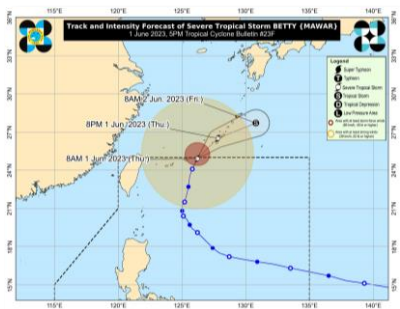

Situational Report for TC BETTY (2023)

SitRep No. 12 for TC BETTY (2023)

June 05, 2023 08:00 am

20 May 2023

-At 3:00 AM, a Tropical Cyclone Outside PAR was located 2,510 km East of Northern Mindanao (6.4°N, 149.0°E).
-At 3:00 PM, the TC developed as Tropical Storm MAWAR (2302) and was located 2,525 km east of Northeastern Mindanao (6.0°N, 149.1°E) with an almost stationary movement.

21 May 2023

-At 4:00 PM, MAWAR developed into a Severe Tropical Storm and was located at 2,390 km East of Northeastern Mindanao (7.5°N, 148.0°E) and has 100 km/h maximum sustained winds. Gustiness is traveling at up to 125 km/h and 10 km/h in a North-northwesterly direction.

22 May 2023

-At 3:00 AM, MAWAR developed to a Typhoon and was located at 2,330 km East of Mindanao (8.3°N, 147.5°E) with maximum sustained winds of 130 km/h near the center and gustiness up to 160 km/h moving West-northwestward at 15 km/h.

23 May 2023

-At 3:00 PM, MAWAR developed into a Super Typhoon (STY) and was located at 2,285 km East of Visayas (11.8°N, 146.4°E) with maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h moving Northward at 15 km/h.

24 May 2023

-At 11:00 PM, Typhoon "MAWAR" moves past the Northern Mariana Islands while maintaining its strength with maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center moving Northwestward slowly.

25 May 2023

-Super Typhoon "MAWAR" further intensifies over the Philippine Sea with maximum sustained winds of 205 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 250 km/h, and central pressure of 910 hPa moving westward at 20 km/h.

26 May 2023

-At 11:00 AM, "MAWAR" slightly intensifies while moving westward over the Philippine Sea with maximum sustained winds of 215 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 260 km/h, and central pressure of 905 hPa.

27 May 2023

-At 2:00 AM, STY "MAWAR" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "BETTY". It has a maximum sustained winds of 195 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 240 km/h, and central pressure of 915 hPa. BETTY is forecasted to remain as a super typhoon over the weekend.

-At 11:00 AM, Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 is raised over The eastern portion of Cagayan including Babuyan and Camiguin Islands and the eastern portion of Isabela.

-At 11:00 PM, "BETTY" weakens into a typhoon as it continues to move over the Philippine Sea. It has a maximum sustained winds of 175 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 215 km/h, and central pressure of 935 hPa.

TCWS No. 1 is raised over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao, Ilocos Norte, the northern and central portions of Abra, Kalinga, the eastern and central portions of Mountain Province, the eastern and central portions of Ifugao, the northern and central portions of Aurora, Quirino and the northeastern portion of Nueva Vizcaya.

28 May 2023

-At 5:00 AM, TY "MAWAR" maintains its strength while moving over the Philippine sea east of northern Luzon.

-At 5:00 PM, TY "BETTY" slightly weakens and is now moving west northwestward over the Philippine Sea east of northern Luzon. TCWS No. 1 is still raised over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao, Ilocos Norte, the northern and central portions of Abra, Kalinga, the eastern and central portions of Mountain Province, the eastern and central portions of Ifugao, the northern and central portions of Aurora, Quirino and the northeastern portion of Nueva Vizcaya.

29 May 2023

-At 5:00 AM, TY "BETTY" slightly accelerates northwestward over the waters east of Cagayan.

TCWS No. 2 is raised over Batanes, the eastern portion of Babuyan Islands (Babuyan Is., Camiguin Is., Didicas Is., Pamuktan Is.), and the northeastern portion of mainland Cagayan (Santa Ana).

TCWS No. 1 is raised over the rest of Babuyan Islands, the rest of mainland Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, the northeastern portion of Nueva Vizcaya, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Ilocos Norte, the northern and central portions of Aurora, Polillo Islands, the northern portion of Catanduanes, the northeastern portion of Camarines Sur, and the northern portion of Camarines Norte.

-At 5:00 PM, TY BETTY continues to decelerate as it moves north northwestward over the waters east of Cagayan.

30 May 2023

-At 5:00 AM, TY BETTY further weakens over the sea east of Batanes. It has maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 185 km/h, and central pressure of 955 hPa.

-At 5:00 AM, TY BETTY decelerates while slowly moving northward over the sea east of Batanes.

