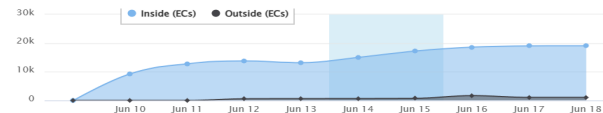

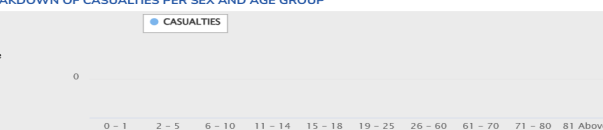

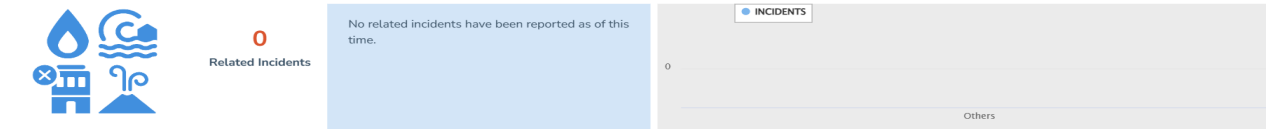

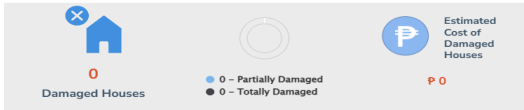
BREAKDOWN OF CASUALTIES PER SEX AND AGE GROUP



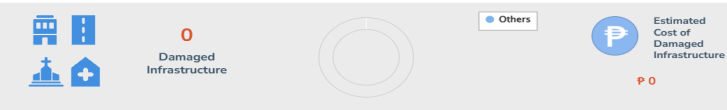

Situational Report for the Mayon Volcanic Activity (2023)

SitRep No. 9 for the Mayon Volcanic Activity (2023)

June 18, 2023 08:00 am

On 05 June 2023, the alert status of Mayon Volcano was raised to Alert Level 2 (Increasing Unrest) following a sharp increase in the incidence of rockfall from its summit lava dome from an average of 5 events per day in May 2023 to 49 events per day on 5 June 2023.

Pronounced increases in rockfall signify the extrusion of new lava beneath the summit lava dome, destabilizing this and causing its spalling or collapse.

Rockfall activity increased while volcanic earthquake activity was absent to sparse, sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emissions were at background or baseline levels and short-term ground deformation consisted mainly of swelling of the middle to upper slopes of the edifice

Days of increased incidence and volume of rockfall based on seismic records were followed by the generation of short pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) or "uson" in the morning of 08 June 2023. The PDCs were emplaced on the Bonga (Legaspi City), Miisi (Daraga) and Basud (Sto. Domingo) Gullies as far as two (2) kilometers from the summit crater. This indicated that new, less degassed lava was already being spalled from the summit dome and that eruption of very slowly extruding magma had slightly increased.

On 08 June 2023, 12:00 PM, Alert Level 3 (Increased Tendency Towards Hazardous Eruption) was raised. In the evening thereof, incandescent rockfall generated by intermittent collapse of an apparent fluidal lava portion of the summit dome were deposited on the above gullies within a kilometer of the crater.

In the early morning on 10 June 2023, a new summit dome impinging a remnant on the southeast crater floor was observed.

As of 10 June 2023, 7:00 PM, a total of 654 rockfall events and 7 PDCs have been recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network since 01 June 2023. Average SO₂ flux increased beyond baseline levels to 1,205 tonnes/day. All other monitoring parameters remain unchanged.

Fair crater glow or "banaag" and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed in the night of 10 June 2023.

On 11 June 2023, at around 7:47 PM, lava flow activity commenced from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano. The activity formed two lobes of lava that emplaced within 500 meters from the crater and shed lava debris on the Mi-Isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern), and Basud (eastern) Gullies that fell within 2 kilometers from the crater. This development was accompanied by only weak seismic activity and a slight swelling of the upper portions of the edifice prior to lava flow based on electronic tilt data.

From 11 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 12 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded twenty-one (21) weak volcanic earthquakes and two hundred sixty (260) rockfall events. Three (3) dome-collapse PDC that lasted 2 to 4 minutes were also detected. SO₂ emission averaged 642 tonnes/day on 11 June 2023.

From 12 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 13 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded one (1) volcanic earthquake and 221 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. One (1) dome-collapse PDC that lasted two (2) minutes was also detected via seismic signals and was visually observed. Thin ash from the rockfalls and continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that bent and crept downslope before drifting northeast. Fair crater glow or "banaag" and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 723 tonnes/day on 12 June 2023.

From 13 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 14 June 2023, 5:00 AM, the Mayon Volcano Network recorded seven (7) volcanic earthquakes and 309 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. Seven (7) dome-collapse PDC that lasted four (4) minutes were also detected via seismic signals and were visually observed. Thin ash from the rockfalls and continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that bent and crept downslope before drifting general east. Fair crater glow or “banaag” and incandescent rockfall shed from new fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 149 tonnes/day on 13 June 2023.

From 14 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 15 June 2023, 5:00 AM the Mayon Volcano Network recorded two (2) volcanic earthquakes and 306 rockfall events based on seismic and visual observations. Very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater emplaced lava flow and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies within approximately a kilometer from the crater. Three (3) dome-collapse PDC that lasted three (3) to six (6) minutes were also detected. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 700 m before drifting northwest. Fair crater glow or “banaag” and incandescent rockfall shed from fluidal lava at the summit of Mayon Volcano was observed. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 193 tonnes/day on 14 June 2023.

From 15 June 2023, 5:00 AM to 16 June 2023, 5:00 AM, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximately one (1) kilometer from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to two (2) kilometers from the crater. A total of 13 dome-collapse PDC, 307 rockfall events, and four (4) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. PDCs lasted two (2) to six (6) minutes and were emplaced on the Mi-isi and Bonga Gullies within one (1) kilometer of the crater. The largest PDC event since 8 Jun 2023 occurred at 11:18 PM on 15 June and deposited material within the upper one (1) kilometer of these gullies. Traces of ashfall dispersed from the PDCs were reported in Sitio Buga, Brgy. Nabonton, City of Ligao and Purok 7, Brgy. San Francisco, Municipality of Guinobatan. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 m before drifting to the general west and north-northeast. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emission averaged 826 tonnes/day on 15 June 2023.

Since the evening of 11 June 2023, the slow lava effusion has been observed for the fifth consecutive night on 17 June 2023.

As of 18 June 2023, 8:00 AM, Mayon Volcano is at Alert Level 3 which means that it is currently in a relatively high level of unrest as magma is at the crater and hazardous eruption is possible within weeks or even days.
