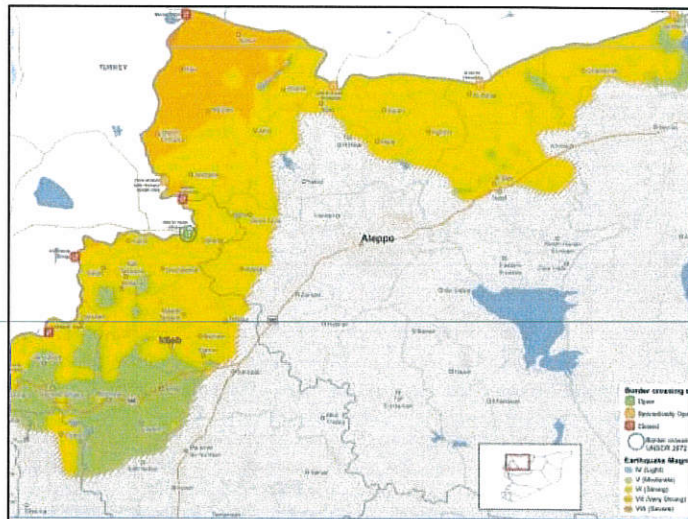


**SITUATIONAL REPORT NO. 7 FOR THE PHILIPPINE INTER-AGENCY
HUMANITARIAN CONTINGENT (PIAHC) IN THE REPUBLIC OF TÜRKIYE**
As of **22** February 2023, 8:00 AM

SITUATION OVERVIEW:

On 06 February 2023, at 4:17 AM, a magnitude 7.8 earthquake occurred near Gaziantep City in Southern Türkiye. This is the strongest earthquake recorded in the country since 1939. Around nine hours later, a magnitude 7.6 earthquake occurred in Ekinozu City, Türkiye — only about 70 kilometers from the first earthquake.

These earthquakes were also felt in the Syrian Arab Republic. Various intensities have been reported across Türkiye and Syria. Aftershocks with varying magnitudes have also been recorded. According to the Disaster and Emergency Management Authority (AFAD) of Türkiye, at least 5,700 aftershocks have occurred since 06 February 2023.

Allepo, Syria was the most affected among the North, Central, and Coastal parts of Syria. Initial reports recorded deaths and damage to infrastructure mainly in the Provinces of Allepo, Lattakia, Hama, Idlib, and Tartous in Syria.

Both the death toll and the structural damage are anticipated to rise as many of the structures in the impacted areas are weak and might collapse as a result of the extra damage.

The lack of heavy machines to remove rubble and winter weather conditions have significantly complicated the search and rescue operations in the affected areas.

On 06 February 2023, the Government of Türkiye issued a Level 4 alarm calling for international assistance.

People have also been forced to move out of their houses due to recent flooding. The water level of the Orontes River has reportedly risen and submerged homes following the collapse of a dam in the aftermath of the earthquakes.

Aftershocks are reportedly continuing in north-west Syria, continuously forcing people to flee their homes. Civil Defense teams concluded their search and rescue operations on 11

February and have moved towards the stage of removing debris and recovering bodies. However, fuel shortages and a lack of machinery and vehicles to remove debris are hampering efforts.

The earthquakes affected at least 78 communities and 35 subdistricts in north-west Syria. Residents interviewed by the Ataa Humanitarian Relief Association (ATAA) stated that 75 percent of the population in 18 sub-districts in Idlib and Aleppo governorates have been affected, notably the cities of Harim, Salqin, Sarmada, and Dana.

At 8:04 PM (TRT), 20 February 2023, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake struck Hatay in southern Türkiye which was followed by a 5.8 magnitude aftershock three minutes later and 90 subsequent aftershocks. These earthquakes were felt throughout the region causing renewed fear for those who survived the devastating earthquakes on February 6, 2023. After the latest earthquakes on February 20, AFAD reported that six people lost their lives, at least 294 people were injured, 18 of which severely, and ten buildings collapsed.¹

EFFECTS:

I. Casualties

As of 21 February 2023, a total of **48,224** persons were reported dead while **118,725** were reported injured by the Government of Türkiye and Syria.

II. Affected Population

A. Türkiye

- A total of 9.1 million persons are affected. Of which, 430,000 persons have been relocated to other provinces.⁶
- An estimated 1.3 - 1.6 million people may be displaced. Significant people movement out of the Adiyaman, Hatay, Gaziantep, Kahramanmaras, and Malatya provinces.⁷

B. North-West Syria

- A total of 11,000 families were reportedly homeless.⁸

- At least 8.8 million people have been affected.⁹

III. Damage to Infrastructure

A. Republic of Türkiye

- A total of 56,080 buildings collapsed or were heavily damaged.¹⁰
- Airports in Kahramanmaraş and Hatay have been repaired and are open to ambulance air planes. Airports in Gaziantep and Şanlıurfa are open to humanitarian flights. While airports in Malatya, Adana, Diyarbakır, Adıyaman Airports are open to flights.
- Main roads were reportedly damaged. A number of key transportation routes have been impaired.