TCWS No. 2 is still raised in Batanes, while, TCWS No. 1 is raised over the northern and eastern portions of Isabela, Apayao, the eastern portion of Ilocos Norte, the northern portion of Kalinga, the northeastern portion of Abra and Cagayan including Babuyan Islands.

31 May 2023

-At 5:00 AM, TY BETTY further weakens while moving slowly over the sea east of Batanes, with maximum sustained winds of 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 150 km/h.

TCWS No. 2 is still raised in Batanes. TCWS No. 1 over Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, the northern and eastern portions of Isabela (Santo Tomas, Santa Maria, Quezon, San Mariano, Dinapigue, Delfin Albano, San Pablo, Ilagan City, Benito Soliven, Tumauni, Cabagan, Palanan, Quirino, Divilacan, Gamu, Maconacon, Naguilian, Mallig), the eastern portion of Ilocos Norte (Piddig, Bangui, Vintar, Marcos, Pagudpud, Banna, Adams, Carasi, Dingras, Solsona, Dumalneg, Nueva Era), Apayao, the northern portion of Kalinga (City of Tabuk, Balbalan, Pinukpuk, Rizal), and the northeastern portion of Abra (Tineg, Lacub, Malibcong)

-At 5:00 PM, "BETTY" continues to accelerate northward over the sea east northeast of Batanes. TCWS No. 2 is now lifted. Meanwhile, TCWS No. 1 is still raised over Batanes and the eastern portion of Babuyan Islands (Calayan Is., Babuyan Is., and Camiguin Is.).

01 June 2023

-At 5:00 AM, BETTY weakens into a severe tropical storm as it continues to move northward. TCWS No. 1 remains hoisted over Batanes.

-At 4:00 PM, STS BETTY steadily weakens and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility. All TCWS are lifted.

3. Raise awareness amongst the community about how to treat contaminated water resources.
4. Set minimum standards for the distribution of water in an emergency.
5. Work with other NGOs and the local government on raising awareness about personal hygiene, house cleaning, and wider environmental protection and sustainability.

First Aid and Health

1. Maintain the management plan by listing the pregnant women, infants, the disabled, sick, and senior citizens in the municipality to ensure that their medical needs are met.
2. Keep stretchers/local alternatives ready to carry injured people.
3. Keep a First Aid kit ready and ensure that expired drugs are replaced with new ones.
4. Ensure that all the contents of the first Aid kit are in place and prepared.
5. Rescue volunteers shall proceed to the operation area.

Evacuation and Shelter Management

1. Monitor the infrastructural needs of the municipality.
2. Stock dry food/pre-cooked food, water, medicines, candles and kerosene sufficient to last the evacuees a week with the help of the community, local authorities, local traders and business associations and NGOs.

- Conduct a meeting involving Barangay Captains, Barangay officials, DepED School Heads, PNP, BFP, Coast Guard, Disaster office, CT TODA, DSWD, and all Department heads to discuss our preparations for Typhoon MAWAR.
- Primary and secondary evacuation centers have been established in anticipation of the possibility of forced evacuations, particularly in areas prone to flooding, storm surges, and landslides.
- The primary evacuation centers are located in the multipurpose gymnasiums within the barangays. In the event that these gyms reach maximum capacity, our secondary evacuation centers, which are public schools, will be utilized.
- The barangay disaster teams in all 22 barangays have been activated.
- In the event that our LDRRMO personnel are attending to other incidents, the Barangay Disaster Teams (BDT) will assume the role of first responders.
- Prepared the relief supplies, which include provisions such as food, clothing, hygiene products, and sleeping kits, among other essential items.

LGU-CEBU-TABUELAN

- The local DRRM council convened on May 25, 2023, at 9:30 AM.
- Collaborative efforts with various government agencies (such as BFP, PNP, PCG, PA, and DILG), LnB, MAO, MEO, and other relevant offices.
- Conducted PDRA (Post-Disaster Rapid Assessment).
- Coordinate with Barangay Officials for awareness of the populace living in prone areas.
- The LGU has adequate resources, including equipment and non-food items, available for use if necessary.

LGU-CEBU-SOGOD

- Convened the Municipal DRRM Council on May 25, 2023 2:00 PM
- Maintained continuous coordination with relevant agencies and government bodies such as BFP, PNP, DILG, PCG, MAO, volunteers, and barangays.
- Coordinated with barangay officials to conduct regular monitoring of flood-prone areas.
- Conducted a Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA).

- Ensured that the LGU has sufficient resources in case any unforeseen needs arise.

LGU-CEBU-TUDELA

- The MDRRMO convened and held a Pre-Disaster Assessment Meeting on May 25, 2023. They also carried out public announcements and information drives.
- In coordination with Solid Waste Management personnel, the MDRRMO conducted road clearing operations to remove encroached road objects and trim trees.
- MSWO personnel are actively packing relief goods for the anticipated evacuees.
- The MDRRMO and responders are preparing response equipment to address high-risk hazards within the municipality.
- DRR vehicles and generator sets have been fueled and made ready for deployment.

