CURRENT ALERT LEVEL


On 08 June 2023, 12:00 PM, Alert Level 3 (Increased Tendency Towards Hazardous Eruption) was raised in Mayon Volcano. This means that Mayon is exhibiting magmatic eruption of a summit lava dome, with increased chances of lava flows and hazardous pyroclastic density current or PDC events affecting the upper to middle slopes of the volcano and of potential explosive activity within weeks or even days.

HIGHEST ALERT LEVEL SINCE THE ERUPTION

On 11 June 2023, at around 7:47 PM, an effusive eruption (lava flow) commenced from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano. Since then, the very slow lava effusion has been observed as of 06 July 2023. Mayon Volcano remains at Alert Level 3 during the said lava flow activity.

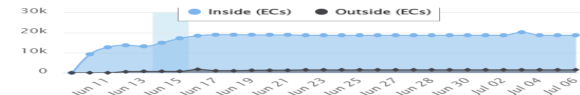

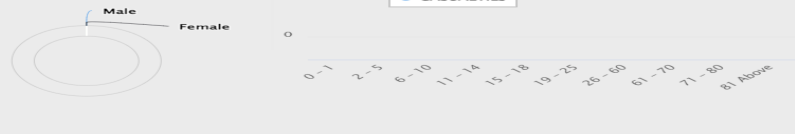

BREAKDOWN OF CASUALTIES PER SEX AND AGE GROUP





Situational Report for the Mayon Volcanic Activity (2023)

SitRep No. 28 for the Mayon Volcanic Activity (2023)

July 06, 2023 08:00 am

On 05 June 2023, the alert status of Mayon Volcano was raised to Alert Level 2 (Increasing Unrest) following a sharp increase in the incidence of rockfall from its summit lava dome from an average of 5 events per day in May 2023 to 49 events per day on 5 June 2023.

Pronounced increases in rockfall signify the extrusion of new lava beneath the summit lava dome, destabilizing this and causing its spalling or collapse.

Rockfall activity increased while volcanic earthquake activity was absent to sparse, sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emissions were at background or baseline levels and short-term ground deformation consisted mainly of swelling of the middle to upper slopes of the edifice

Days of increased incidence and volume of rockfall based on seismic records were followed by the generation of short pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) or "uson" in the morning of 08 June 2023. The PDCs were emplaced on the Bonga (Legazpi City), Miisi (Daraga) and Basud (Sto. Domingo) Gullies as far as two (2) kilometers from the summit crater. This indicated that new, less degassed lava was already being spalled from the summit dome and that eruption of very slowly extruding magma had slightly increased.

On 08 June 2023, 12:00 PM, Alert Level 3 (Increased Tendency Towards Hazardous Eruption) was raised. In the evening thereof, incandescent rockfall generated by intermittent collapse of an apparent fluidal lava portion of the summit dome were deposited on the above gullies within a kilometer of the crater.

In the early morning on 10 June 2023, a new summit dome impinging a remnant on the southeast crater floor was observed.

As of 10 June 2023, 7:00 PM, a total of 654 rockfall events and 7 PDCs have been recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network since 01 June 2023. Average SO₂ flux increased beyond baseline levels to 1,205 tonnes/day. All other monitoring parameters remain unchanged.

Fair crater glow or "banaag" and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed in the night of 10 June 2023.

On 11 June 2023, at around 7:47 PM, lava flow activity commenced from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano. The activity formed two lobes of lava that emplaced within 500 meters from the crater and shed lava debris on the Mi-Isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern), and Basud (eastern) Gullies that fell within 2 kilometers from the crater. This development was accompanied by only weak seismic activity and a slight swelling of the upper portions of the edifice prior to lava flow based on electronic tilt data.

From 11 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 12 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded twenty-one (21) weak volcanic earthquakes and two hundred sixty (260) rockfall events. Three (3) dome-collapse PDC that lasted 2 to 4 minutes were also detected. SO₂ emission averaged 642 tonnes/day on 11 June 2023.