B. Syrian Arab Republic

- A total of 1,600 buildings were totally damaged while 7,500 buildings were partially damaged.¹¹
- A total of 661 schools (263 in Aleppo, 124 in Lattakia, 96 in Tartous, 109 in Hama, 63 in Homs, 4 in Idleb, 10 in Dar'a, 16 in Rural Damascus, and 2 in Ar Raqqa) were damaged.
- In Aleppo, at least four (4) civil registry offices have reportedly suffered structural damages so far.
- In Lattakia, three (3) water pumping stations in Al Qerdaha district went out of service, affecting the provision of water to at least 30,000 people.
- At least 57 hospitals and primary health facilities in north-west Syria are partially damaged or have suspended their services due to the earthquakes.
- In Hama, an initial assessment showed that 4 hospitals and 60 health facilities have been damaged by the earthquake.¹²

C. North-West Syria

- As of 20 February 2023, more than 9,000 buildings have been partially or totally damaged.¹³

PHILIPPINE RESPONSE:

The Philippine Inter-Agency Humanitarian Contingent (PIAHC) is composed of **82 personnel** from the Office of Civil Defense, Department of National Defense (DND-OCD), Department of Health (DOH), 505th Search and Rescue Group (SRG) of the Philippine Air Force, 525th Engineer Combat Battalion (ECBn) of the Philippine Army, Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), and Subic Bay Metropolitan Authority (SBMA).

On 12 February 2023, 10:00 AM (TRT), the team resumed search operations to other sectors. As to date, a total of **36 buildings** were assessed by the USAR Team, to wit:

On 08 February 2023, 10:53 PM (Philippine Standard Time*) the PIAHC was onboard Turkish Airlines TK85 (MNL-IST) bound to Istanbul, Türkiye. The aircraft arrived at Istanbul Airport on 09 February 2023 at around 12:58 PM (PST).

On 09 February 2023, 6:10 PM (PST), the PIAHC arrived at Adana Airport. The team then prepared to depart Istanbul to Adana. The PIAHC was joined by the Hong Kong and German Response Teams going to Adana. The said Response Teams are directed to report to the Regional Development Council (RDC) in Adana. At around 4:30 PM (PST), the PIAHC was onboard a flight going to Adana.

On 10 February 2023, 10:06 AM (TRT) USAR Team began its search operations in the Adiyaman Site.

On 11 February 2023, 12:00 PM (TRT), the USAR team finished triaging collapsed buildings in their designated areas. The teams were also instructed to proceed to conduct operations to other sectors and further, reported that there are possible casualties that are still under the collapsed buildings. Further, the EMT Team has completed the establishment of its field hospital at the Adiyaman Otagon Bus Station and is now ready to accept patients.

On 14 February 2023, 8:00 AM, the PEMAT resumed its medical operations. The team catered ambulatory cases and referral of cases requiring hospitalization. Further, the team also provided medical assistance to the Philippine Contingent, ensuring the welfare of the team with standby doctors and nurses.

The base of operations/base camp is also managed with the leadership of the DOH, with the assistance of AFP and the Turkish Military. On the same day, the Philippine Defense and Armed Forces Attache to Turkiye visited the PIAHC base camp and provided supplies for the team.

On 15 February 2023, 12:30 PM (TRT), USAR team moved out from the Base of Operations (BOO) to answer the call for search assistance by the Adiyaman Government Local Emergency Management Agency.

DOH continues to provide medical assistance to the Philippine Contingent, ensuring the welfare of the team with standby doctors and nurses.

On 16-17 February 2023, USAR team is currently placed on-standby, awaiting requests for assistance on retrieval operations from the LEMA.

On 18 February 2023, USAR team conducted meetings and assisted in camp operations. Lines remain open for requests for assistance on retrieval operations from the LEMA.

On 19 February 2023, representatives from the Turkish Ministry of Health visited the PIAHC's field hospital. At 5:50 PM (TRT), members of the contingent who visited the Defense and Armed Forces Attaché in Ankara, Turkey safely returned to camp with additional food provisions.

On 21 February 2023, the USAR is currently placed on-standby awaiting requests for assistance on retrieval operations from the LEMA. The USAR team is scheduled to conduct a series of meetings and briefings regarding the INSARAG USAR deployment procedures within the coming days.

The EMT from the Japanese Contingent visited the PEMAT to share knowledge and insights with regards to EMT deployment strategies and protocols.

The Philippine Contingent finalized its demobilization plan including the remaining days of PEMAT operations and the team's return to the Philippines.

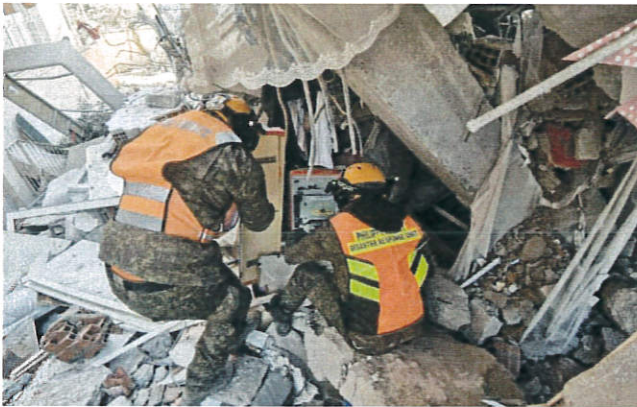

On 14 February 2023, the blankets donated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) arrived at the Staging Center of Turkey.



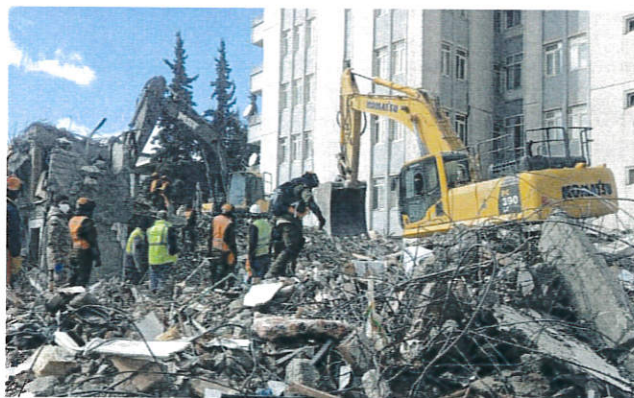
On 14 February 2023, the PEMAT continued its medical operations to accommodate the victims of the earthquake and the members of the contingent.
