

## SitRep No. 2 for Magnitude 7.0 Earthquake in Tayum, Abra (2022)

July 28, 2022 06:00 am

At 8:43 AM, 27 July 2022, a Magnitude (Mw) 7.0 earthquake shook the provinces in northwestern Luzon and adjacent areas including Metro Manila. The earthquake has an epicenter located at 17.64°N, 120.63°E - 003 km N 45° W of Tayum (Abra) and a depth of 17 kilometers.

- Raised the Alert Status to RED effective 27 July 2022 thru NDRRMC Memorandum No. 102
- Issued NDRRMC Memorandum No. 101 re Reiteration Response Operations Plans for Earthquake

- Municipalities are closely coordinating with the affected barangays for the provision of psychosocial services and assessment of the needed intervention of the affected families and individuals.

- Psychosocial Support Program (PSP) Team is on standby for possible deployment.

- DSWD-DRMB is on standby response support assets from non-affected DSWD-FOs;

- DSWD FO-CAR activated Quick Response Teams in the PAT-Abra, Benguet, Kalinga and Mountain Province.

- All Quick Response Teams (QRTs) of the affected and nearby regions are on alert mode.

#### 8. EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Public Telecommunications Entity:

PLDT and SMART

- All Smart cell sites in affected areas are up except one in Benguet that went off air. If power blackout is prolonged, some cell sites in Northern Luzon provinces with limited backup power may go off-air.

- Smart Libreng Tawag and Libreng Charging Stations are currently being set-up at the following locations: Vigan City, Ilocos Sur, Candon, Ilocos Sur, Bangued, Abra DITO TELECOM

- DITO's 17 sites remaining are currently experiencing commercial power interruption and running on backup power. Energy saving mode and power generation efforts are being performed.

#### Resources:

A total of 36 emergency telecommunications equipment are deployed, while 66 emergency telecommunications equipment are available and ready for deployment.