From 12 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 13 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded one (1) volcanic earthquake and 221 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. One (1) dome-collapse PDC that lasted two (2) minutes was also detected via seismic signals and was visually observed. Thin ash from the rockfalls and continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that bent and crept downslope before drifting northeast. Fair crater glow or "banaag" and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 723 tonnes/day on 12 June 2023.

From 13 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 14 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded seven (7) volcanic earthquakes and 309 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. Seven (7) dome-collapse PDC that lasted four (4) minutes were also detected via seismic signals and were visually observed. Thin ash from the rockfalls and continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that bent and crept downslope before drifting general east. Fair crater glow or “banaag” and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 149 tonnes/day on 13 June 2023.

From 14 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 15 June 2023, 5:00 AM the Mayon Volcano Network recorded two (2) volcanic earthquakes and 306 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. Three (3) dome-collapse PDC that lasted three (3) to six (6) minutes were also detected. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 700 m before drifting northwest. Fair crater glow or “banaag” and incandescent rockfall shed from fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 193 tonnes/day on 14 June 2023.

From 15 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 16 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximately one (1) kilometer from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to two (2) kilometers from the crater. A total of 13 dome-collapse PDC, 307 rockfall events, and four (4) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. PDCs lasted two (2) to six (6) minutes and were emplaced on the Mi-isi and Bonga Gullies within one (1) kilometer of the crater. The largest PDC event since 8 June 2023 occurred at 11:18 PM on 15 June and deposited material within the upper one (1) kilometer of these gullies. Traces of ashfall dispersed from the PDCs were reported in Sitio Buga, Brgy. Nabonton, City of Ligao and Purok 7, Brgy. San Francisco, Municipality of Guinobatan. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 m before drifting to the general west and north-northeast. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 826 tonnes/day on 15 June 2023.

From 16 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 17 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of one thousand five hundred (1500) meters from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of nine (9) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted two (2) to four (4) minutes, two-hundred eighty (280) rockfall events, and two (2) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 100 m before drifting to the general west. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 978 tonnes/day on 16 June 2023.

From 17 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 18 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of one thousand five hundred (1500) meters from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of eleven (11) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted two (2) to six (6) minutes, two hundred seventy-four (274) rockfall events, and three (3) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 100 m before drifting to the general west. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 1,004 tonnes/day on 17 June 2023.

From 18 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 19 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of one thousand five hundred (1500) meters from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of five (5) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes and two hundred sixty five (265) rockfall events were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 600 m before drifting to the general west. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 889 tonnes/day on 18 June 2023.

From 19 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 20 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of two thousand five hundred (2500) meters and one thousand eight hundred (1800) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of two (2) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents

(PDC) that lasted two (2) to three (3) minutes, three hundred one (301) rockfall events, and one (1) volcanic earthquake were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 800 m before drifting to the general west. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 389 tonnes/day on 19 June 2023.

From 20 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 21 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of two thousand five hundred (2500) meters and one thousand eight hundred (1800) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seven (7) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, two hundred ninety-nine (299) rockfall events, and two (2) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 800 meters before drifting to the general west. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 507 tonnes/day on 20 June 2023.

From 21 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 22 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of two thousand five hundred (2500) meters and one thousand eight hundred (1800) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of eight (8) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted two (2) to five (5) minutes and two hundred ninety-nine (299) rockfall events were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 meters before drifting southwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 574 tonnes/day on 21 June 2023

From 22 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 23 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of two thousand five hundred (2500) meters and one thousand eight hundred (1800) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of thirteen (13) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted one (1) to four (4) minutes and three hundred thirty-nine (339) rockfall events were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 meters before drifting southwest and west-southwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 706 tonnes/day on 22 June 2023.

