

SitRep No. 6 for the Combined Effects of Southwest Monsoon and TC JENNY

October 08, 2023 08:00 am

29 September 2023

-The Low-Pressure Area (LPA) east of Central Luzon has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility and developed into Tropical Depression (TD) "JENNY" {KOINU}.

30 September 2023,

- -"JENNY" intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS).
- -The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "JENNY" was forecast to bring a significant amount of rain in the next three days.

01 October 2023,

- -At 11:00 AM, "JENNY" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS).
- -At 5:00 PM, "JENNY" slightly intensified as it moved northwestward over the Philippine Sea. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was hoisted over Batanes.
- -The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "JENNY" was forecast to bring a significant amount of rain in the next three days in some areas of Central Luzon, MIMAROPA, Western Visayas, and Zamboanga Peninsula.

02 October 2023

- -At 5:00 AM, "JENNY" intensified into a Typhoon over the Philippine Sea.
- -At 11:00 PM, "JENNY" continued to intensify while moving northwestward. TCWS No. 2 was hoisted over Batanes.
- -The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "JENNY" was forecast to bring a significant amount of rain in the next three days in some areas in Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and Western Visayas.

03 October 2023

-At 5:00 AM, "JENNY" maintained its strength over the Philippine Sea with maximum sustained winds of 165 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 205 km/h, and central pressure of 945 hPa. TCWS No. 2 was hoisted over Batanes. -At 11:00 PM, TCWS No. 3 was raised over Itbayat, Batanes. The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by "JENNY" was

forecast to bring a significant amount of rain in the next three days in some areas of Regions I, III, NCR, CALABARZON, and MIMAROPA.

04 October 2023

- -"JENNY' slightly weakened and commenced its west northwestward turn toward Southern Taiwan.
- -At 5:00 AM, TCWS No. 3 was still hoisted over Itbayat, Batanes while TCWS No. 2 was hoisted over the rest of Batanes and the northern portion of Babuyan Islands. TCWS No. 1 was hoisted over the rest of Babuyan Islands, the northern portion of mainland Cagayan, the northern portion of Apayao, and the northern portion of Ilocos Norte.
- -At 11:00 PM, TCWS No. 3 was hoisted over the entire province of Batanes.
- -The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "JENNY" was forecast to bring a significant amount of rain in the next three days in some areas in Ilocos Region, Cagayan Valley, Central Luzon, and MIMAROPA.

05 October 2023

- -"JENNY" further intensified and has passed very close to Orchid Island near Southern Taiwan.
- -As of 5:00 AM, Batanes remains under TCWS No. 3.
- -As of 5:00 PM, "JENNY' has weakened further and was outside PAR. TCWS No. 2 was still hoisted over the northern portion of Itbayat, Batanes.
- -The effect of the Southwest Monsoon has weakened.

06 October 2023

-"JENNY" weakened and no longer directly affected the country.

-As of 5:00 AM, TCWS was no longer hoisted in any part of the country.
