also established in strategic areas.
- BFP on standby.
- In observance of the Holy Week, there will be no vaccination operations in all Taguig Vaccination hubs on April 13-15, 2022.

17. Valenzuela City

- VCDRRMO is on standby to monitor any event for the entire Lenten Season.
- EMS units are on standby and ready to respond.
- Valenzuela City Police are likewise on alert to render security coverage and public safety services within the AOR.
- Personnel are deployed in various points to monitor and maintain peace and order.
- PNP hotline numbers are posted in strategic places with Police Assistance Desks.
- VCPS inspected tourist establishments to ensure health protocols are followed. VCPS personnel are deployed in areas with on-going road constructions to assist traffic 24/7.
