



October 22, 2022 08:00 am

19 October 2022

- 5:00 AM: The Low-Pressure Area over the Philippine Sea East of Extreme Northern Luzon developed into Tropical Depression (TD) "OBET with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h, and central pressure of 1004 hPa.
- 11:00 AM: "OBET" maintained its strength while moving north northwestward over the Philippine sea.
- 5:00 PM: It decelerated while moving West Southwestward over the Philippine Sea.
- 11:00 PM: TD "OBET" maintained its strength as it continues to move west southwestward. The center of Tropical Depression "OBET" was estimated at 880 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon.

20 October 2022

- 5:00 AM: "OBET" continued to move west southwestward over the Philippine Sea with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h, and central pressure of 1004 hPa. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was raised over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the Northeastern portion of mainland Cagayan (Santa Ana and Gonzaga).
- 11:00 AM: "OBET" maintained its strength as it moves westward over the Philippine Sea east of extreme Northern Luzon. The center of Tropical Depression "OBET" was estimated at 745 km East of Basco, Batanes.
- 11:00 PM: TD "OBET" slightly accelerated as it moves west southwestward. The center of the eye was estimated at 555 km East of Basco, Batanes. TCWS No. 1 was still raised over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northeastern portion of mainland Cagayan.

21 October 2022

- 5:00 AM: TD "OBET" further accelerated towards the Luzon Strait with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h.
- 2:00 PM: "OBET" slightly intensifies while moving westward towards the Luzon Straight
- 5:00 PM: It maintained its strength as it threatens Batabes
- 8:00 PM: It continued to maintain its strength as it about to pass very close or over Batanes. TCWS No. 1 was still raised over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northeastern portion of mainland Cagayan particulary in Santa Ana and Gonzaga.
- 11:00 PM: TD "OBET" slightly weakened and was over the Balintang Channel. TCWS No. 1 was only hoisted in Batanes and Babuyan Islands.

22 October 2022

- 2:00 AM: "OBET" maintained its strength as it moves westward over the Balintang Channel of which, at 1:00 AM, the center of Tropical Depression OBET was estimated at 70 km West Southwest of Basco, Batanes.
- 5:00 AM: TD "OBET" begins to move away from Batanes with a maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h, and central pressure of 1006 hPa. TCWS No. 1 is still raised in Batanes and Babuyan Islands.

National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- Facilitated the conduct of Weather Update on 19 and 20 October 2022.
- Issued the following NDRRMC Memorandum dated 14 October 2022:
- a. No. 173 re Preparations for Tropical Depression "OBET"
- b. No. 174 re Maintaining of NDRRMOC BLUE Alert Status ICOW Tropical Depression "OBET"



DOST- Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

- Continuous weather monitoring and provision of weather updates to all stakeholders.

Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- Issued Memorandum dated 19 October 2022 relative to the ACTIVATION of EOC and DORMS for DILG Regions I, II, and CAR for TD "OBET", and to advise LGUs to carry out the following actions:
- a. Maintain the activation of concerned Barangay DRRMCs for early warning measures and vigilant monitoring of areas with settlements at the base of sliding slopes or ridges with manifestations of rockslide/landslide, tension cracks, and areas identified as very high/critical landslide zones. Vigilant monitoring and reporting of weather disturbances and other incidents.
- b. Continuously inform and advise all communities thru, but not limited to, the local television and radio stations, of the situation updates and preparedness actions of the localities. Intensify the use of social media platforms for public information.
- c. Monitor with vigilance the level of river waters and settlements in low-lying areas, such as rice lands or near riverbanks, which have experienced recent and repeated flooding, and vigilant monitoring for possible riverbank erosion and shift of river flow direction.
- d. Implement PREEMPTIVE EVACUATION in areas with moderate to very high susceptibility to floods and landslides, especially residents whose dwellings are susceptible to damage due to strong winds.
- e. Conduct pruning of trees/vegetation and clearing of waterways (canals, drainages, etc.)
- f. Ensure that physical distancing is always observed in the evacuation centers.
- g. Constantly remind evacuees to always properly wear their face masks inside evacuation centers.
- h. Ensure that communication lines are working properly.
- i. Restrict or ban tourist activities such as, but not limited to mountaineering, hiking, surfing, diving, etc., within their areas of jurisdiction during this period.
- j. Warn small-scale miners to stay on safer grounds and stop all mining activities.
- k. Enforce a No-Fishing policy and ensure that sea travel and small-scale fishing activities are closely monitored and prohibited if gale warnings are issued.
- Participated in two (2) NDRRMC Weather Update Meetings for the TD "OBET" on 19 and 20 October 2022.
- Issued DILG Advisory regarding the necessary critical preparedness actions dated 20 October 2022 to all DILG Regional Offices and the BARMM Minister of the Interior and Local Government ICOW TD OBET.