NEGOR-MABINAY

- Attended PDRA Meeting Regional Level
- Conducted PDRA to LDRRM Personnel and PNP
- In coordination with LDRRMC and Punong barangay with BDRRM ERT.
- Pre-positioned LDRRM vehicles, heavy equipment, and rescue equipment.
- Pre-positioned Food and Non-food items.
- LDRRM Personnel are on standby 24/7 at Emergency Operations Center
- Activated BDRRMC and Coordinated with the BDRRM Coordinators and Alternates to provide status and updates on the impacts of the hazard.
- Continue to disseminate advisories and/or warnings from authorities.
- Disseminated advisories from DOST-PAGASA and IECs on Preparedness Measures for Landslide and Flood thru: Radio @ JU FM, SMS, social media, Messenger (GC).
- Monitor Spillways and River's that are prone to flooding.

BOHOL-PROVINCE OF BOHOL

- The PDRA was conducted on May 24 at 9:00 AM to assess the province's level of preparedness, identify mitigation and preparedness measures, and determine logistical concerns in the event of a worst-case scenario.
- The DSWD has deployed personnel in every municipality and trained them on how to properly fill out and submit reports. Additionally, pre-positioned family food packs are available in the towns of Carmen, Loboc, Pres CPG, Sagbayan, Buenavista, Dimiao, Tubigon, Maribojoc, San Miguel, Loay, Jagna, Anda, and Corella.
- A total of 2,112 ready-to-use food packs have been designated for the Abante Caravan, should they be required in response to the consequences of Mawar. Furthermore, we have acquired goods currently awaiting the NTP to facilitate delivery.
- The primary area of focus for the PCG's operation will be the coastal regions. In the event of rough sea conditions, they will implement a suspension of voyages. They are eager to receive early notifications such as gale warnings or weather advisories, enabling them to advise small fishing boats, particularly fishermen, against sailing. They have expressed concerns about the diving establishments in the Panglao area, especially if foreign nationals have already made reservations for diving expeditions.
- The AFP detachments and troops are prepared and ready for augmentation. They will await instructions from the PDRRMC or LGUs regarding their assistance, should it be required.
- The PPA will make timely announcements about PAGASA and PCG warnings to suspend voyages and minimize the number of "stranded" passengers. The terminal area is prone to strong winds and high waters, so discouraging travel during adverse weather conditions is crucial for passenger safety.
- The PPA requested hot meals and family food packs (FFPs) for possible stranded individuals and will coordinate with local government units (LGUs) for evacuation if needed.
- The Port Police will also be involved in coordinating with LGUs for stranded individuals.
- The PNP will request that all stations be on standby alert (QRT), ready for immediate action. They will also collaborate with their respective MDRRMCs, particularly for providing assistance in evacuations when needed.
- The DPWH given their limited equipment and specific mandate, their primary focus will be on providing assistance and clearing the national roads, especially those susceptible to landslides.
- The PEO guarantees the readiness of dump trucks, equipment, fuel, and personnel to ensure their availability. Heavy equipment deployed or stationed in various towns will be instructed to be on standby in the

población area for swift deployment when needed.

- The PHO personnel have already been organized into clusters, such as WASH and medical teams. Hospitals will also be notified, and it is important to note that the readily available medicines primarily cater to hypertensive patients.
- They have a quick response team (QRT) ready; requested consumers to prepare flashlights and solar-powered lights in case power will be cut off from Leyte.
- In the event of a power interruption or outage, Bohol Water Utilities is equipped with standby generators (both mobile and stationary) that are ready for deployment. They will prioritize the distribution of water to areas with hospitals and government offices.
- DPWH II acknowledges the limited availability of their equipment but assures the prepositioning of their existing resources. They have requested coordination with the Bohol Contractors Association, as the association possesses heavy equipment that can provide support in clearing operations if necessary.
- Currently, the Tagbilaran warehouse of the NFA has an inventory of 37,547 bags of rice. This quantity is sufficient to meet the rice consumption needs for approximately 4 days, considering the estimated daily consumption of 9,000 bags.
- The DILG will maintain close monitoring of the LGUs and will compile reports for a comprehensive assessment.
- PIMO will disseminate information materials in accordance with the advice of the PDRRMO.
- In addition to their regular 24/7 emergency response services, PDRRMO-TaRSIER 117, including the Headquarters and 7 substations, will be on standby starting Friday. Emergency responders, including the Search and Rescue and Water Search and Rescue teams, will be prepared for immediate deployment if necessary. The substations will be notified and will continue monitoring, especially in their respective catchment areas. Continuous monitoring of water levels in the major dams within the province will also be conducted. They will remain vigilant in performing system checks, maintaining coordination with LGUs, and collaborating with PDRRMC members.
- BALDRRMO will make necessary preparations for the barangays and establish close coordination with MDRRMC members.
- DepEd Bohol will be prepared in case there is a need to designate schools as evacuation centers.