From 23 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 24 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of 2,500 meters and 1,800 meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to 3,300 meters from the crater. A total of one (1) dome-collapse PDC that lasted three (3) minutes, 308 rockfall events, and two (2) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 600 meters before drifting southwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 744 tonnes/day on 23 June 2023.

As of 24 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 25 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to maximum lengths of 2,500 meters and 1,800 meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to 3,300 meters from the crater. A total of 16 dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, 257 rockfall events, and 24 volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 600 meters before drifting west-southwest and southwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 663 tonnes/day on 24 June 2023.

As of 25 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 26 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of one thousand three hundred (1300) meters and one thousand two hundred (1200) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of eight (8) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, two hundred sixty-three (263) rockfall events, and one hundred two (102) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 100 meters before drifting to the general west direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 925 tonnes/day on 25 June 2023.

On 26 June 2023, 4:00 PM, there was an increased seismic activity and ground deformation in Mayon Volcano. Eruptive activity has been dominated by weak aseismic effusion of degassed lava from the summit crater. However, an increasing number of weak and shallow volcanic earthquakes began on 24 June 2023 and steadily increased to 102 volcanic earthquakes during a 24-hour between 25 and 26 June 2023. Between 5:00 AM and 3:00 PM today, an additional 100 volcanic earthquakes were recorded. Some of the analyzed earthquakes that could be located emanated from the summit lava dome, indicating origins from lava extrusion processes at the crater. The increased seismicity was accompanied by a noticeable sharp jump in ground tilt on the southwest sector of the edifice that began on 25 June 2023. As of present, steady-rate lava effusion from the summit crater and sporadic generation of rockfall and pyroclastic density currents or PDCs still persist.

As of 26 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 27 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of one thousand three hundred (1600) meters and one thousand two hundred (1200) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seventeen (17) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, two hundred forty-one (241) rockfall events, and one hundred seven (107) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 meters before drifting to the general west direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 753 tonnes/day on 26 June 2023. Short-term observations from EDM and electronic tiltmeter monitoring show the upper slopes to be inflating since February 2023. Longer-term ground deformation parameters based on EDM, precise leveling, continuous GPS, and electronic tilt monitoring indicate that Mayon is still inflated, especially on the northwest and southeast.

As of 27 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 28 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of one thousand six hundred (1600) meters and one thousand two hundred (1200) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seven (7) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, three hundred seventy-two (372) rockfall events, and one (1) volcanic earthquake were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 800 meters before drifting to west-northwest direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 964 tonnes/day on 27 June 2023.

As of 28 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 29 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand one hundred (2100) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seven (7) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted three (3) minutes, two (2) lava front collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that generated 1000 meters high light-brown plume, two hundred ninety-six (296) rockfall events, and one (1) volcanic earthquake were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 1000 meters before drifting to west-northwest, north-northwest and northeast direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 595 tonnes/day on 28 June 2023.

As of 29 June, 5:00 AM to 30 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand two hundred thirty (2230) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seven (7) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted two (2) to three (3) minutes, two hundred eighty-four (284) rockfall events, and two (2) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous voluminous degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 2500 meters before drifting to the north and northeast direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 595 tonnes/day on 28 June 2023.

As of 30 June 2023, 8:00 AM, Mayon Volcano is at Alert Level 3 which means that it is currently in a relatively high level of unrest as magma is at the crater and hazardous eruption is possible within weeks or even days.

