ACTIVATION AND STANDBY STATUS OF RESPONSE

CLUSTERS ICOW MAYON VOLCANO UNREST

Alert Level 3 is raised over Mayon Volcano, with its relatively high level of unrest, and an increased tendency towards a hazardous eruption. Based on the current prevailing wind pattern, ash fall events may most likely occur on the south side of the volcano, and heavy rainfall could generate channel-confined lahars and sediment-laden streamflows.

In line with this, the following response clusters are hereby activated or placed on standby effective June 11, 2023 (Sunday), 8:00 AM to monitor and facilitate emergency response and humanitarian assistance in response to the effects of the volcano's unrest.

- 1. Food and Non-Food Items (DSWD)
- 2. Health (DOH)
- 3. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (DSWD)
- 4. Internally Displaced Persons Protection (DSWD)
- 5. Logistics (OCD)
- 6. Emergency Telecommunications (DICT)
- 7. Education (DepEd)
- 8. Search, Rescue, and Retrieval (SRR)
- 9. Law and Order (PNP)

On Standby / As Need Arises

- 1. Early Recovery (OCD)
- 2. Philippine International Humanitarian (DFA)
- 3. Shelter (DHSUD)
- 4. Management of the Dead and Missing (DILG)