As of 01 July 2023, 8:00 AM, eruptive activity at Mayon Volcano yesterday was dominated by the generation of dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents or PDCs on the Basud Gully on the eastern slopes. The largest of these events occurred at 1:01 PM and lasted eight (8) minutes based on the seismic record. Four (4) visible PDCs between 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM that lasted approximately four (4) minutes each traveled 3 to 4 kilometers downslope of the Basud Gully and generated one (1) kilometer-tall ash clouds that drifted to the north and northwest. Ashfall was recorded to have fallen on

Tabaco City. For the past 24-hour observation period, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies as well as rockfall and PDCs on these and the Basud (eastern) Gullies. Lava flows advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand two hundred thirty (2230) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris deposited to three thousand three hundred (3300) meters from the crater. A total of seventeen (17) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC), two hundred fifty-four (254) rockfall events, and sixty-five (65) weak volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous voluminous degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 2000 meters before drifting to the east-northeast and general west direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 1,002 tonnes/day yesterday and was first detected in significant concentrations by satellite monitors on 29 June 2023.

As of 02 July 2023, 8:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies as well as rockfall and PDCs on these and the Basud (eastern) Gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand seven hundred (2700) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to four thousand (4000) meters from the crater. Two (2) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted two (2) minutes, three hundred ninety-seven (397) rockfall events, and four (4) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous voluminous degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 1500 meters before drifting to the southwest, south-southwest and northwest direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 864 tonnes/day on 01 July 2023.

As of 03 July 2023, 8:00 AM, Mayon Volcano remains at Alert Level 3. Which means that it is currently in a relatively high level of unrest as magma is at the crater and hazardous eruption is possible within weeks or even days.

As of 05 July 2023, a very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies as well as rockfall and PDCs on these and the Basud (eastern) Gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand eight hundred (2800) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris has deposited to four thousand (4000) meters from the crater. Five (5) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted from two (2) to two and a half (2.5) minutes, two hundred thirty-two (232) rockfall events, one (1) volcanic earthquake, and an ongoing repetitive pulse tremor observed since 3:47 PM (PST) of July 3, 2023, were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 200 meters before drifting to the west-northwest and west-southwest direction. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 1,170 tonnes/day on 04 July 2023.

As of 06 July 2023, a very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies as well as rockfall and PDCs on these and the Basud (eastern) Gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximate lengths of two thousand eight hundred (2800) meters and one thousand three hundred (1300) meters along Mi-isi and Bonga gullies, respectively, from the summit crater while collapse debris has deposited to four thousand (4000) meters from the crater. Seven (7) dome-collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that lasted from one (1) to four (4) minutes, two (2) lava front collapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC) that generated 300 meters high light-brown plume, two hundred forty-three (243) rockfall events, and an ongoing repetitive pulse tremor observed since 3:47 PM (PST) of July 3, 2023, were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 500 meters before drifting to the west-southwest and west-northwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 1,621 tonnes/day on 05 July 2023.

- Albay 3rd District Representative Fernando T. Cabredo distributed assorted chicken cuts to displaced families at Guinobatan Community College in Guinobatan, Albay.
- The Provincial Government of Albay distributed food packs to displaced families at Comun Elementary School in Camalig, Albay
- Leyte 1st District Representative and House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez together with Tingog Party List distributed grocery items to displaced families at Anislag Elementary School in Anislag, Daraga, Albay.
- Team Bicol of Club i Yamaha Sniper Philippines, Inc. distributed ready-to-eat food to displaced families at Gabawan Evacuation Center in Daraga, Albay.
- Children International Bicol, Inc. (CIBI) distributed hygiene kits to displaced families at Malilipot Central School in Malilipot, Albay.
- The Fraternal Order of Eagles Eastern Visayas Region distributed FFPs to displaced families at Camalig Bungkaras Evacuation Center and Taladong Elementary School in Camalig, Albay.
- The Social Action Center of the Diocese of Legazpi provided hygiene kits.

LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

- As of 19 June 2023, a total of Php 4,560,000.48 worth of commodities were augmented as part of the response augmentation for the volcanic unrest of Mayon Volcano. Likewise, a total of Php 73,833,678.73 worth of commodities is currently available at the DOH Central Office Warehouse
- Moreover, a total of Php 303,280.00 worth of assorted drugs and medicines, surgical facemasks and slim water containers were prepositioned at PHO Albay and to eight (8) of its municipalities.

A. DOH

- Conducted 1st WASH Cluster National Meeting on Mayon Volcanic Preparedness and the Response Operations via virtual meeting (June 11, 2023)
- Coordinated with CHD Bicol DRRM-H and Bicol Regional Hospital and Medical Center (BRHMC) for updates and status in the area.
- Conducted an emergency meeting with all Rural Sanitary Inspectors.
- Activated the Bicol Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services.
- Activated fast lanes and surge capacity of DOH Hospitals and its network partners.
- Prepared the guidelines in provision of nutrition services during emergencies and disasters, such as breastmilk substitute, feeding bottles, artificial nipples and teats.
- Emergency purchase of micronutrient powder and LNSS-SQ for 6-23 months lactating and pregnant women.
- The Central office augmented a total of Php2,078,137.48 worth of assorted drugs and medicines, medical supplies, and other health commodities for augmentation to Bicol CHD.
- The Health Emergency Management Bureau conducted and facilitated the 2nd DOH Meeting on 16 June 2023 about Mt. Mayon response activities and situation updates.
- Conducted Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED) System from June 13 - June 15, 2023 where a total of one hundred fourteen (114) consultations were conducted of which the top 5 were cough and colds (28), headache (18), fever (12), ARI (9) and Dizziness (5). There is ongoing validation of a number of cases related to the effects of the volcanic activity.
- A total of 9 acute gastroenteritis cases (AGE) from 5 evacuation camps were referred to Bicol Regional Hospital and Medical Center.

- Managed 3 diarrhea cases from Guinobatan Community College Evacuation Center.
- 10 individuals were referred to Bicol Regional Hospital and Medical Center due to Acute Gastroenteritis. These patients were from Gabawan Evacuation Center (4 cases) and Anislag Relocation Site (2 cases). Bicol CHD is still verifying the EC where the 4 referrals originated.
- As of June 17, 2023, there were 628 consultations in evacuation centers in the Province of Albay.
- A total of 163 individuals received MHPSS services in two (2) Evacuation Centers in Albay
- As of June 18, 2023, there were 810 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay, of which, the top 10 causes were Acute Respiratory Infection, Cough and Colds, Fever, Headache, HPN, Toothache, Wound, Abdominal Pain, Dizziness, Skin Disease, Colds, and Acute Gastroenteritis.
- A total of sixty-five (65) HRHs (1 doctor, 41 nurses and 23 midwives) were deployed in the evacuation centers to provide medical services and to monitor the status of the displaced individuals and families.
- As of June 19, 2023, there were 932 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations were Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, High Blood Pressure, Open Wounds & Bruises, Loose Stools, Other Diseases, Skin disease, Toothache, Abdominal Pain.
- As of June 22, 2023, there were 1,491 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations were Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, High Blood pressure, toothache, Other Diseases, loose stools, eye itchiness, skin disease.
- Mobilized a team at San Jose National High School, Malilipot, Albay and conducted counselling and condom distribution, medical consultation, distribution of IEC materials, vaccination against COVID-19.
- As of June 21, 2023, a total of 5 evacuation centers were visited for Nutrition assessment of evacuees in the 2 municipalities (Ligao City and Guinobatan).
- 2 toilet facilities constructed at Mauraro NHS EC c/o LGU Guinobatan. Five (5) portalets were also donated and for installation in the said evacuation center.
- Conducted water sampling of all drinking water sources in Mauraro National High School EC were AGE (SPEED Syndromic Surveillance) cases were reported. As per result, all drinking water samples collected passed the test conducted. Possible sources of contamination from food preparation of vendors selling "palamig" and "halo-halo". Coordinated with vendors for proper food preparation and check with their sources of water being used.
- Conducted misting and disinfection of Comun ES EC, Taladong ES EC, Bariw ES EC, Bariw HS EC, Water distribution at Gabawan, and Budiao, Anislag EC.
- A total of 4,465 individuals were provided with different MHPSS interventions from June 14-22, 2023 in the 28 evacuation centers from 7 affected municipalities.
- As of June 24, 2023, there were 1,671 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, loose stools, High Blood pressure, toothache, eye itchiness, tooth extraction skin disease.
- As of June 25, 2023, there were 2,242 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, High Blood Pressure, Loose Stools, Other Diseases, Eye Itchiness, Toothache, Skin Disease.
- As of June 27, 2023, there were 2,520 consultations from evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, High Blood Pressure, Loose Stools, Other Diseases, Eye Itchiness, Toothache, Skin Disease.
- A total of 4,972 individuals were provided with different MHPSS interventions from June 14-26, 2023 in the 29 evacuation centers from 7 affected municipalities.
- The DOH has sent two (2) HEMB staff to provide technical assistance in leading the Health Cluster in assessing and validating the needs in the evacuation centers and subsequently facilitating the immediate provision of the identified needs.
- The National Response Cluster Team visited the evacuation centers in Tabaco City. The team along with DOH CHD V headed by Regional Director Ernie Vera conducted Rapid Needs Assessment and distributed various logistical support from WHO. Likewise, the team also visited Anislag Evacuation Center and Daraga Evacuation Center yesterday June 30, 2023. Assorted Commodities were also given and medical supplies were also given including the LGU of Sto. Domingo, Albay.
- As of July 01, 2023, there were 3,070 consultations were reported in the evacuation center
- Fifty-three (53) cases with cough, colds or sore throat with or without fever were detected
- Fifteen (15) new cases with eye itchiness, redness with or without discharge were detected
- Twelve (12) cases with fever were detected
- Five (5) new cases with loose stools, 3 or more in the past 24hrs with or without dehydration were detected
- As of July 02, 2023, there were 3,197 consultations were reported in the evacuation center.

- Regional Director Vera turned over the WHO donated logistics to the City Government of Tabaco amounting Php 579,311.00.
- As of July 03, 2023, there were 3,282 consultations reported in the evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, Loose Stools, High Blood Pressure, Toothache, Eye Itchiness, Other Diseases, Skin Disease.
- As of July 04, 2023, there were 3,390 consultations reported in the evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, Loose Stools, High Blood Pressure, Toothache, Eye Itchiness, Skin Disease, Other Diseases.
- A total of thirteen (13) cases were referred to 3 health facilities. Anislag Infirmary (1 case) from Gabawan Elementary School EC; Jose Belmonte B. Duran Albay Provincial Hospital (11 cases) from Guinobatan Community College EC and Taladong Elementary School EC; lastly, (1 case) from San Jose Elementary School referred to Dr. Lorenzo P. Ziga Memorial District Hospital.
- As of July 05, 2023, there were 3,530 consultations reported in the evacuation centers in the Province of Albay. Among these consultations, the top 10 leading consultations are Cough/Cold/Sore-throat, Fever, Headache, Open Wounds & Bruises, High Blood Pressure, Loose Stools, Toothache, Eye Itchiness, Skin Disease, Other Diseases.
- A total of 19 results of water samples taken from different evacuation centers were released today from the 4 municipalities, 2/19 (10.5%) failed the water sampling conducted.
- Delivered a total of Php 670,076.00 worth of logistics donated by WHO to the City Government of Legazpi City and Local Government Unit of Bacacay.

B. AFP

- Philippine Navy's Desalinator equipment was mobilized at Guinobatan Community College.

C. WHO

10. OTHER AGENCIES

- Distributed PhP 1,172,500 worth of agricultural inputs to evacuees for the establishment of communal gardens at evacuation sites in partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) through their "Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Workers" (TUPAD) project.
- Conducted Kadiwa near evacuation centers in coordination with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Farmer's Associations, Micro-, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs), and LGUs (Total sales: PhP 288,926).



Department of Transportation
